The 198 Convention of the Diocese of Georgia turned out to be pretty exciting. The Rev. Canon Frank Logue was elected on the first ballet to become the 11th Bishop to lead the Episcopal Diocese of Georgia. "I am grateful, Bishop-elect Logue said, to be called by God through this election to lead this part of the body of Christ which consistently puts Jesus at the center." "We have many great partnerships with other denominations, and I look forward to deepening our relationships and strengthening the bonds that unite us in Christ."

His consecration service will be held at 11 AM, Saturday, May 30th at the Johnny Mercer Theater in Savannah. The Presiding Bishop, Michael Curry, will officiate; he will also preach at a Eucharist to be held at 11 AM Sunday, May 31st, in Forsyth Park, Savannah. All are invited to attend! Brief Bio of the Bishop-elect Frank Logue

Born in Montgomery, Alabama, where I lived for 6 years, I grew up in Marietta, Georgia. A 1984 graduate of Georgia Southern University, I worked as a photographer for two small daily newspapers in Georgia—the Warner Robins Daily Sun and the Rome News-Tribune. I married Victoria Steele in 1985. Victoria and I hiked the entire 2,150-mile Appalachian Trail in a single six-month long hike in 1988. Three years later, after working as an Art Director for a non-profit, we went full-time as freelance writer-photographers, writing books, and magazine articles. Our daughter, Mary Griffin Logue, born in 1991 added great joy and wonder to our lives. In 1995, I responded to a long felt call to the ministry. I entered Virginia Theological Seminary in the fall of 1997. While there, I worked as a seminarian at two area churches, including assisting with the creation of a new Episcopal church—Church of the Spirit in Alexandria, Virginia. I also took part in summer internships with the Anglican Church in Tanzania and St. Elizabeth's Hospital, a large mental hospital in Washington, D.C. In 2000, Victoria, Griffin, and I moved to Camden County, spending 10 years starting King of Peace Episcopal Church and its preschool. Since 2010, I have assisted Bishop Benhase in overseeing the clergy and congregations of the Diocese of Georgia. All three of us have been actively involved in the Episcopal Diocese of Georgia. Victoria served two 3-year terms on Diocesan Council and as a Deputy to the 2012 General Convention. Victoria and I have led spirituality retreats in the Diocese of Georgia since 2007. Griffin served on the Diocesan Youth Commission and was involved in many diocesan youth programs and campus ministry at Armstrong State University. Griffin now lives in Phoenix, Arizona, where she has just started a four year program toward a Doctorate in Veterinary Medicine at Midwestern University. Victoria and I just completed a Lent devotional that Forward Movement will offer for Lent 2020.

The Season of Advent

When you walk into church this Sunday on December 1, you will notice the altar linens are no longer the green of much of the summer and fall, they are now blue. In the left corner of the nave, is a large wreath with four candles among the greenery, and before the service begins a candle (s) will be lit to symbolize one of the themes of Advent: the light that shines in the darkness. The light of Christ comes into a world that is often broken and dark.

The word "Advent" derives from the Latin *Adventus*, which means "coming." Referring to both the "first coming" of Jesus Christ in his birth at Christmas, and to his "second coming" at the end of time. The scripture readings for the season of Advent in liturgical year A, will focus on the birth of Christ and the "second coming" of Christ, with the gospel of Matthew as our guide. Matthew will help us get ready for Jesus to be born and ready for Jesus to come back. So let us begin this new church with expectation! "The King shall come!" "Rejoice!"


Christmas Flowers and Decorations

Advent Bible Study 'A Thrill of Hope' Wednesday, December 4, 6:00 pm continues December 11 & 18



A Thrill of Hope presents the familiar story of Christmas as told in the Gospels of Matthew and Luke. Each scripture passage is illustrated and interpreted in the stunning artwork of John August Swanson along with commentary by some of America's premier Biblical scholars, names such as Dr. Thomas G. Long, Dr. Michael Joseph Brown, Dr. Carol A. Newsom, and more. The study is divided into six 7-minute chapters, each one featuring a passage of Scripture, commentary by the scholars, and a Swanson work of art based on that passage. Included are A Visit (Luke 1:26-38), The Nativity (Luke 2:1-7), The Shepherds (Luke 2:8-20), Epiphany (Matthew 2:1-12), Presentation in the Temple (Luke 2:21-40), and Flight into Egypt (Matthew 2:13-15). Books are located in the Narthex with a sign-up sheet. Price is \$5.00.

Vestry meeting minutes for September, 2019 were reviewed; Jack moved to approve minutes with one correction, 2nd by Hugh, motion passed.

A check in the amount of \$7000 from Bank of America — Church Corp was deposited in the Ameris Bank Money Market Fund on September 10th. A check in the amount of \$7000 from State Street Fund was deposited in the Ameris Bank Money Market Account on September 23rd. Beverly moved to approve the report, 2nd by Jack, motion passed.


