

Dear People of Annunciation,

Every pledge campaign begins with Gratitude and I have been truly inspired by your generosity during this past difficult year. Whether these gifts of time are measured in hours spent running a ministry, participating in our worship, volunteering in the community, or in minutes spent on the phone, or in person reaching out to each other, or in taking care of each other, this community is generous with its time!

In this season of giving Thanks where we uphold our gifts, I hold you up in Spirit, love, and leadership. Over the coming weeks you will be hearing more about our gifts from our leadership, in our worship, and in our common life together. You are a gift, each of you, and you are gifts to each other and to a world in need of our love. You are definitely blessed with every perfect gift that comes from God above.

Our pledges for the mission and ministry of the church will be due and blessed at the altar on Sunday, November 21, The Last Sunday after Pentecost: Christ the King Sunday.

What is the best gift you have ever received?

I have been asked this question throughout my life by many people in different contexts. Possible answers to a parent or a teacher could be a new walkie-talkie set (these were the Seventies), a bike, a horseback ride with my grandmother, or when I was a teenager, a jeep in the driveway with a big red bow on it. Later it could have been my education, a chance to study abroad, canoeing with my dad on a quiet river, making Christmas cookies with my mom.

Every Perfect Gift

What did these perfect gifts give me, aside from the pleasure of the possession? **They each taught me about living in the moment**, appreciating what I had - whether it was long afternoons playing "secret agent" in the backyard with my best friend and our walkie-talkies, or singular moments like listening to the sound of the current of a river on a quiet summer afternoon with my father. They also taught me generosity, for the delight I had in experiencing the gifts called me to share such moments and experiences with others. This is the relationship between receiving and generosity, and it's a pattern, that, once it takes root in us, continues in perpetuity. The more we practice generosity, the more abundance we recognize around us.

Every Generous Act

In many congregations it is the practice to sing the Doxology as our gifts — the elements of the Eucharist and our offerings — are brought to the altar for blessing. "Praise God, from whom all blessings flow," it begins; and these words remind us of the font from which springs all generosity, all love, all gift. We are called in that moment to reflect on this cycle of abundance sparked with the first light and made manifest in the Creation, in the calling of prophets, and in the gift of God's own son on Earth. As we share our gifts through the Eucharist and through our service to the world, we participate in the ongoing creation of abundance and generosity.

What is the best gift you have ever received?

The theme and image for *Every Perfect Gift* are wrapped in the metaphor of the butterfly and chrysalis. Of all the metaphors of gift that could be used, why did we decide on this one?

To the ancient Greeks, the butterfly represented the image of rebirth and freedom. The word they used for butterfly was *psyche*, and if you are thinking that sounds familiar, you are correct! It also means spirit. The humble and beautiful butterfly contains the philosophical and spiritual idea of the soul breaking free from its shell — free to **discover, to inspire, to create, to communicate, to share.**



These are also spiritual gifts, gifts that when we free ourselves to serve in the world, we need and share with others; and they are gifts of our stewardship. **As we share our time, talent, and treasure**

with our church and with the world, we unleash those same gifts in our communities: discovery, inspiration, creativity, communication, sharing. Through the ministries that are enabled by our gifts, the inspiration we show to our neighbors to unlock their generosity in the world, and the stories we tell about ourselves and our experiences, we participate with God in an abundant vision for the world. Every perfect gift comes from God above.

Samaritan's Purse Operation Christmas Child

We are collecting items for Operation Christmas Child now through November 17.

What is Operation Christmas Child?

The Samaritan's Purse project Operation Christmas Child collects shoebox gifts—filled with fun toys, school supplies and hygiene items—and delivers them to children in need around the world to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way. For many of these children, the gift-filled shoebox is the first gift they have ever received. Since



1993, Operation Christmas Child, the world's largest Christmas project of its kind, has collected and delivered more than 146 million shoebox gifts to children in more than 160 countries and territories.

The COVID-19 global pandemic has disrupted everyday life for millions of people around the world. Yet, Samaritan's Purse continues to share the eternal hope of the Gospel and to serve in Jesus' Name. We want boys and girls around the world to know that God loves them and has not forgotten them during this time of fear and uncertainty. Children need great joy now more than ever. Most of all, they need the hope found only in the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Will you partner with us to share that glorious hope with boys and girls around the world—many of whom have never heard the Name of Jesus? We're looking forward to a great Operation Christmas Child season as we prayerfully consider ways to modify our collection and processing in light of COVID-19. We are already monitoring local, state, and national guidelines and making adjustments to help protect the health of those involved in preparing shoebox gifts.

