The Season of Epiphany

Epiphany is a Greek word meaning "manifestation, showing forth, revelation. The season of Epiphany is a season of four to nine weeks, from the Feast of the Epiphany (January 6) through the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday. The number of weeks in the season varies according to the date of Easter. This year there are seven Sunday's in the Epiphany season. Epiphany proclaims that in Jesus, God is revealed to all people—not just a select few, but to all people, in all places, and throughout all time.

On Epiphany and the weeks that follow, the gospels will present a series of occasions at which Jesus was revealed to be God's son. The coming of the Magi is celebrated on the Epiphany. The Baptism of our Lord is observed on the Sunday after Epiphany. The gospels for the other Sundays of the Epiphany season describe the wedding at Cana, the calling of the disciples, and various miracles and teachings of Jesus. The Last Sunday after the Epiphany is always devoted to the Transfiguration. Jesus' identity as the Son of God is dramatically revealed in the Transfiguration gospel, as well as the gospel of the baptism of Christ.

One of the primary themes of Epiphany is the celebration of Christ as the light that has come into the world. "Arise, shine; for your light has come,

and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you...

Nations shall come to your light,

and kings to the brightness of your dawn...

They shall being gold and frankincense,

and shall proclaim the praise of the Lord. (Isaiah 60:1,3,6)

"May Almighty God, who led the Wise Men by the shining of a star to find the Christ, the Light from Light, lead you also, in your pilgrimage, to find the Lord" (*The Book of Occasional Services*).

May this be our prayer and desire, as we travel the Season of Epiphany.

Annual Meeting Sunday, January 30

The Annual Meeting is an important moment in the life of an Episcopal Church. As a denomination, we are governed by our members. Members are those 16 and older who have been baptized or confirmed in the Episcopal Church. If baptism or confirmation did not happen at Annunciation then, a Letter of Transfer from another Episcopal Church is needed. At the Annual Meeting we make important decisions together. We elect members of our vestry. Vestry members are representatives of the parish with specific responsibilities by the canons of The Episcopal Church. They share leadership responsibilities with the rector. Also, during the annual meeting, the parish receives reports from ministries, the treasurer, and a "State of the Church" report from the rector.
