Rector's Report 2022 Annual Meeting



There once was a young boy named William and he and his mother belonged to a small Episcopal Church. One Sunday, while visiting family in another town, they decided to attend the Episcopal Church there. When it was time for communion, what their own church called bread and wine, the priest at this church, referred to as elements, a word William didn't understand. As communion began, the priest said, "Now, if you will come forward, the elements will pass among you." William was suddenly excited and the mother didn't know why. Then he learned toward her, whispering something that caused her to burst out laughing. With all eyes on them, the mother took Wm by the hand and made a hasty exit. All the way to the car, he protested. "Mom, we're going to miss the circus. The priest said the elephants were going to pass among us!"

Well, I'm not sure we could call the past two years a circus but it sure has felt like a roller coaster ride. Just when we felt it was safe to begin getting back to normal, we were hit with another and then another wave of Covid variants. We are all a bit weary and I know I'm not the only one who has felt a bit discouraged at times. These past two years, have been difficult for all of us and we really don't have any idea when or if this pandemic will ever be over. This has led me and others to think that what we have experienced these past two years may be leading us to new normal. And we all know how hard change is...especially in the church, but if we can remain focused on our mission as the Body of Christ, as God carriers-made in the image of God, if we can remain faithful to God, God will see us through. I have no doubt that God is not done with the Church and we can be grateful for that.

Our Christian tradition recognizes that being grateful no matter what comes our way is so very important, because when we are grateful, our perspective on things shifts, we move away from a focus on what we lack or what we wish we could have again. I mean, I would love to see us where we were two years ago...growing with twice the number of people attending on Sunday mornings. I'm not saying that we will never see that again but it might be time for us to give ourselves permission to embrace or accept our reality now so that we are able to move into a new normal, if that is what we need to do. Desmond Tutu says, "Acceptance means not fighting reality. Gratitude means embracing reality. It means moving from counting your burdens to counting your blessings." He says, when we celebrate our good deeds and the good deeds of others, we are much less likely to take life for granted and can appreciate all that we have and have done." Being grateful even lowers our levels of stress and depression, or discouragement.

Believe me I am grateful to God for each one of you and what you bring to the table whether it's a lot or a little. Hopefully, you have seen the State of the Parish Review on the agenda page and when you read the ministry reports, you see that the good work of the church here continued despite the pandemic. We all are in this together and as Paul said today, in his letter to the Corinthians "For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face. "Now we know only in part; then we will know fully, even as we have been fully known. And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love. We have no better example of the love Paul is talking about than Jesus who pressed on with the work God called him to do, even when it got tough...right to the cross. And thank goodness Christ did, for now we have the hope of life forever with God.

I want to thank our vestry and especially our Senior Warden, Dorsey and Junior Warden, Matthew, along with his assistant Jack Dell. You have been invaluable partners in ministry, sharing so generously of your time, talents, and treasure for the building up of this church community. I would like to thank my staff Karen and Glen for their many hours of hard work, especially Karen, for not only putting up with me, but for doing such a great job at wearing many different hats to get the work done. Whatever I have asked of her she is always eager to help. Thank you to each of you for your support of me and your church. Let us continue to persevere running the race put before us, to the glory of God through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Senior Warden Report

Over the past year, we have addressed several maintenance issues related to the grounds and the buildings. Sadly (and very reluctantly), we had to remove the Red Oak tree that Father Ron Southerland planted years ago as its root system disrupted the plumbing of our old church building. We have, however, arranged (through private funding) to have the wood from this tree be used to make a bench in Father Ron's memory. Two more Oak trees which were dead also have been removed from the front yard of the church.

In memory of Latrelle Stockton we will be planting two new Willow Oak trees in the front yard. We hope to do this on February 18th (Arbor Day) and have contracted Greg Brandenburg to help us with the project. We have also placed a wind chime near the columbarium in Latrelle's memory (dedicated by her family).

Our vestry has also attempted to implement protocols related to COVID-19. Until this Fall these came to us from the Diocese, but they are now being left to the rector's discretion. At this point in time, we do still encourage all congregants to wear face coverings. We will continue to stream the 10:30am service online for those who may not feel comfortable returning to in-person worship.

I would like to thank Reverend Denise for her complete devotion to the church and for her leadership. It has been a challenging year and she has guided us through it very well. It has been a privilege to serve as senior warden under her advisement and example.

Junior Warden's Report

Completed:

- Portico Columns in the Breezeway painted by the Roller's
- Drainage ditch pipe below the columbarium was cleaned out by Harry Moses to provided better drainage in that area. The city cleaned out the ditch on Cheney Drive.
- Two dead trees removed from the front of the church.
- Live Oak Tree removed between church and office building wood was saved and will be sawed for construction of a bench in memory of Fr. Ron Southerland, who planted the tree.
- Several areas of rotting Fascia Board around the church were repaired.
- Leak in process of being repaired around the Stained Glass Window.
- Jack Dell & Larry Threlkeld pressure washed the area between the Parish Hall and Offices.
- Two grounds work days took place to trim trees and shrubbery.

To Do:

- The playground equipment needs some repairs and a new swing set is needed for the younger children.
- A rotting window sill in the Parish Hall needs to be repaired.
- 30 gal Willow Oak Memorial tree will be planted in front of the church in memory of Latrelle
- Dublin Construction Co. has been contacted to reroof old Sanctuary Bldg. at cost of \$23,921
- There is rotted fascia board on the covered area of the church by the side door.
- Pressure Wash the church building.
- Three trees (2 Magnolias, and 1 Savannah Holly) at back of church building are growing against the side of building, and over the roof that need to be trimmed.
- Refreshing the seasonal plantings on each side of the church.
- Replace sod in the area where the live oak was removed.
- Fertilize and put weed killer on the church grounds.



1Book1Diocese for Lent

The 1Book1Diocese for Lent is *Inspired: Slaying Giants, Walking on Water, and Loving the Bible Again by Rachel Held Evans.*

The author, who died in 2019, wrote of this book when it was published "Perhaps more than any other book I've written, *Inspired is intended to be read, wrestled with, discussed, debated, and creatively engaged with in the context of community. And that's precisely because the Bible invites us to do the same."*

Bishop Logue said, "Rachel was a thoughtful Christian whose books remain as a testament to the deep, authentic faith of a woman who had a way with God's word offering a healing balm to those who most needed Jesus' love." He added, "I have heard her called the C.S. Lewis for the post Baby Boom generations and I find that not hyperbole, but naming rightly the importance of her work."

Many Lenten studies start on the week after Ash Wednesday and conclude in Holy Week to fit an every Wednesday pattern for meetings. As Inspired is divided into eight sections, the Diocese of Georgia's 1Book1Diocese read will start the week of Ash Wednesday and conclude in Easter Week. 

Due to additional rain damage that has occurred due to the leaking roof, it was decided that to move forward without a second quote. Repairs are being completed on the stained-glass window by Jim Carroll, who is replacing rotten window framing; hopefully that will stop leaking that is occurring around the window. Dick Carroll, Jim's dad, has finished making the altar chairs three inches taller; he did not charge for the work, which is much appreciated. Jack Dell has a developed a list of maintenance needs and will do a walk around with Junior Warden in 2022 to look at needs and prioritize. - 5. Nominees for a three-year term of Vestry Service, beginning in 2022, will be Twalla Haley and Beverly Thompson.
