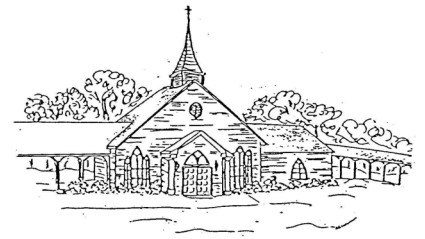

Dear People of Annunciation,



Facts about the Episcopal that you may know or may not know:

The Episcopal Church is a member church of the worldwide Anglican Communion; the third largest Christian communion in the world which includes 85 million people in over 165 countries. Anglicanism is a tradition within Christianity comprising the Church of England and churches which are historically tied to it or hold similar beliefs, worship practices and church structures. The Anglican Communion is an international association of autonomous churches consisting of the Church of England and national and regional Anglican churches in full communion with it.

The Episcopal Church is divided into nine provinces and has dioceses in the United States, Taiwan, Micronesia, the Caribbean, Central and South America, as well as the Convocation of Episcopal Churches in Europe and the Navajoland Area Mission. The Convocation of Episcopal Churches in Europe includes all its congregations in continental Europe. The Navajoland Area Mission is an Area Mission of the Episcopal Church in the United States of America.

In 2017, the Episcopal Church had 1,871,581 baptized members, of whom 1,712,563 were in the United States. The^l presiding bishop of the Episcopal Church is the Most Rev. Michael Bruce Curry, the first African-American bishop to serve in that position.

The Episcopal Church was organized after the American Revolution, when it became separate from the Church of England, whose clergy are required to swear allegiance to the British monarch as Supreme Governor of the Church of England. The General Convention of 1789 meeting in Philadelphia set the pattern for the Protestant Episcopal Church in the USA. This convention adopted a Constitution and Canons, and a Book of Common Prayer, which maintained the essentials of the Catholic and Anglican heritage, with distinctly American adaptations.

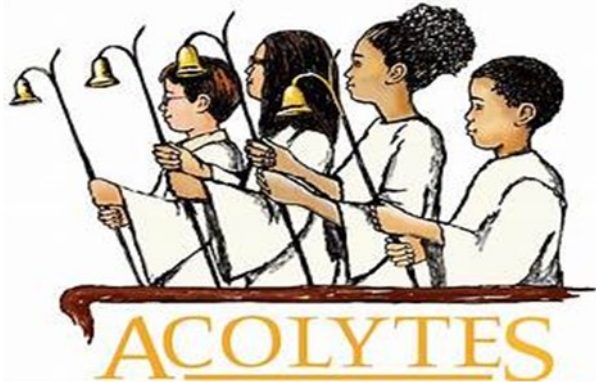
The Episcopal Church describes itself as "Protestant, yet Catholic". Protestantism is a form of Christian faith and practice which originated with the Protestant Reformation in 16th century Europe, a movement against what its followers considered to be errors in the Roman Catholic Church. Catholicism is a term which in its broadest sense refers to the beliefs and practices of Christian denominations that describe themselves as catholic.

The Episcopal Church is an apostolic church, tracing its bishops back to the apostles via holy orders. Holy Orders are ordained ministries such as bishop, priest or deacon.

The Book of Common Prayer, a collection of traditional rites, blessings, liturgies, and prayers used throughout the Anglican Communion, is central to Episcopal worship. The BCP defines how we worship and includes a pattern of prayer that is both ancient and modern drawing on the tradition of the church through the centuries and responding to the needs and concerns of faithful Christians in this day and age. The first BCP was published in 1549 under the direction of Thomas Cranmer, Archbishop of Canterbury. Liturgy, literally "the work of the people", and translated as "public service" in secular terms.

Samaritan's Purse Operation Christmas Child



We will begin collecting items for Operation Christmas Child now through November 17.

What is Operation Christmas Child?

1. The Samaritan's Purse project Operation Christmas Child collects shoebox gifts—filled with fun toys, school supplies and hygiene items—and delivers them to children in need around the world to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way. For many of these children, the gift-filled shoebox is the first gift they have ever received.
2. Since 1993, Operation Christmas Child, the world's largest Christmas project of its kind, has collected and delivered more than 146 million shoebox gifts to children in more than 160 countries and territories.
3. In 2019, Operation Christmas Child hopes to collect enough shoebox gifts to reach another 11 million children in countries like Peru, the Philippines, Rwanda and Ukraine. Nearly 11 million shoebox gifts were collected worldwide in 2017, with more than 8.8 million collected in the U.S.

Anyone can pack a shoebox. Individuals, families, churches and groups fill empty shoeboxes with school supplies, hygiene items and fun toys, such as dolls or soccer balls. During the National collection week (Nov.12-19, 2018) Samaritan's Purse will collect the gift-filled shoeboxes at nearly 5,000 drop-off locations in all 50 states and Puerto Rico. **Do not include:** candy; toothpaste, used or damaged items; war related items such as toy guns, knives or military figures; seeds; chocolate or food; liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items, such as snow globes or glass containers; or aerosol cans.

