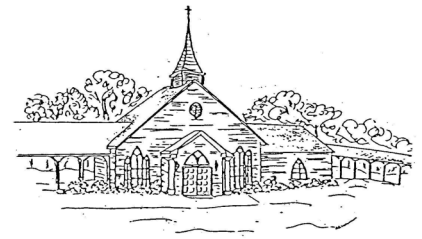

Dear People of Annunciation,

Did you know that more than any other religious group, Episcopalians are people of a prayer book? Not only do we use **the Book of Common Prayer (BCP)** for our common worship together on Sunday's; it is also the guide for our private daily prayer and the source of most of our theology. It's out of our common worship that we come to understand God and what we believe, or said another way, the way we pray shapes what we believe. Have you ever taken time to look through the Book of Common Prayer cover to cover? When I've asked those attending my Inquires Class to do this they are always surprised. They had no idea that it consisted of prayers, praises, and selections from the Bible to be used at different times and occasions.

There are services for daily use, such as Morning and Evening Prayer, with lessons appointed so that, by following them, we could read almost the entire Bible in a two-year cycle. Along with the service for Holy Eucharist, there are services to mark every major event of our lives: birth, growth, marriage, children, work, sickness, thanksgiving, sin, and death. The BCP can be a great help in our family and private prayer. On pages 136-140, you will find special devotions for family or individual use. On pages 809-841, there are prayers and thanksgivings for all occasions. If you want an outline of instruction in the Christian Faith presented in question and answer format, commonly called the Catechism, you will find that on pages 845-862. The BCP meets our needs as children of God living in today's world.

From the time of the Early Church there has been need for order in Christian worship, so that we might worship together in harmony. The earliest worship of the Christian's followed the order used in the Jewish synagogue: Psalms; the reading of the Scriptures; the comment on the Scriptures, or sermon; and prayers. They would meet in the evening for a common meal of fellowship, known as an Agape or Love Feast. At the end of it, they broke bread and blessed the wine in remembrance of what they had received from Christ's death, believing that in partaking of the Bread and Wine, they were doing what their Lord had commanded them to do and were sharing in His life. As time went on, this celebration was placed on Sunday morning; the day of our Lord's Resurrection.

Until the reformation in the early 1500's, the Church of England, had it various worship books in Latin but in the year 1549 these were simplified, translated into English and combined into one book called the Book of Common Prayer. It was revolutionary because it was in the language of the common people, to be used by the common people. After the Revolutionary War, in 1789, the first American Prayer Book was published at the first General Convention of the Protestant Episcopal Church in Philadelphia. There have been many revisions since then. Today, we use the 1979 BCP which allows the people to participate to a degree we have never known before; we are not simply listening to the priest, but together with the priest we are the doers of the liturgical action. Out of these actions and prayers we are shaped and reshaped into the community of believers.

We are a people of the book. Take some time to check it out!

## **Bishop to lead study of Romans**

Bishop Benhase will lead a seven-part Bible study of St. Paul's Letter to the Romans for the entire Diocese of Georgia as part of the Good Book Club, a church-wide Bible reading initiative begun by Forward Movement. The Bishop's study will be held on Wednesdays from 10:30 to 11:30 AM beginning January 9 at St. Peter's Church on Skidaway Island, Savannah. It will also be broadcast each week live here: [www.facebook.com/georgiaepiscopal](http://www.facebook.com/georgiaepiscopal) from January 9 through the last session on February 20.

If you are unable to participate in Bishop Benhase's study, Forward Movement has divided Romans into 50 daily readings, beginning on Monday, January 7 and concluding on Shrove Tuesday, March 5. Each day, participants are invited to read, reflect, and pray upon a few verses of Romans. On Sunday's, participants are encouraged to take a break from Romans and listen and respond to the lectionary readings at their local churches. ## **Listening Sessions Announced**

The Search Committee **for the 11<sup>th</sup> Bishop of Georgia** will be holding a series of Listening Sessions around the diocese over the next several weeks. These sessions are vital to the successful creation of our profile, as they offer the best opportunity to gather our vision for the next chapter in the life of our Diocese.

Each Convocation will host a Listening Session for anyone who can attend. In addition, there will be a session specifically for all clergy - deacons and priests - in the diocese, and another for our youth. 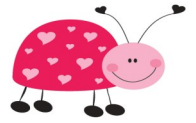
