Dear People of Annunciation,

When you walk into the church on the First Sunday of Advent which begins November 28, you will notice some changes. The altar linens will be blue, rather than the green of much of the past five months. The Advent wreath with three blue candles and one rose will be placed under the cross, and before the service begins, on each of the four Sunday's before Christmas, a candle(s) will be lit. The word "Advent" comes from the Latin Adventus, which means "coming." The season is one of preparation for Christ's coming to Bethlehem at Christmas and his coming in glory at the end of time, to which we wait and look forward. The scripture readings will focus on those who played important roles in the preparation for Christ's coming. The major theme is expectation, not penitence in this time of waiting....

Our **Advent Study titled:** 'Wait upon the Lord' looks back at those who waited upon the Lord for his promises to come to pass and asks us to contemplate how we should wait upon the Lord in this present moment in our lives as God makes himself known to us in his time.

Introduction to this year's Advent Study 'Wait Upon the Lord.'

"The season of Advent, the four weeks before Christmas, is a time of waiting. Children may find it especially difficult to wait with patience. Adults may not be quite so excited, since they may be busier than usual with cleaning, cooking, shopping and decorating, but they may eagerly await the arrival of family members and other guests who will be arriving to celebrate Christmas. For all who trust in Christ Jesus, the Advent season is a time of waiting. Abraham and Sarah waited with trust in the God who keeps his promises. Zechariah and Elizabeth waited for the birth of their son John, who would announce the coming of the Savior. Mary and Joseph waited in wonder for the birth of the promised Messiah, Jesus—the Son of God and Mary's son. With them we now wait—with faith, hope, rejoicing, and gratitude, for Jesus' Second Advent, when he will raise us up from death to live in his presence forever.

Books for this Advent study which begins the week of November 29, will be on the table in the narthex with a sign-up. We will not meet or zoom together each week but I will send to those participating, an email with helpful notes and answers to guide your personal study each week.

Every Perfect Gift The Gift of Light

Keep awake!" Jesus tells us, as if we could possibly let ourselves sleep right now. This year, full of plot twists has not given us a chance to rest. Staying vigilant has been standard operating procedure since the first cases of COVID-19 started making news. This was followed quickly by economic unrest and work disruptions, changes of our routines. Suddenly our living rooms were classrooms and our kitchens stocked snacks for quick meals between web conferencing. Our summer was marked by political upheaval, demonstrations for justice, natural disasters of every kind – more sleepless nights. Thank you for the words of advice, Jesus, but keeping awake has not been a problem this year.

But I don't think Jesus was worried about our sleep cycles; rather, his words were a caution to stay focused, to pay attention. Further, I believe Jesus was not asking us to merely pay attention to the news cycle, to the obvious events that shape the big moments in the world around us, but to notice the subtleties, the patterns of behavior, the nuances.

Advent is a subtle season. Its quiet refrain offers us hope and patience in equal measure. Around us it is characterized by a frenzy of shopping and planning; but deep into the darkening evenings and cooler days of the Northern Hemisphere, or fully into the languid heat and brightening skies of the south of our globe, there is a silent stirring of movement and of expectation, as the things we have planted deep, begin to take root and find the light. Those small moments, the delicate actions and thoughts of Advent, open our hearts to see that faint light as it breaks through the chaos of our culture.

These are the gifts of the season: patience, hope, anticipation, and like every perfect gift, these presents bestow on us just what we need when we need it most. In a season marked by the opposing forces of

starkness and extravagance, God's generosity appeals to us in the simplicity of God's desires for us: to be patient, to live in hope, to anticipate the freedom that will unshackle us from oppression. "And what I say to you, I say to all: Keep awake!"

Vestry Meeting Minutes - Annunciation - September 26, 2021 at 12:10 pm

Treasurer Present: Frank Champion; Treasurer-Elect Present: Christina Storkamp; Clerk Present: Beverly Thompson Meeting was called to order by Rev. Denise with prayer at 12:10 pm, following a delicious lunch prepared by Rev. Denise and Teresa.

Bible study on Letter of Paul to the Collossians was completed.

Vestry Meeting minutes for August 2021 were reviewed; Frank moved to approve minutes with one correction, 2nd by Dorsey, motion passed.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: (Frank) August 2021 Financial Report was reviewed by Frank. Income for August was \$8450 (includes \$1172 Restricted Funds Income); August expenses total was \$12,978; August net deficit was \$4528. Year to Date (January – August) net income total is \$12,747. Dorsey moved to approve the August 2021 Financial Report, 2nd by Victoria, motion passed.

<u>Senior Warden's Report</u>: (Dorsey) Two trees in front of church and Live Oak tree between church and office building have been removed. Wood from Live Oak will be sawed and saved for construction of bench or chair in memory of Fr. Ron Southerland, who planted the Live Oak tree. Dorsey shared prices of a White Oak or Willow Oak tree to be planted in memory of Latrelle Stockton in the church yard. Tree will be planted in October by Greg Brandenburg.

<u>Junior Warden's Report</u>: No report - Matt Storkamp was absent due to work.

Rector's Report: (Rev. Denise) Rev. Denise will attend Clergy Retreat at Honey Creek on 9/27-29/2021. Blessing of the Animals service will be held on Sunday afternoon, October 3rd; pet supplies are being collected. ECW Rummage Sale is planned for October 2 and 9, 8 am – 12 noon. Central Convocation Council Meeting will be held October 16, at 10 am via Zoom; Beverly Thompson is rolling off Diocesan Council after a three-year term and a new member from Central Convocation will be elected. Diocesan Council meets with the Bishop and Canons four times a year and takes care of various items of business and policy setting. The TENS 2021 Stewardship Campaign, "Every Perfect Gift", will kick off on Sunday October 3. It will end with our Gratitude Dinner and Collection of Pledge Cards on Sunday November 21. Stewardship Chair is Hugh Jordan. All Hallows Eve Treats and ECW Coffee Hour will be held after 10:30 am service on 10/31/21. All Saints Sunday with Necrology and United Thank Offering Collection will take place on Sunday, November 7. Next vestry meeting will be October 24 at 11:45 am.

Business:

- 1. Frank moved to purchase either 15-gallon Willow Oak for \$155 or 30-gallon Willow Oak for \$285, with price of planting to be considered in decision-making, 2nd by Beverly, motion passed. Dorsey will take care of the purchase and supervise the planting.
- 2. A request for Authorized Signers for our Morgan Stanley account has been received. Frank will communicate with Anne Roller about this request.
- 3. A 2nd delegate will participate in Diocesan Convention (in person or virtually) on 11/4-6/21 if schedule allows; Rev. Denise will be notified if any vestry member is able to participate.
- 4. Beverly has communicated in length with Ashley Payne at DFCS about our church participating in an outreach program that helps Foster Children and At-Risk Families. All agreed that this is a worthwhile program. Beverly will take the next steps that are needed for our church members to participate.
- 5. Volunteer assignments for Collection Counters for the month of October were completed.