United Thank Offering

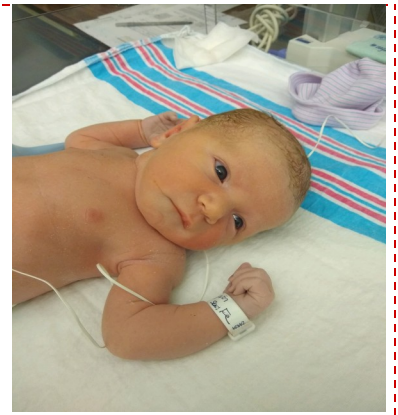

Vestry Meeting Minutes – Annunciation – June 24, 2019 at 6:00 pm



Members Present: The Very Reverend Denise Vaughn, Hugh Jordan, Jack Dell, Jerry Yates, Rebecca Miller, Beverly Thompson

Member Absent: Teresa Barrera-Edge

Treasurer Present: Anne Roller; Clerk Present: Beverly Thompson; Deacon Absent: The Reverend Deacon Burt Derrick

Meeting opened by Rev. Denise with prayer. Study of Acts 13 was completed.

Vestry meeting minutes for May, 2019 were reviewed; Jack moved to approve minutes as read, 2nd by Hugh, motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: (Anne) May, 2019 Financial Report was reviewed. Hugh moved to approve the report, 2nd by Rebecca, motion passed. Anne shared that funds from the Ameris Money Market Account are being transferred when needed to the General Fund. When the Money Market account is depleted or down to a minimal amount, Anne will need direction on which account to draw funds from — either the Bank of America Church Corp Fund or the State Street Global Max and Christie Manry Fund. This may be needed in October. Fidelity forms were mailed on June 18; this is an account used to handle stock donations. \$1100 for new hot water heater purchase for office building will be paid out of the General Fund - Building Maintenance. Rev. Denise stated that Christie Roller requests that the Vestry develop a written policy that addresses the Church Insurance Agency's recommendations regarding handling of deposit records and deposits.

Business:

Jack moved that both the Bank of America Church Corp investment fund and the State Street Global Max and Christie Manry investment fund be looked at regarding guidelines and restrictions, 2nd by Jerry, motion passed. Information regarding these two accounts will be presented at August Vestry meeting. Rev. Denise will review and present guidelines/restrictions regarding the State Street Global Manry Fund; Anne will review and present guidelines/restrictions regarding the BOA Church Corp fund.

Senior Warden's Report: (Hugh) Nomination committee for two new Vestry members to be elected at Annual Meeting in 2020 will meet and develop a list of potential nominees by August meeting.

Junior Warden's Report: (Jack) The HVAC fan motor has arrived. Alexander Brothers will replace the fan motor in one of the air handlers this week. Lynette Dell will prepare dinner for Vestry members at the Dell's on Saturday at 6 pm; spouses are invited. Report on Safety Status – First Aid Kits, Smoke Detectors, and Fire Extinguishers are now located in each building. Jack sold the organ pipes at recycling center for \$106. The irrigation control box has been regulated and broken pipes in the irrigation system are fixed.

Deacon's Report: Dcn. Burt absent due to work.

Rector's Report: (Rev. Denise) The Episcopal Safety Program Survey results for Annunciation are being addressed. First Aid Kit locations will be regularly announced. Rev. Denise has spoken with leaders of Girl Scout Troop that meets at Annunciation; troop is not meeting this summer but will address the "hold harmless agreement" recommendation when school starts and meetings resume. Recommendation by Church Insurance Agency concerning handling of deposit records and deposits will be discussed at Vestry Retreat on Saturday, June 29, with the plan of developing a written policy. Dennis Ingley has asked about the need for a sign at the Cheney Drive entrance to Annunciation; Vestry agrees that this is a good idea. Youth Sunday will be Sunday, June 30 with lunch and program at noon. Rev. Denise will be on vacation from July 15 to 26. Rebecca Miller will lead Morning Prayer with Sermon at 8 am and 10:30 am services on Sunday, July 21. ECW Coffee Hour will be held on Sunday, July 21 after 10:30 am service. Our youth are participating in the County Wide Back to School Bash on Saturday, July 27, 9 am – 11 am at South-eastern Technical College; youth will be giving out bottles of water. We are collecting bottles of water and school supplies/backpacks. School supplies and backpacks will be blessed at 10:30 am service on August 4. Welcoming Event for new members will be held in the Fall. Data Dash will be pursued again when committee members are back in town. Next Vestry meeting will be held Monday, August 26 at 6 pm; there will be no Vestry meeting in July.

Ministry Area Reports: Already covered.