Anyone can pack a shoebox. Individuals, families, churches and groups fill empty shoeboxes with school supplies, hygiene items and fun toys, such as dolls or soccer balls. During the National collection week Samaritan's Purse will collect the gift-filled shoeboxes at nearly 5,000 drop-off locations in all 50 states and Puerto Rico. **Do not include:** candy; toothpaste, used or damaged items; war related items such as toy guns, knives or military figures; seeds; chocolate or food; liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items, such as snow globes or glass containers; or aerosol cans. **National Collection Week is Nov. 17-22, 2021**

Vestry Meeting Minutes – Annunciation – August 22, 2021 at 12:20 pm

Members Present: The Very Reverend Denise Vaughn, Dorsey McMichael, Teresa Barrera-Edge, Frank Champion, Beverly Thompson

Member Absent: Victoria Bausch, Matt Storkamp

Treasurer Present: Frank Champion; Clerk Present: Beverly Thompson

Meeting was called to order by Rev. Denise with prayer at 12:20 pm, following a delicious lunch prepared by Rev. Denise. Review of the Vestry Resource Guide section on Stewardship was postponed.

Vestry Meeting minutes for July 2021 were reviewed; Frank moved to approve minutes, 2nd by Dorsey, motion passed.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: (Frank) July 2021 Financial Report was reviewed by Frank. Income for June was \$31,095 (includes \$340 Restricted Funds Income); July expenses total was \$11,606; July net income was \$19,489. Beverly moved to approve the July 2021 Financial Report, 2nd by Dorsey, motion passed.

<u>Senior Warden's Report</u>: (Dorsey) Dorsey has obtained an estimate from Chris at Kilgore Tree Removal Service; he will remove three trees from church yard for \$1200, including trimming and stump grinding, within 3-4 weeks. Dorsey will get estimated cost for shade bearing tree to be planted on front lawn, where irrigation is already in place, in memory of Latrelle Stockton.

Junior Warden's Report: No report - Matt Storkamp was absent due to work.

<u>Rector's Report</u>: (Rev. Denise) Roof leaks in secretary's office and ladies' bathroom in office building need attention. Need for repair or replacement of roof will be considered. Rev. Denise reviewed the 2022 Diocesan Pledge request in the amount of \$18314 (pledge was \$18529 in 2021); this includes our 10% tithe to the Diocese plus 2% to help wipe out the Honey Creek bond debt. The tithe amount is based on Annunciation's 2018, 2019, and 2020 actual revenue. Annunciation's Pledge agreement for 2022 is due to Diocesan office by 9/15/2021. Due to surge of COVID in our area, the Parents Night Out on 8/27 and Covered Dish Luncheon on 8/29 will most likely be cancelled; Rev. Denise is keeping a watch on the numbers in our area and will let everyone know her decision. Two delegates from Annunciation are needed to attend Convention at Jekyll Island Convention Center on 11/4-6/2021. There is possibility that Convention will be virtual, depending on COVID numbers. Delegates will attend Central Convocation meeting in October prior to attending Convention in November. National Ultreya was held virtually on 8/21/2021, with some Cursillistas from Annunciation in attendance. ECW Coffee Hour will be held after 10:30 am service on 9/19. Vestry Meeting will be after 10:30 service on 9/26. Rev. Denise will attend the Clergy Retreat at Honey Creek on 9/27-29; only vaccinated attendees are allowed. Blessing of the Animals will be Sunday, October 3. ECW Rummage Sale will be October 2 and 9, from 8 am – 12 noon; setup begins on September 3; parishioners are encouraged to bring items for the sale and to assist in setup. Stewardship season is approaching. A newcomers' gathering will be considered in the fall; however, such an event may not happen due to COVID.

Business:

- 1. Frank moved that Christina Storkamp be elected as Treasurer Elect, to serve as Apprentice Treasurer until Frank's term ends, 2nd by Dorsey, motion passed.
- 2. Audit has been completed by Frank, Wes Chapman, and Hugh Jordan; Frank reviewed the audit report with Vestry; it will be submitted to Diocesan Office by 9/1/2021.
- 3. Frank moved to have three trees (Live Oak tree in front of office building and two hardwood trees in front of church building) removed by Kilgore Tree Removal Service, for \$1200, as presented in Dorsey's Senior Warden report, 2nd by Beverly, motion passed. This will be paid using funds from the Building Repair and Maintenance Restricted Fund.
- 4. Beverly moved to approve Annunciation's 2022 Diocesan Pledge in the amount of \$18,314 as presented in Rev. Denise's Rector's Report, 2nd by Teresa, motion passed.
- 5. Two delegates are needed to represent Annunciation at Diocesan Convention on November 4-6, 2021. Beverly Thompson was elected to serve as delegate by General Consent. A second delegate will be determined later. Attendance can be in person or virtual.
- 6. Beverly has not yet communicated in length with Ashley Payne at DFCS about our church participating in an outreach program that helps Foster Children and At-Risk Families; she will do this before next meeting.
- 7. Volunteer assignments for Collection Counters for the month of September were completed.

Ministry Area Reports: Already covered during meeting.
