Miracles: transformational moments

The Gospels of August 2020 contain two transformational stories in the ministry of Jesus that weave the strongest threads in our Christian tapestry. What do these stories have in common? Radical hospitality and abundance. Together these two hallmarks of Christian values form our view of the Kingdom of Heaven and inform how we relate to our neighbors. August is a month of Faith-Filled Generosity.


The first of these transformational moments occurs beside the Sea of Galilee, where Jesus spends a long day healing and teaching a great crowd. Do you, like me, wonder what he was teaching? Was he empowering them to free themselves from the oppression of worry and to focus on loving their neighbor? Was he reminding them that they were perfectly created children of God? Did he cure all kinds of diseases that day: emotional pain, disease, spiritual bleakness? Whatever it was, it lasted late into the day, and, in yet another act of compassion, the Savior did not want them to leave before they had their fill of teaching, of healing, and of nourishment.

Scholars debate the actual miracle that occurred next. Did Jesus make a feast from a few scraps of food? Or did he unlock the sharing and compassion of the crowd, so that their own pocketful of food created a feast

when combined with their neighbors' pocketful? Debating this miracle, to me, seems like counting angels on the head of a pin – the truth is that people were fed, a problem that needed a solution was solved, love happened here.

Scraps of food also feature in the second of August's transformational Gospel passages, as we learn about Jesus' conflicted relationship with the Syrophoenician Woman. Jesus does not appear in this story as the virtuous, blameless hero — quite the opposite. If a passerby had filmed this on their phone and uploaded the scene to Twitter, would we have canceled Jesus for the racist and dismissive way he treats this woman who is outside the fold of the chosen people of God? When Jesus demands to be fed before tending to a sick child, and then compares the child to a dog, some might have backed down. Who is to argue with a man rumored throughout the countryside to be the Son of God?

When the Syrophoenician Woman advocates for her child, and stands up to Jesus, two transformative miracles occur. The first is that the child is healed. The second, the transformation that echoes throughout the rest of history, is that Jesus himself is changed. From this moment he realizes his ministry is to heal all who come to him: Galilean, Samaritan, Phoenician, Jew, Pagan, regardless of religion or culture. We are the inheritors of this grace, of this generosity. When we share our gifts with the world, extending hospitality and creating abundance, it's nothing short of a miracle. Amen.

Video Live-Streaming Equipment Needed at Annunciation. Can You Help Us Raise the Funds?

As soon as possible, we will need to purchase a professional video camera, computer, and sound system. Danielle had been researching what we will need; the cost will run between \$2500 & \$5000.

Vestry Meeting Minutes – Annunciation – July 27, 2020 at 5:30 pm

Meeting opened by Rev. Denise with prayer.

Study of Acts 22 was completed; meeting was held in the Parish Hall with social distancing due to coronavirus.

Danielle Turoski presented information that she has gathered, at the request of Rev. Denise, on a plan to purchase and install a video and audio system that will allow live streaming of our church services. She estimates that the cost will range from \$3500 to \$5000. Vestry members are excited about this plan and expressed many thanks to Danielle for her hard work and technical assistance on this project.

Vestry Meeting minutes for June 2020 were reviewed; Jack moved to approve minutes with one correction, 2nd by Jerry, motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: (Frank) June 2020 Financial Report was reviewed. Income for June was \$8579; June expenses total was \$11,981, with a deficit of \$3402. Checking account balance is \$16,843. Our investment accounts are up in value: Bank of America Investment Fund is \$214,721; Manry State Street Global Fund is \$144,678. Frank suggested a withdrawal (in the amount allowed) be made from the BOA Investment Fund and be placed in the General Checking Account. After discussion, Vestry moved to take this action. Matt moved to approve the June Financial Report, 2nd by Jerry, motion passed.

Senior Warden's Report: (Rebecca) Rebecca continues to work on communicating with Ed Wonn on how to properly handle and process wood that will be taken from the Live Oak Tree and used to build a chair or bench in memory of Father Ron Southerland. She also reported that the next Cursillo in Diocese of Georgia is being pushed to Spring or Fall of 2021 due to COVID-19.

Junior Warden's Report: (Jack) No Report.

Deacon's Report: Rev. Dcn. Burt continues to be absent due to work.

Rector's Report: (Rev. Denise) Rev. Denise shared the Guidelines for Returning to In-Person Worship that have been developed by the Vestry and sent to all members in a letter from Rev. Denise. In-person worship will begin on August 2, 2020, with services offered at 8 a.m. in the Old Nave, 10:30 a.m. in the Church Building, and at 5:00 p.m. in the Parish Hall. Many safety guidelines must be followed, including hand sanitizing, mask wearing, and social distancing. Members will sign-up to attend one of the in-person services with Dorsey McMichael. Virtual streaming of the 10:30 a.m. service will continue. Backpacks and School Supplies will be blessed on Sunday, August 2nd, and delivered to J.D. Dickerson Primary School. The Bible for Dummies Study continues in the Parish Hall on Wednesday at 6:00 p.m., with social distancing and masks. Jane Hall Williams will begin our Children's Sunday School Program using the Zoom format in September. We are helping many families in our area with temporary housing and food. Rev. Denise does not see a planned visit at Annunciation by Bishop Frank Logue on the calendar as of yet. Next Vestry Meeting will be August 24th, at 5:30 p.m.

Business:

- 1. Vestry agreed with General Consent that Rev. Denise will announce our plan to purchase and install a video and audio system that will allow services to be recorded and streamed online; opportunity will be given for donations and fund raising that are designated for this purpose.
- 2. Jack moved that a withdrawal be made from the Bank of America Investment Fund and deposited in the General Checking Account; Frank will communicate with Canon Katie Easterling at Diocesan Office to determine what withdrawal amount is allowed; he will then proceed with the paperwork needed to make the withdrawal and the deposit, 2nd by Matt, motion passed.
- 3. Rev. Denise shared that she has purchased a license needed for live-streaming of our services in the amount of \$277, using Restricted Funds.

Ministry Area Reports: Already covered during meeting.

Meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer at 7:00 pm.


