Dear People of Annunciation,

Advent, and the beginning of a new church year, is upon us once again. The word "Advent" derives from the Latin *Adventus,* which means "coming." Referring to both the "first coming" of Jesus Christ in his birth at Christmas, and to his "second coming" at the end of time. This past Sunday and next Sunday, our readings from Mark's Gospel present two important Advent themes: the Lord's return at the end of time and John the Baptist's preparation for Jesus. Mark, with a bit of help from John and Luke, will help us get ready for Jesus to be born and ready for Jesus to come back. Another way for us to prepare and get ready during this season is to participate in extra study and prayer. There are many opportunities available to us and I would like to highlight a couple.

One, is the Advent Bible Study "Walking The Way of Love" being offered via-zoom beginning Wednesday, December 2 at 6:00 pm. Presiding Bishop Michael Curry and a group of church leaders have captured stories and wisdom in their book that they will share with us organized around the seven Way of Love practices – Turn, Learn, Pray, Worship, Bless, Go and Rest. If you are interested in participating, please let me know and please purchase the book.



The Second is participating in #Advent Word, a global Advent calendar. For the seventh year in a row, #AdventWord will gather prayers via a global, online advent calendar. <u>Virginia Theological Seminary (VTS)</u> in partnership with <u>Forward Movement</u> is offering 27 daily meditations and images during this holy season beginning Sunday, November 29. During a year of disparate worship and communities of prayer, AdventWord offers a way to reflect and pause for the Advent season and await the birth of Christ.

#AdventWord provides a daily meditation, visual image, and invites your personal reflections via social media to share your own Advent journey with a worldwide community. Thousands have participated each year, responding to the words with photos, written responses, crafts, drawings, poems, found art, and Holy Spirit-filled posts. "It is amazing to witness the prayers from around the world appearing on social media when Advent begins," says AdventWord program director, Sarah Stonesifer Boylan. *Join the Diocese as we participate in Advent Word 2020, a global meditation practice shared on social media during the Advent season. Let us in this holy season reflect on the coming of Christ who brings light into the world. Beginning December 1st, each day add an item to a box and on Christmas Eve or before, donate the contents to our food pantry.





The presiding bishop, Reverend Michael Curry and his trusted advisors spell out a step-by-step way to nurture a profound friendship with God in Christ. Walking the Way of Love is organized according to seven practices (Turn, Learn, Pray, Worship, Bless, Go, and Rest) and three ways of being (We Seek Love; We Seek Freedom; and We Seek Abundant Life). The wisdom in this book allows people to move from the first tentative stages of wanting an experiential relationship with Jesus to having a real relationship that grows deeper every year. The seven simple practices spelled out in this book-- by highly experienced teachers and practitioners-will enhance the reader's spiritual growth and open up love, freedom, and abundant life. They will help nurture a deep, abiding relationship with Christ, as

well as care and empathy for our neighbor. The stories and wisdom of these advisors will be helpful not just to seekers of faith, but also supportive to faith leaders who are guiding others in their development across the church. Proceeds support The Way of Love Scholarship Fund.

Vestry Meeting Minutes – Annunciation – November 1, 2020 at 11:50 am (This meeting was postponed from 10/25/2020 and serves as the October Meeting.)

Members Present: The Very Reverend Denise Vaughn, Jack Dell, Jerry Yates, Rebecca Miller, Teresa Barrera-Edge

Members Absent: Dorsey McMichael, Matt Storkamp,

Treasurer Present: Frank Champion; Clerk Present: Beverly Thompson; Deacon Absent: Rev. Dcn. Burt Derrick

Meeting opened by Rev. Denise with prayer.

Study of Acts 25 was completed; meeting was held in the Parish Hall with social distancing and masks due to coronavirus. Vestry Meeting minutes for September 2020 were reviewed; Rebecca moved to approve minutes, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Jerry, motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: (Frank) September 2020 Financial Report was reviewed. Income for September was \$6882; September expenses total was \$16,598, with a deficit of \$9716. Year to date actual deficit is \$19,594. Checking account balance is \$29,312. Restricted funds balance is \$39,182. Frank reported that a check for around \$8500 has been received from our BOA Investment Fund. He is pursuing a copy of the governing document for the BOA Investment Fund. Rebecca moved to approve the September Financial Report, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Jerry, motion passed.

Senior Warden's Report: Rebecca reported that the building of the bench with wood from the Live Oak tree in memory of Fr. Ron Southerland has been discussed with Ed Wonn, who will pick up the tree trunk, have it processed, and build the bench for around \$1000; donations will be used to pay for the work. Frank needs a big trailer to haul off the tree; Jerry suggested John Underwood; Rebecca offered her 17-foot trailer.

Junior Warden's Report: (Jack) No report.

Deacon's Report: Rev. Dcn. Burt continues to be absent due to work.

Rector's Report: (Rev. Denise) Rev. Denise reviewed the timeline for the Stewardship Campaign. She pointed out that the Narrative Budget Income for Annunciation is: Offerings 90% and Investments 10%. Pledge Card Sunday and Appreciation Lunch outside will be on November 22<sup>nd</sup>. DOK Admission Service of new members will be during 10:30 am service on November 1<sup>st</sup>. UTO offering and Necrology Service will also be on November 1<sup>st</sup>, All Saints Day. Sunday School for youth begins on November 1<sup>st</sup> with Jane Hall via Zoom. Diocesan Convention will be live-streamed on the evening of November 6<sup>th</sup> and the morning of November 7<sup>th</sup>; Beverly Thompson and Dorsey McMichael will be our delegates. Operation Christmas Child packing of boxes will be on November 15<sup>th</sup>. Church Office will be closed on November 25-28 for Thanksgiving. First Sunday of Advent will be November 29<sup>th</sup> with Advent Wreaths, Angel Tree, and Youth Sunday. Next Vestry Meeting will be November 23<sup>rd</sup> at 5:30 pm.

Business:

- 1. Vestry Nomination Committee (Jack and Rebecca) presented two candidates to be nominated to serve as Vestry Members in 2021: Victoria Bausch and Frank Champion. Their names will be presented for election at the Annual Parish Meeting in January or February 2021.
- Additional information was presented regarding the Video-Recording and Live-Streaming Equipment and Installation Project. A new proposal was considered that includes bluetooth speakers, additional wiring, and the purchase of a Lenovo Laptop (instead of MacBook Laptop). Jack moved that we award the Live-Streaming Project Contract to
- Southern Technology Partners for a total cost of \$4928, which includes bluetooth speakers, additional wiring, ethernet connectivity/rerouting of the internet service, Lenovo Laptop computer, video camera, installation, and training, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Jerry, motion passed. This approved action replaces the action previously approved at the September Vestry meeting regarding the Live-Streaming Project.
- 3. Rector's Health Insurance and HAS for 2021 will be tabled until next vestry meeting.

Meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer at 12:45 pm.
