Dear Friends,



Earlier in July, I met with several members of the Vestry to develop detailed plans for returning to in-person worship. These plans, outlined below, are based on guidelines (*Guidance for Church Physical In-Person Gathering and Building Use with Respect to COVID-19*, along with a *Safer Standard Chart* outlining the minimum required health standards) sent to every congregation in June by the Diocese. Bishop Frank Logue, in his letter to the clergy and lay leaders, said that we are to follow to the best of our ability the standards set in these guidelines to begin worshiping in-person at this time.

Using our plan, based upon the Diocesan guidelines, we will return to in-person worship on Sunday, August 2. Please understand; these guidelines are restrictive to keep us as safe as possible. Our insurance will not cover us if we do not comply with the guidelines to the best of our abilities. For those of you who feel concerned about returning to in-person worship, or feel you cannot follow the guidelines outlined below, we will continue to live-stream our service every Sunday via Facebook and send copies of the service via email. Paper copies are sent to those with no email.

Annunciation's Plan for Returning to In-Person Worship

Sunday Worship Services: Duration approximately 40 minutes.

8:00 am service in the Old Sanctuary – maximum number of people 10 10:30 am service in the New Sanctuary – maximum number of people 30

5:00 pm service in the Parish Hall – maximum number of people 12 – New Service & Time

Very Important! Every week, you will receive an email from Dorsey McMichael or the church office asking you to sign up via email for the service you will attend. Please reply to that email the service you would like to attend. For those without email, you will need to call Dorsey at 770-598-5212, or you may call the church office. **Please do not show up to one of these service without signing up or phoning, as we will need to make sure we do not go over the number allowed per spacing requirements.**

Masks are required for everyone 2 years old and older. If you come without a mask, one will be provided for you.

There will be a free standing hand sanitizer station located outside the front door to use before entering the building. At the 10:30 am service, an usher will escort you to your seat, as pews and certain seating areas will be closed off. The usher will record your name, contact information if needed, and pew location on a seating chart. The ushers will also be available to help remind us of the many guidelines we need to follow. At the other services, Rev. Denise will fill out seating chart. This information is necessary for contact tracing in case we need to let people know they may have been exposed to COVID-19.

Upon entering, each person will be given a small bag with Lysol wipes to clean their pew, chair, or table area at the end of the service. A covered trashcan will be available at the back of the church for disposing the used wipes as you leave.

There will be no congregating in the Narthex before or after the service. If you desire to spend time visiting after the service, we ask that it be done outside following good social distancing.

There will be one way and traffic flow markings on the carpet. The center isle will be used for entering and for moving forward to the pews and the altar for communion. For all exiting, and returning to your seat after communion, please use the side isles. To keep as much distance between you and the people in the pew, please walk single file in the center of the isle when you enter or leave.

There will be No Bulletins, Hymnals, or Prayer Books available. The service will be sent via email & mail for those without email. I encourage you to bring your own bulletin and prayer book.

There will be **No:** Nursery or youth activities; Singing of Hymns; Passing the Peace/Greetings; Passing the Offering Plate (it will be located at the back of the church as you enter); Procession; Food & Beverages.

The Eucharist will be offered (bread or hosts, and wine in small cups). The bread will be broken into small pieces and placed on the corporal on the altar. The individual small communion cups will be filled by the LEM. A hands free sanitizer station will be placed by the communion rail to use as you come up to the altar one by one, or by family. You will take a piece of bread or a host and a small cup of wine. Rev. Denise and the LEM will issue the words of administration allowing enough distance between us. A small trashcan will be placed beside the altar for the disposal of the used wine cups.

Restrooms will be for emergency use only. Signs are posted at each restroom detailing safe restroom procedures. A hands free sanitizer station will be located outside the bathrooms and Lysol wipes will be available in each restroom to wipe down areas that are touched. Please discard all wipes and towels in the trashcan before leaving.

Please wear comfortable, light clothing this summer. The buildings will be cold when you enter then, after the service begins, the air conditioning will be turned off (we will give this a try before looking into a more expensive way of cleaning the air). Remember the service will be shorter in duration.

