




Dear People of Annunciation,

It's that time of year again! It's time to talk about the joy of giving, or in other words, it's time to hear again how important it is for us to give thanks for all God has given us. We give thanks in how we manage our entire lives, our time, our abilities, and our money. As good stewards, we are called to move to a place in our life together where we truly are stewards of all that God has given us. To help us move into that journey together this stewardship season and beyond, we will use materials from the Episcopal Network for Stewardship whose theme this year is **Journey to Generosity: An opportunity to say 'yes,'** and the College of Bishop's *Project Resource 2.0*.

(Introduction to Journey to Generosity) "Life is an opportunity. Life is a journey to love and generosity; a journey to saying "yes" to God who calls us the Beloved. From the moment we draw our first breath to the moment we breathe our last, we are both receivers and givers. How we move from takers of everything given to us to sharing everything we have is one measure of how we live into saying, "Yes." On our journey to generosity, we learn from our parents, our family, our friends, and church members. We learn through our own actions and from hearing the stories of other generous people. The gospel stories of Jesus inform, challenge, and inspire us. Whether it's the story of the Good Samaritan, the rich young ruler, or Zacchaeus, Jesus invites us into what the journey to generosity looks like. The journey is not simply about how much we give to support the mission and ministry of our parish. The journey is about how we live our lives as the Beloved"

For the next seven weeks, you will find inserts in your bulletin that will open up the scripture readings to inform, challenge, and offer questions for reflection. I ask that you take these inserts home and use them in your weekly devotions. Along with the bulletin inserts, several of you will be asked to witness during the Offertory time of the service as to why giving has become a habit, a practice, a faith response in your journey to generosity. If you are asked, please say yes, and if you would like to volunteer to offer a few words, please let Hugh Jordon or Cory Williams know.

The *Journey to Generosity* will continue beyond the traditional months of this year's stewardship season into and through next year using materials from the College of Bishop's *Project Resource 2.0*. The aim of *Project Resource2.0* is to change the culture of resource development in our Church to be more fruitful for God's mission. This past August, the Vestry and I attended training in *Project Resource2.0* led by Bishop Benhase. One suggestion from *Project Resource2.0* will begin in this month's newsletter where a ministry of the church is highlighted each month to provide information about that ministry and to thank those who serve. This month the ministry of the Altar Guild is featured.

The aim of our *Journey to Generosity* will be to encourage and remind us that life is a journey to saying "yes" to God who calls us the Beloved. I would like to invite you into that journey to greater generosity.

DEACONS CORNER

Over the next few editions of our newsletter, I will be addressing 7 surprising addictions.

Today lets start with number one! *Shopping Addiction*

Yep, I bet you didn't see that one coming. However, despite the fact that your friends refer to you as a shopaholic, you continue to literally shop till you drop, despite the disastrous consequences to your financial wellbeing. Compulsive shoppers suffer from a psycho logic disorder that encourages compulsive spending, not to attain material objects, but rather with the belief that their purchases will increase their self-esteem, appearance, reputation, and social relationships.

A 2013 study from San Francisco State university explored the economic psychology around shopping addiction. Researchers suspect that roughly 2-9 % of Americans are guilty of compulsive shopping, but interestingly discovered that the same individuals are also the same individuals are also prone to anxiety, mood, and eating disorders. Results from the study found that despite poor credit management, compulsive shoppers tend to buy items they really don't need for the dopamine (feel-good chemical, the brain produces) "buy high".

Next time, another surprising addiction, so stay tuned!

Some of their duties include: keeping the fair linen, polishing silver, setting up for all Eucharistic services, washing and ironing Eucharistic linen, washing chalice, polishing the brass communion rail, and properly arranging prayer books and hymnals. They are a small group of very dedicated, responsible, and dependable women and (men) who quietly and freely give their time. Samaritan's Purse Operation Christmas Child

We will begin collecting items for Operation Christmas Child now through November 10th.

What is Operation Christmas Child?

1. The Samaritan's Purse project Operation Christmas Child collects shoebox gifts—filled with fun toys, school supplies and hygiene items—and delivers them to children in need around the world to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way. For many of these children, the gift-filled shoebox is the first gift they have ever received.
2. Since 1993, Operation Christmas Child, the world's largest Christmas project of its kind, has collected and delivered more than 146 million shoebox gifts to children in more than 160 countries and territories.
3. In 2017, Operation Christmas Child hopes to collect enough shoebox gifts to reach another 12 million children in countries like Peru, the Philippines, Rwanda and Ukraine. Nearly 11.5 million shoebox gifts were collected worldwide in 2016, with more than 9.1 million collected in the U.S.

Anyone can pack a shoebox. Individuals, families, churches and groups fill empty shoeboxes with school supplies, hygiene items and fun toys, such as dolls or soccer balls. During the National collection week (Nov.13-20, 2017) Samaritan's Purse will collect the gift-filled shoeboxes at nearly 5,000 drop-off locations in all 50 states and Puerto Rico. **Do not include:** candy; toothpaste, used or damaged items; war related items such as toy guns, knives or military figures; seeds; chocolate or food; liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items, such as snow globes or glass containers; or aerosol cans.


