# Samaritan's Purse Operation Christmas Child

We will begin collecting items for Operation Christmas Child now through November 15th.

### What is Operation Christmas Child?

The Samaritan's Purse project Operation Christmas Child collects shoebox gifts—filled with fun toys, school supplies and hygiene items—and delivers them to children in need around the world to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way. For many of these children, the gift-filled shoebox is the first gift they have ever received. Since 1993, Operation Christmas Child, the world's largest Christmas

project of its kind, has collected and delivered more than 146 million shoebox gifts to children in more than 160 countries and territories.

The COVID-19 global pandemic has disrupted everyday life for millions of people around the world. Yet, Samaritan's Purse continues to share the eternal hope of the Gospel and to serve in Jesus' Name. We want boys and girls around the world to know that God loves them and has not forgotten them during this time of fear and uncertainty. Children need great joy now more than ever. Most of all, they need the hope found only in the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Will you partner with us to share that glorious hope with boys and girls around the world—many of whom have never heard the Name of Jesus? We're looking forward to a great Operation Christmas Child season as we prayerfully consider ways to modify our collection and processing in light of COVID-19. We are already monitoring local, state, and national guidelines and making adjustments to help protect the health of those involved in preparing shoebox gifts.

Anyone can pack a shoebox. Individuals, families, churches and groups fill empty shoeboxes with school supplies, hygiene items and fun toys, such as dolls or soccer balls. During the National collection week Samaritan's Purse will collect the gift-filled shoeboxes at nearly 5,000 drop-off locations in all 50 states and Puerto Rico. **Do not include:** candy; toothpaste, used or damaged items; war related items such as toy guns, knives or military figures; seeds; chocolate or food; liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items, such as snow globes or glass containers; or aerosol cans. **National Collection Week is Nov. 16–23, 2020.**

Vestry Meeting Minutes - Annunciation - August 24, 2020 at 5:30 pm

Members Present: The Very Reverend Denise Vaughn, Rebecca Miller, Jack Dell, Jerry Yates, Teresa Barrera-Edge

Members Absent: Matt Storkamp, Dorsey McMichael

Treasurer Present: Frank Champion; Clerk Present: Beverly Thompson; Deacon Absent: Rev. Dcn. Burt Derrick

Meeting opened by Rev. Denise with prayer.

Study of Acts 23 was completed; meeting was held in the Parish Hall with social distancing and masks due to coronavirus. Vestry Meeting minutes for July 2020 were reviewed; Jack moved to approve minutes with one correction, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Jerry, motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: (Frank) July 2020 Financial Report was reviewed. Income for July was \$7489; July expenses total was \$12,874, with a deficit of \$5385. Checking account balance is \$41,568. Bank of America Investment Fund is \$214,721; Manry State Street Global Fund is \$150,396. Frank said that he is attempting to communicate with Canon Katie Easterlin, who is on vacation, regarding making a withdrawal from the BOA investment Fund to be placed in the General Checking Account. Frank suggested that a fundraising effort might be considered in order to reduce the budget deficit in the future. Rebecca moved to approve the July Financial Report, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Jerry, motion passed.

Senior Warden's Report: (Rebecca) Rebecca suggested that the audio-video streaming system include a loop for hearing aid wearers. She continues to try to reach Ed Wonn to discuss how to properly process wood from the Live Oak tree, so that it can be used to build a bench or chair in memory of Fr. Ron Southerland.

Junior Warden's Report: (Jack) Pine straw is needed; Rebecca will have some available mid-September/October. Rebecca will check on the annuals garden regarding need for weeding. The urns need to be refreshed/replanted.

Deacon's Report: Rev. Dcn. Burt continues to be absent due to work.

Rector's Report: (Rev. Denise) Rev. Denise shared the timeline for the stewardship campaign 2020. Dr. Hugh Jordan will chair the program. Tentative plans are that the campaign, "Faith-Filled Generosity," will begin with Kickoff Sunday on October 4 or 11 and will end with Dedication Sunday on November 29. Youth Sunday will be August 30. Bible for Dummies Study continues on Wednesday evenings at 6:00 pm. Blessing of the Animals and Animal Memorial Service will be October 4, at 4 pm; cat and dog food as well as other needed items are being collected for SOAPS. United Thank Offering (UTO) contributions have begun and will be collected on All Saints Sunday, November 1<sup>st</sup>. Next Vestry Meeting will be September 28<sup>th</sup>, at 5:30 p.m.

Business:

- The annual church audit checklist has been completed by our treasurer Frank Champion, our assistant treasurer Wes Chapman, and our stewardship campaign chair - Hugh Jordan. Frank reviewed the results of the audit report. Item #24 was the only need identified on the audit checklist: letter of receipt given to donor for donations of items worth \$250 or more; this will now be the policy. Rebecca moved to approve the audit report, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Jerry, motion passed.
- Diocesan pledge amount requested for 2021 is \$18529 for Annunciation. This amount includes the extra 2% Honey Creek
  assessment. Jack moved to approve the 2021 pledge amount requested by the Diocese, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Jerry, motion passed. It
  was noted that the 2020 Diocesan pledge amount was \$19505.
- 3. Jack moved to authorize up to \$10,000 in the Building Fund to be used as needed for the purchase and installation of an audio/video streaming system, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Rebecca, motion passed. Donations continue to come in to help fund the project.
- 4. Paperwork was completed today to add Frank Champion as a check signer on the Ameris Bank checking account. Two sig natures are required on each check. Check signers are: Frank Champion, Wes Chapman, Beverly Thompson, Jen Martinez, Anne Roller.
- 5. Committee to nominate two new vestry members for 2021 will consist of Rebecca Miller and Jack Dell. The committee re quested that Rev. Denise review the membership roster regarding the age and attendance requirement; the committee also requested that Karen Hidalgo, financial secretary, review the membership roster regarding the record of giving requirement.
- 6. Diocesan convention will be live streamed on November 5-7; two voting delegates will need to be elected at the September vestry meeting.
- Continued membership in the Vidalia/Toombs/Montgomery Chamber of Commerce with the annual cost of \$217 was discussed. Rebecca moved to discontinue membership, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Jerry, motion passed.

Ministry Area Reports: Already covered during meeting.

Meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer at 7:30 pm.