Please remember if you have had a temperature of 100.4 F or greater, or any symptoms of COVID-19 in the past three days, or have been exposed to anyone with these symptoms, please stay home.

If you develop symptoms of COVID-19 and/or test positive within five (5) days after attending church, you must let me (Rev. Denise) know immediately. When such information is reported, others at the gathering may be notified of potential exposure, the public health department will be notified and Canon Loren Lasch in the Diocesan Office will be notified.

I know church will be very different. It certainly has been since March, but the Lord is with us and we will get through this time. I am praying and hoping that we will soon be able to move into Phase 2 which will be less restrictive while still seeking to keep us safe. Thank you for your cooperation and support. If you have any questions or concerns please feel free to contact me.

Video Live-Streaming Equipment Needed at Annunciation. Can You Help Us Raise the Funds?

As soon as possible, we will need to purchase a professional video camera, computer, and sound system. Danielle had been researching what we will need; the cost will run between \$2500 & \$5000.



Vestry Meeting Minutes – Annunciation – June 22, 2020 at 5:30 pm

Meeting opened by Rev. Denise with prayer.

Study of Acts 21 was completed; meeting was held in the Parish Hall with social distancing due to coronavirus. Vestry Meeting minutes for May 2020 were reviewed; Jack moved to approve minutes with two corrections, 2nd by Rebecca, motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: (Denise for Frank) May 2020 Financial Report was reviewed. Income for May was \$12,186 and included \$7000 check from State Street (Manry Memorial Fund) and around \$5000 pledged income. Jack had a question about the plate offering year-to-date; Denise is going to check on it. Expenses are typical for this time of year. Restricted funds are now separated on Financial Report. Rebecca moved to approve the financial report, 2nd by Jack, motion passed.

Senior Warden's Report: (Rebecca) Rebecca reported that the replanting of the annual flower bed has been completed and she wishes to thank Danielle Turoski and her daughters, Layla and Miah, for their wonderful help.

Junior Warden's Report: (Jack) Jack reported that the shrubbery has been trimmed and thanks all who have helped with this. The Sacristy water heater has been checked out and is in satisfactory working condition.

Deacon's Report: Rev. Dcn. Burt continues to be absent due to work.

Rector's Report: (Rev. Denise) Our new phone service will be hooked up on Thursday morning. Jackson Sharpe, from Presbyterian church, may be willing to help set up long-term virtual taping of our church services. Rebecca suggested that it might be good for the sound system to be able to connect to hearing aids. In the meantime, Danielle Turoski continues to record each service for live streaming on our Facebook page. Denise reviewed the Diocesan guidelines for in-person worship and gatherings that has been received from the Diocese. A written plan that follows these guidelines must be developed and presented to Bishop Logue for approval. Vestry members will work on development of a plan. School supplies are being collected throughout July. Bibles for Dummies Study has resumed on Tuesday's at 1:00 pm in the Parish Hall with social distancing and masks to be worn by participants. Rev. Denise will be out of town on Sunday, June 28; Rebecca Miller will be the officiant for Morning Prayer services. Next Vestry Meeting will be held at 5:30 pm on Monday, July 27th.

Business:

- 1. Rev. Denise reported that removal of the live oak tree by Frank Champion, as a volunteer, would be covered by our church insurance. Frank has agreed to do the work as a volunteer. A plan would be developed to possibly remove the stump and beautify the area by the Grounds Committee after the tree is down. Dorsey and Rebeccca are working on a plan to possibly build a bench or some other piece in memory of Fr. Ron Southerland with wood from the tree. Jack moved that it be approved for Frank Champion to remove the live oak tree, and that wood from the tree be salvaged to build a bench or other piece in memory of Father Ron Southerland, who planted the tree; 2nd by Dorsey, motion passed.
- 2. Vestry members will meet with Rev. Denise on Wednesday, 7/8/2020 at 1 pm to develop a written plan for in-person worship and gatherings at Annunciation that follows the guidelines in the Diocese of Georgia Guidance Document and the COVID-19 Safer Standards Chart that have been developed by the Diocese. This plan will be submitted to Bishop Frank Loque for approval.

Ministry Area Reports: Already covered during meeting.

Meeting adjourned with Lord's Prayer at 7:40 pm.