The United Way Campaign Kickoff

On September 14, The United Way of Toombs, Montgomery and Wheeler Counties began their campaign kickoff to raise money so 23 service agencies can help those in need in 2018.

Last year the campaign raised \$632,000, but this year's goal of \$550,000 is lower according to campaign chairman Thomas Bowers, "Our goal is lower this year because we've have a few who have had to back out corporate-wise, but we plan to get out in the community and beat last year's goal." Already the campaign has raised nearly \$140,000 which is 27 percent of the goal. The campaign continues through November 9. Vestry Meeting Minutes – Annunciation – August 21, 2017 at 6 pm

Meeting called to order with prayer and meditation led by Rev. Denise.

July 2017 Vestry meeting minutes were reviewed; Hugh moved to approve minutes, 2nd by Patti, motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: (Anne) July financial report presented as typical for this time of year. Hugh moved to approve report; 2nd by Jen, motion passed.

Business:

Anne Roller reported that the annual Church Financial Audit has been completed and submitted to the Diocesan office. Anne Roller shared letter from Diocese requesting 2018 pledge from Annunciation in the amount of \$16887. Pledge for 2017 was \$15876; requested pledge amount is based on record of giving at Annunciation for last three years. Donnie moved to approve the 2018 pledge in the amount of \$16887, 2nd by Sherron, motion passed. VIC sign-up for September was completed.

Senior Warden's Report: (Sherron) Choir membership has increased to seven!. Ronnie and Laura Leyland and Reverend Denise are coming up with some beautiful music. Survey was completed during church yesterday. Results to be shared later.

Junior Warden's Report: (Donnie) Donnie gives thanks to all who helped on the Churchyard Workday on Saturday. At some point shrubbery may need removing and replanting completed. Jen suggests less maintenance but same look might be achieved with Drift Roses, Curly Leaf Nandina, and Dwarf Pittosporum. Fire ants have been treated. Donnie is working with Glenn Reaves to replace light bulbs in sanctuary. Some may be replaced with LED bulbs. Others may require replacement of fixtures before LED bulbs can be used. Church is applying for grant to help pay for energy saving modifications. Our church sign on Maple Drive has been hit; Donnie has repaired it.

Deacon's Report: (Rev. Denise for Rev. Dcn. Burt) Rev. Dcn. Burt continues to have difficulty with severe pain as he recovers from back surgery. He has not yet been able to return to duties at church and is greatly missed.

Rector's Report: (Rev. Denise) White veil in memory of parishioner's family members and blue veil in memory of Neil Baylor have been ordered. Red and purple veils are still needed and will be ordered later. Stewardship workshop will be presented by the Bishop on Saturday morning, August 26th. Catered lunch for Bishop and Vestry Members will be served after the workshop. Bishop will join us at 10:30 am service on Sunday, August 27th. Desiree Rogers will be confirmed during the service. Covered dish potluck lunch will be shared after the service, with church providing meat and beverages. Rev. Denise will be on vacation 9/3/17 and 9/10/17. Supply priests will be here for both 8 am and 10:30 am services. VIC's will make sure doors are open and priests are welcomed. Rev. David Lemburg from Savannah will supply on 9/3 and Rev. Dale Jones from Cochran will supply on 9/10. Procedure for pew cushion donations has been developed and will be in newsletter. Donations towards purchase of pew cushions will be placed in restricted fund and will be kept until enough has been received to purchase pew cushions. Cost of pew cushion per pew is \$260; there are 22 pews, making \$5720 the total cost of church pew cushions. If enough donations are not received to fund the pew cushions, eventually the unused donations will be returned to the donors.

Ministry Area Reports: **Fellowship** (Patti) – Lynette Dell and Anne Fowler are coordinating the covered dish potluck lunch on 8/27 during the Bishop's visit. A special cake will celebrate Desiree Rogers' confirmation. **Pastoral Care** (Zack/Rev. Denise) – Prayers and assistance continue for parishioners. **Buildings/Grounds** (Rev. Denise for Donnie) – already covered. **Communications** (Zack) – Absent. **Outreach** (Sherron) – Food Talk Program will begin on 9/21/2017 at 10:30 am in the Parish Hall. The classes will be held each Thursday for 8 weeks. Our Food Bank supply of non-perishable foods continues to grow and is available in the office building for those in need. Phase I of St. Francis Pet Memorial Garden is completed. The first engraved stone is on order for Max Manry's cat, Kayce. Mothers' Morning Out committee met 8/17 with continued development of plans to implement MMO Program. Next meeting will be 9/21/2017 at 6 pm. Jen is working on some redecorating of the nursery in preparation for the Mothers' Morning Out Program. **Newcomers/Visitors** (Jen) – Newcomers' event will be planned in the fall. **Christian Formation** (Denise/Hugh) – Dr. Cory Williams continues to lead Adult Sunday School Class on Spiritual Gifts each Sunday in August at 9:30 am. Children's Sunday School class is meeting at 9:45 am with Jane Hall Williams as teacher. **Administration** (Denise/Sherron) – A good number of surveys were completed and will be sent in for analysis. **Stewardship** (Hugh) – Bishop is presenting stewardship workshop on Saturday morning. **Young Adults and Families** (Jen) – Events for young adults and families being considered.

Meeting adjourned with prayer at 7:45 pm.
