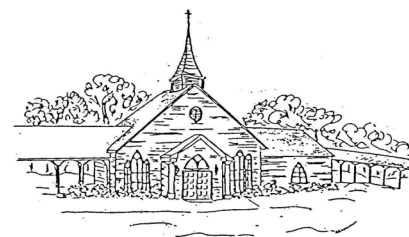

Dear People of Annunciation,

Lent is a time set aside to grow in our faith of God. It is a journey we take with Jesus to prepare for Easter. For the past three Sunday's, and for the next three, bulletin inserts from *The Episcopal Church* have/will feature weekly teachings from *'Life Transformed: The Way of Love in Lent*. In case you miss any one of these excellent meditations, I've provided a short summary of each below. To read each in full go to www.episcopalchurch.org/life-transformed.

Session One / TURN: Dead to Sin, Alive in Christ (Romans 6:3-11)

Like the disciples, we are called by Jesus to follow the Way of Love. With God's help, we can turn from the powers of sin, hatred, fear, injustice, and oppression toward the way of truth, love, hope, justice, and freedom. In turning, we reorient our lives to Jesus Christ, falling in love again, again, and again.

Session Two / PRAY: Israel's Deliverance at the Red Sea (Exodus 14:10-15:1)

Jesus teaches us to come before God with humble hearts, boldly offering our thanksgivings and concerns to God or simply listening for God's voice in our lives and in the world. Whether in thought, word or deed, individually or corporately, when we pray we invite and dwell in God's loving presence.

Session Three / LEARN: Learn Wisdom and Live (Proverbs 8:1-8, 19-21; 9:4b-6)

By reading and reflecting on scripture, especially the life and teachings of Jesus, we draw near to God and God's word dwells in us. When we open our minds and hearts to scripture, we learn to see God's story and God's activity in everyday life.

Session Four / BLESS: A New Heart and a New Spirit (Ezekiel 36:24-28)

Jesus called his disciples to give, forgive, teach, and heal in his name. We are empowered by the Spirit to bless everyone we meet, practicing generosity and compassion, and proclaiming the Good News of God in Christ with hopeful words and selfless actions. We can share our stories of blessing and invite others to the Way of Love.

Session Five / REST: The Valley of Dry Bones (Ezekiel 37:1-14)

From the beginning of creation, God has established the sacred pattern of going and returning, labor and rest. Especially today, God invites us to dedicate time for restoration and wholeness - within our bodies, minds, and souls, and within our communities and institutions. By resting, we place our trust in God, the primary actor who brings all things to their fullness

Session Six / WORSHIP: The Gathering of God's People (Zephaniah 3:12-20)

When we worship, we gather with others before God. We hear the Good News of Jesus Christ, give thanks, confess, and offer the brokenness of the world to God. As we break bread, our eyes are opened to the presence of Christ. By the power of the Holy Spirit, we are made one body, the body of Christ sent to live the Way of Love.

Session Seven / GO: The Empty Tomb (Luke 24:1-12)

As Jesus went to the highways and byways, he sends us beyond our circles and comfort, to witness to the love, justice, and truth of God with our lips and with our lives. We go to listen with humility and to join God in healing a hurting world. We go to become Beloved Community, a people reconciled in love with God and one another.

Maundy Thursday Service April 18, 6:00 pm & Agape' Love Feast at 7:00 pm

The Maundy Thursday Liturgy recalls the Last Supper of Jesus on the night of his betrayal. Following this service, which begins at 6:00 pm, we will gather in the parish hall for a Love Feast or Agape' Meal. Agape' is from the Greek for 'love.' The Love Feast, or Agape' Meal, is a meal recalling the meals Jesus shared with his disciples during his ministry.

The Agape' Meal, a symbol of mutual love and fellowship, continued among the early Christians after the death of the apostles. Acts 2:46 tells us: "Continuing daily with one accord in the temple and breaking bread from house to house, they ate their food with gladness and simplicity of heart."

