Dear People of Annunciation,

In the June 24, From The Field: News From the Diocese of Georgia, Bishop Logue issued the following statement below concerning the return to in-person worship. Your Vestry and Rector will be meeting on Wednesday, July 8, to develop a detailed plan for such gatherings at Annunciation per this guidance from the Diocese. When completed, we submit to the diocese a Certification that we have a plan that complies with the current Guidance and notify the Bishop's office when we plan to implement such plan. I will share these detailed plans with you later this month. As of now, the number of COVID-19 cases continues to rise in our area so I do not have a timetable for a return to in-person worship but please be on the look-out for an email from me when we feel it is safe to return, as there will be a need for Online Signups and other guidance.

"Phase 1 Guidance for Worship

While serious public health concerns remain, the many communities we serve are not all in the same context when it comes to the pandemic. Livestreaming or otherwise providing online options, either from the congregation or for a church to attend together the Diocese of Georgia or National Cathedral worship, will need to continue for the forseeable future. These options are essential as many of our parishioners and those who would like to newly attend our worship are particularly vulnerable.

With that said, I am authorizing priest and vestries to consider their context and determine when they will offer worship greatly modified to mitigate risk. This will include, but is not limited to, keeping appropriate physical distance, wearing masks, and not offering singing. The Rector (or Priest-in-Charge) and vestry will need to consider their physical space, the age and vulnerability of the congregation, and their community context including the spread of the novel coronavirus in their region of the state. To move to the Phase 1 guidance that body acting together will certify, "We have assessed the outbreak in our region and feel a return to in-person worship following the Phase 1 guidelines is safe in our context." I do not, of course, have any expertise in epidemiology and related fields and so have relied on the guidance of subject matter experts and have worked together with my colleagues in the House of Bishops. Please know that there is nothing we can do to eliminate the chance of contracting the virus when attending worship and anyone attending needs to understand he or she is assuming that risk, but everything we are doing is to lower that risk.

Phase 1 guidance takes effect on July 1 for any congregations making that determination. Though many, if not most, congregations will not start any in-person worship that week, this guidance will remain in effect and any congregation later determining that they can begin to offer some services with these guidelines can start at any later date, once the vestry completes the brief certification. This same guidance applies to non-worship gatherings, including limiting the length of the gathering to no more than 40 minutes as increased time together in an enclosed space adds to the risk of transmission. As the guidelines limit the attendance to a maximum of 25-50 persons depending on the size of the church and so congregations may well decide to offer in-person worship mid-week or offer more Sunday services.

Some have asked specifically about AA and other 12-Step groups as the support these groups provide is so essential to their attendees. Congregations may choose to allow such groups to resume meeting with appropriate masking, social distancing, and cleaning precautions.

Please be patient with your priest and lay leaders as they navigate these difficult decisions as you have been patient with me. The longing we feel to gather together to worship is a holy longing yet a decision to wait until the risk is lower is also a holy act as we show our love and care for those most vulnerable among us. Jesus promised, "I will be with you always, even to the end of the age" and he has not left his people. I am in prayer for your leadership as they make these decisions and shall support them as they determine what is right in their context."

A Way to Receive Communion Sunday, July 5

It has been several months since many of you have received the Sacraments in-person. Those who are watching our live-stream services on Sunday mornings have an opportunity to pray with me the spiritual communion prayer which says that when we desire to receive, all the benefits of Communion are received, even when we are unable to receive the actual Bread and Wine of the Holy Sacrament. But, as many have said to me, "It's not the same."



In an effort to provide the Sacraments in this unprecedented time, until we return to in-person worship, I have tweaked a plan that is being used by others in the Episcopal Church. This Sunday, July 5, I will offer our weekly worship service at 10:30 am via live-stream on Facebook. Please participate in this service, if possible. During the service, I will consecrate extra bread. After the service, I will be available to offer communion from 1:00pm to 3:00pm at the church. When you arrive at church please drive up to the front entrance under the portico. Do not get out of your car. I will bring the consecrated bread or hosts, if preferred, to you with mask and sanitized hands, and offer the words of administration.

If you are unable to watch the service on Facebook, please come anyway and we will say the Lord's Prayer together before I offer you the sacrament. If you are unable to come Sunday afternoon, please call the church office Monday morning so another time can be arranged. We will give this a try and if it seems to work we will use this way to receive communion again, if needed.



Meeting opened by Rev. Denise with prayer.

Study of Acts 20 was completed; meeting was held in the Parish Hall with social distancing due to coronavirus.

Vestry Meeting minutes for April 2020 were reviewed; Jack moved to approve minutes, 2nd by Rebecca, motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: (Frank) April 2020 Financial Report was reviewed. Income for April was \$6706; expenses were \$16,070.63 with around \$5000 of those expenses being paid with restricted funds. Karen Hidalgo, Financial Secretary, continues to work on how to go about separating Restricted Funds from the rest of the report. Income and expenses are typical for the month of April. Both investment accounts continue to be down in value. \$7000 has been withdrawn from the Manry Memorial account and will be deposited in the General Fund. Funds in the restricted BBQ grill account will be transferred to the General Fund. Donations to the church can now be made through PayPal with a 2.2% fee; three donations through PayPal have been received this month. Jack moved to approve the financial report, 2nd by Jerry, motion passed.

Senior Warden's Report: (Rebecca) No report.

Junior Warden's Report: (Jack) Rev. Denise, Danielle Turoski, and Danielle's daughters have resealed the five picnic tables in the playground area. They have also trimmed shrubbery around the church office. They plan to finish painting the church exterior base boards soon. Weed spraying and fertilizing of grass has been completed at a cost of \$600, which was paid with a special gift of \$650.

Deacon's Report: Rev. Dcn. Burt continues to be absent due to work.

Rector's Report: (Rev. Denise) Live streaming of Annunciation's worship services continues. Numbers in Toombs continue to rise. In-person worship will be allowed as soon as possible, most likely with small group participation. Jen and Eleanor Martinez have made cloth face masks for parishioners to take and use; donations can be made to Annunciation. Ascension Day service will be held on 5/21/2020 at 6 pm. The consecration of Frank Logue as our Bishop will be held on Saturday, May 30, at 11 am in Savannah; the service will be live streamed on the Diocese of Georgia FaceBook page. Next Vestry Meeting will be held at 5:30 pm on Monday, June 22nd.

Business:

- Jack received an estimate of \$975 for removal of the Live Oak Tree from Kilgore Tree Service. Estimate includes stump grinding and clean up. Frank Champion suggested that the tree might be removed by church members. Dorsey suggested that some of the wood from the oak tree might be used to build a table or chair. Rebecca moved that we explore options for removal of the tree, 2nd by Jerry, motion passed. Jack requested that a decision be made by the June meeting.
- 2. Jack reported that the hot water heater in the Sacristy is not working properly. It is a 120-volt heat-on-demand unit that is not heating water consistently. The Altar Guild Chairperson has asked Jack to fix the problem. Jack will get estimates for repair or replacement.
- 3. A form to be completed by donors of gifts to Restricted Funds was presented for review and approved by General Consent.

Ministry Area Reports: Already covered during meeting.

Meeting adjourned with Lord's Prayer at 7:20 pm.


