Dear People of Annunciation,

Jesus had it right when he spoke many times about people's money as their treasure: "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matthew 6:21). Our wallet and checkbook are precious to us, whether we have little or much. And we protect and worry about what we have, whether it is little or much.

There is a story about a group of Viking warriors who were ordered by their king to join him when he converted to the Christian Faith through the waters of baptism. As they waded out into the nearby river to be baptized, they all went under the water while holding one of their arms high above their heads. If they had been asked why they were doing this, the warriors would have answered that they did not want the arm and hand that bore the sword to go under the water, for they had been taught that whatever goes under the water belongs to God. And these warriors were willing to let the rest of their bodies —and thus their lives—belong to God, but their sword-arms would be held back. Those Vikings may not have cared one way or another about the new religion that their king had embraced with them in tow, but they did know that they were not about to give control over the most important part of their life to this new God. One part was definitely not going under the water!

I was in my mid-thirties when, after attending a Cursillo weekend, I began to know in my heart and mind that I wanted to get more involved in the life and ministry of St. Nathaniel's Episcopal Church. I attended regularly but was not giving much of my time, or money, for the work of the church. After hosting a dinner in my home for the Stewardship Campaign and listening to our priest talk about the importance of tithing, I decided I would begin to tithe a percentage of my income to the church. My goal was to give 10% or more of my money, time, and talent, and for the most part, I have achieved that goal for 30 years now. When asked if I ever needed or missed that money, I tell people that I have never needed or missed the money I have given. It has actually been extremely liberating to live my life rich toward God...to let my whole body go under the water.

At the 8:00 am service, the Offertory sentence we say is one of the key passages about stewardship and one that has informed my faith journey for many years. A song of David "All things come from you, O God, and of your own have we given you." I truly believe that when we realize that everything we have is a gift from God, we are not afraid to accept the challenge to stretch and grow into our individual purpose, and into the mission of the church. I ask you to consider how God is calling you to risk "flavoring" the world with your time, talents and treasure. Are you willing to risk it all and let your whole body go under the water for God? Jesus was right... "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matthew 6:21).

Samaritan's Purse Operation Christmas Child


We are collecting items for Operation Christmas Child now through November 17. At 12:00 noon we will have a Shoe Box Packing Party.




Advent Wreath Kit

Advent Bible Study 'A Thrill of Hope' Wednesday, December 4, 6:30 pm continues December 11 & 18



A Thrill of Hope presents the familiar story of Christmas as told in the Gospels of Matthew and Luke. Each scripture passage is illustrated and interpreted in the stunning artwork of John August Swanson along with commentary by some of America's premier Biblical scholars, names such as Dr. Thomas G. Long, Dr. Michael Joseph Brown, Dr. Carol A. Newsom, and more. The study is divided into six 7-minute chapters, each one featuring a passage of Scripture, commentary by the scholars, and a Swanson work of art based on that passage. Included are A Visit (Luke 1:26-38), The Nativity (Luke 2:1-7), The Shepherds (Luke 2:8-20), Epiphany (Matthew 2:1-12), Presentation in the Temple (Luke 2:21-40), and Flight into Egypt (Matthew 2:13-15). Vestry Meeting Minutes - Annunciation - September 23, 2019 at 6:00 pm

Members Present: The Very Reverend Denise Vaughn, Hugh Jordan, Jack Dell, Jerry Yates, Beverly Thompson, Rebecca Miller, Teresa Barrera-Edge

Treasurer Present: Anne Roller; Clerk Present: Beverly Thompson; Deacon Absent: The Reverend Deacon Burt Derrick

Meeting opened by Rev. Denise with prayer. Study of Acts 15 was completed.

Vestry meeting minutes for August, 2019 were reviewed; Jack moved to approve minutes, 2nd by Hugh, motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: (Anne) August, 2019 Financial Report was reviewed. In August, \$10,000 was moved from our Ameris Money Market Checking Account to the General Fund Checking Account. Anne made note that in September, \$7000 check from BOA Church Corp Fund and \$7000 check from State Street Manry Fund were deposited in the Ameris Fund and \$10,000 was transferred from the Ameris Money Market Checking account to the General Fund Checking Account. These transactions will be evident on our September Financial Report. Rebecca moved to approve the report, 2nd by Hugh, motion passed.

Business:

Rebecca moved that our water meter bills (inside and outside) from 2018 and 2019 be reviewed and compared, 2nd by Hugh, motion passed.

Jack moved that, in the future, expenditures will be charged to Restricted Fund Accounts after discussion and approval by Vestry, 2nd by Jerry, motion passed.

Jack will get a small safe and install it in preparation for new Sunday Collection Procedures, approved by General Consent.

Convention delegates will be Beverly Thompson and possibly another parishioner who may run for office; Rebecca Miller will serve as delegate or possibly as alternate. Convention will be 11/14-16/2019 in Statesboro; our new Bishop for Diocese of Georgia will be elected.

Girl Scout Troop will continue to meet at our church; April Edenfield, Troop Leader, will be given key to use for meetings; troop will provide the required release of liability letter; approved by General Consent.

Senior Warden's Report: (Hugh) Nomination committee continues to work on determining potential nominees to serve on Vestry in 2020. List of possible candidates will be presented at October Vestry meeting. Stewardship Campaign is in progress; Pledge Card Sunday will be November 24th.

Junior Warden's Report: (Jack) Glenn and Jack, with help from Matt Norton, have completed the LED light change out; around \$700 is left in the Georgia Power Grant Fund. Two outside lights need replacing; this will be done using around \$270 from the Grant Fund. Pine tree in columbarium area that was hit by lightning has been removed for around \$450. Thanks to Jimmy Warren who pressure washed the church without charging. Our Youth will paint the lower boards on outside of church with supervision; Rebecca will provide the materials. Repair of the trim around the windows will be completed by adults. Work day will be scheduled in November. Major pruning will be done at appropriate time. Big thanks to Harry Moses, who has served as chair of the grounds committee but is stepping down; Rebecca will serve as chair until someone volunteers. Deacon's Report: Rev. Dcn. Burt is absent due to work.

Rector's Report: (Rev. Denise) Our Newcomers' Luncheon was very successful and much enjoyed. We welcome Victoria Bausch and her son Anderson, Tom and Betty Jo Sadler and their service dog Mydia, Anne Childers, and Courtney Davis and her children Alex and Mackenzie. Our New Sunday Collection Procedures will begin on October 6th. Youth Sunday Service will be held on September 29, with lunch and meeting for the youth at 11:45 am. Rev. Denise will be away for Fall Clergy Conference on 9/30-10/2 at Honey Creek. Blessing of the Pets and Memorial Service will begin at 4 pm on October 6th. Oktoberfest Covered Dish will be Sunday, October 13th at 11:45 am. Walk-Abouts for Bishop Candidates will be held around the Diocese, with the closet location in Savannah on October 23 from 6-9 pm. Central Convocation Delegates Pre-Convention Meeting will be at Annunciation on October 27 at 3 pm. Cursillo will be 10/16-20/2019 at Honey Creek with Day of Deeper Understanding on 11/23 from 10 am - 2 pm at Annunciation. ECW Rummage sale will be November 2nd. Next Vestry meeting will be 10/28/2019 at 6 pm.

Ministry Area Reports: Already covered. Meeting adjourned with Lord's Prayer at 8:15 pm.