The Love Feast is a simple, meatless meal of soup, bread, cheese, olives, fruit, wine and other beverages. No liturgy, just an informal gathering with "authentic food." Child care will be available during the Maundy Thursday Service, and there is a sign-up sheet in the Narthex if you can help provide one of the food items for the feast.

This year the Episcopal Church Women's Annual Retreat in Augusta's theme is The Way of Love. Participants will learn about sharing God's love for those in recovery from the sex trafficking trade. The Rev. Becca Stevens, well known advocate for women, especially women leaving the trade, will be the keynote speaker. Stevens and women from her ministry, Thistle Farms, will be at the retreat throughout the weekend.



The Saint Ruth Byllesby Chapter of The Order of the Daughters of the King® will be sponsoring a bra drive to benefit *Free The Girls*, an international non-profit that helps women leaving the sex trafficking trade, especially in the poorest areas of the United States, to gain financial independence and social reintegration.

By donating new or gently used bras, participants provide a chance for change. These survivors of human trafficking start their own businesses selling bras in their local second-hand clothing markets while they recover and build a new life. Meeting opened by Rev. Denise with prayer. Study of Acts 10 was completed.

Vestry meeting minutes, January 2019, were reviewed; Rebecca moved to approve minutes, 2nd by Hugh, motion passed.

Short vestry meeting minutes, 2/3/2019, were reviewed; Hugh moved to approve minutes, 2nd by Jerry, motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: (Anne) January 2019 Financial Report was reviewed. \$6000 for land sale will be deposited in February to Ameris Money Market checking account. As needed, funds will be taken from other account(s) and placed in General Fund.

Business:

Walking tour of church yard was provided by Jack Dell, who presented the Landscaping Committee's plan for changes.

Jack presented a written report from committee giving rough estimate of landscape budget as \$2,820.

Rebecca shared that pictures from Lifetouch photo sessions are being delivered this week. When directories are ready, each parish family unit will receive a picture directory. Fifteen extra directories are provided to the church at no charge. Fifteen more may be purchased for \$50; decision about this will be made depending upon need.

Parochial Report for 2018 will be submitted to Diocese by 3/1/2019.

Senior Warden's Report: (Hugh) No report.

Junior Warden's Report: (Jack) Written report was given with comments. New landscaping will begin soon, with goal of less plants that need tending. LED lights to be replaced in church nave with 12 bulbs per chandelier; cost estimated at \$400; money in GA Power Restricted Fund will be used; decision will be made about "soft" light bulbs. Soffit on Parish Hall needs work; hoping to get Len Edge to do work. Irrigation system repair is needed. Repair of heat pump compressor in church is needed; Matt Norton will do repair. Hot water heater in Parish Hall has been repaired by Matt Norton; big thanks to Matt. Jen Martinez is working on a plan for remodeling in old church building. When daylight savings time begins, outside lights will be re-timed.

Deacon's Report: Dcn. Burt Absent.

Rector's Report: (Rev. Denise) Rev. Denise reviewed sale of land donated by Mr. Watson; \$6000 payment has been received; after expenses paid, around \$5000 will be net income. Vestry Roster was reviewed. Ministry Area Liaisons were assigned. Canon Frank Logue may attend our next Vestry Meeting to discuss the use of Data Dash information in our area. Ministry Opportunities at Annunciation form will be available for parishioners to complete. "Top Ten Ways to Thrive as Vestry Leader" was reviewed. "Five Things Every Vestry Member Should Know" also reviewed. Two Priou-dieu's (prayer desks) have arrived. Bishop Search Committee will be here on Saturday, 3/2/2019 for Central Convocation Listening Session from 10 am to 12 noon; all are welcome to attend. Shrove Tuesday Pancake supper will be March 5 from 6 to 7:30 pm. Ash Wednesday services will be held at 7 am, 12 noon, and 6 pm on March 6. Lenten Study, *He Chose the Nails* by Max Lucado, will be held on Wednesday evenings at 6 pm with Soup and Bread Supper. Next Vestry meeting will be held March 25 at 6 pm. Youth Sunday will be 5th Sunday on March 31, with youth gathering after 10:30 am service. Vacation Bible School will be held June 6-9, 2019 here at Annunciation.
