Lent Madness Begins Wednesday, February 17, 2021

Want to be inspired by some saintly souls this Lent and have fun along the way? Join with thousands of Christians across denominations who have discovered the joyful online learning community that is Lent Madness.

Lent Madness began in 2010 as the brainchild of the Rev. Tim Schenck who was seeking a fun, engaging way for people to learn about the men and women comprising the Church's Calendar of Saints. The format is straightforward: 32 saints are placed into a tournament-like single elimination bracket. Each pairing remains open for a set period of time and people vote for their favorite saint. 16 saints make it to the Round of the Saintly Sixteen; eight advance to the Round of the Elate Eight; four make it to the Faithful Four; two to the Championship; and the winner is awarded the coveted Golden Halo. The first round consists of basic biographical information about each of the 32 saints. Things get a bit more interesting in the subsequent rounds as we offer quotes and quirks, explore legends, and even move into the area of saintly kitsch. As Lent Madness: allowing people to get to know some amazing people who have come before us in the faith and reminding one another that there's no reason for a dreary Lenten discipline. If this helps people connect with the risen Christ during this season of penitence and renewal, and have a bit of fun in the process, then it continues to be worthwhile.

Here's how to participate: on the weekdays of Lent, information is posted at <u>www.lentmadness.org</u> about two different saints. Read about them and then vote to determine which saint moves on to the next round. We hope you'll participate fully this Lent and vote with reckless abandon! **Pick-up a Lenten score card in the Narthex.**

December 27, 2020 – 1 Christmas The Good Book Club 2021: The Gospel of Mark

Begin 2021 with the Gospel of Mark! The Good Book Club returns to read the earliest and shortest of the four gospels, starting Friday, January 1, 2021, through Shrove Tuesday, February 16. Mark opens with words from the prophet Isaiah: "See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you," and indeed the gospel itself serves as a messenger for the life and ministry of Jesus. Written around 65-75 CE, Mark proclaims the good news that Jesus is the messiah and Son of God.

What is the Good Book Club?

The Good Book Club is an invitation to all Episcopalians to join in reading the Gospel of Mark during Epiphany 2021. Episcopalians will read a section every day through the Epiphany season. In surveys taken before and after the first Good Book Club project in 2018 (reading the Gospel of Luke and the Book of Acts), participants reported growth in their understanding of scripture and a deepening of their prayer life. Perhaps most significantly, the percentage of people who reported reading the Bible on a daily basis increased to 73 percent at the end of the first Good Book Club reading, from 45 percent when it began.

Already, individuals, congregations, and organizations have committed to being a part of the Good Book Club, and we hope you'll join the journey too!



Why read the Bible?

People who read scripture with an open heart grow in faith through their encounter with the sacred stories of the Bible. We know this to be true in our personal experiences — and we have research to back it up. RenewalWorks, a Forward Movement research-based initiative, has data from nearly half a million participants that identify scripture engagement as a key catalyst for spiritual vitality in congregations and for individuals. In other words, if you want to grow and strengthen your faith, reading scripture is the perfect exercise.

Will there be other resources?

Yes! Much like the 2018 Lent-Easter Good Book Club, both Forward Movement and many partners from across the Episcopal Church will provide resources to support you on the journey through the Gospel of Mark. Good Book Club 2018 resources included podcasts, Bible study guides, books, blogs, videos, and more. We're looking forward to inspiring and spiritual resources that will be carefully crafted for the Gospel of Mark 2021. Check back to see what wonderful resources will be offered for this initiative.

Meeting opened by Rev. Denise with prayer.

Study of Acts 27 was completed; meeting was held in the Parish Hall with social distancing and masks worn due to coronavirus.

Vestry Meeting minutes for November 2020 were reviewed; Matthew moved to approve minutes with one correction, 2nd by Dorsey, motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: (Denise for Frank) November 2020 Financial Report was reviewed. Income for November was \$23,522 (includes \$8516 check withdrawn from Bank of America Investment Fund); November expenses total was \$13,623 with net income in November of \$9899. Year to date deficit is \$14,739. Restricted funds balance is \$36,577. \$4228 has been paid out of restricted fund for video streaming equipment. Rebecca moved to approve the November Financial Report, 2nd by Matt, motion passed.

Senior Warden's Report: (Rebecca) Letter will be drafted to Canon Katie Easterling with request for governing document for the BOA Investment Fund account. Rebecca will communicate with Ed Wonn about the tree. Rebecca shared that the sun has deteriorated the finish on the wood trim on church windows. She will talk with Jack about the possible need for sanding and revarnishing of the wood trim.

Junior Warden's Report: (Denise for Jack) Jack has made note of rotted wood trim on the outside of the church. He will bring an estimate for repair/replacing the rotten trim to the January Vestry meeting.

Deacon's Report: Rev. Dcn. Burt continues to be absent due to work.

Rector's Report: (Rev. Denise) Rev. Denise has sent thank you notes to everyone who has made a pledge for 2021 and also to everyone who has donated to the video streaming equipment. The video streaming system is now working! More people will be trained to operate it. She thanks Christina Storkamp for her diligence and persistence in getting the system to work properly. Christmas Eve Candlelight Services will be at 4 pm, 6 pm, and 10:30 pm on Thursday, December 24th; sign-up to attend will be completed by email with Dorsey McMichael. Rev. Denise will be on vacation for a week after Christmas Day; Rebecca Miller will lead Morning Prayer Service at 10:30 am on Sunday while Denise is traveling. The Feast of Epiphany Service will be on Wednesday, January 6 at 6 pm. Annual meeting will be held outside on Sunday, 1/31/2021 at 11:30 am. Next Vestry Meeting will be January 25th at 5:30 pm.

Business:

- 2021 Budget will be presented to Vestry at January 2021 meeting for discussion and approval. Fifteen pledge cards have been received at this time with pledged amount in giving of \$97,000 for 2021.
- Rector's Health Insurance and HSA for 2021 was discussed. Rebecca moved to increase Rev. Denise's Health Insurance to \$8328 / year for 2021, 2nd by Matt, motion passed. Note: \$150 per month will be placed in Rector's tax deferred savings account to replace the Health Savings Account (HSA), which is no longer available now that Rev. Denise is accessing Medicare Health Insurance. Rev. Denise's previous HSA was \$200 / month; Rev. Denise has requested that this amount, which will now go to her tax deferred savings account, be decreased to \$150 / month, in order to help defray the increased cost of health insurance in 2021.
