It's that time again to start collecting school supplies for the 2022/2023 school year. Below is a list of supplies for the lower grades but any help will be greatly appreciated!



Vestry Meeting Minutes – Annunciation – May 15, 2022 at 12:15 pm

Meeting was opened with prayer by Rev. Denise at 12:15 pm, following graduation reception in honor of Greg

Rau.

Vestry Meditation, The Armor of Love, was read and discussed.

Vestry Meeting minutes for April 2022 were read and reviewed; Matt moved to approve minutes as read, 2nd by Dorsey, motion passed.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: (Christina) April 2022 Financial Report was reviewed. April Income was \$8648.00. April Expenses were \$12,784.60. Net deficit for April was \$4136.60. Amount in the Max and Christie Manry Memorial Investment Fund at State Street Global is \$165,977 as of 4/30/2022. Amount in the Bank of America Church Corp Investment Fund was \$252,136.53 as of 3/31/2022. Amount in the Ameris Money Market Account is \$8696 (unchanged). Frank moved to approve April Financial Report, 2nd by Matt, motion passed.

Senior Warden's Report: (Dorsey) Canon Easterlin has not responded to vestry letter inquiring about amount than can be withdrawn from BOA Church Corp Investment Fund. Vestry will proceed with request for withdrawal of funds. Jen Martinez has donated a new chair for Karen Hidalgo to use in the office; it is much appreciated. A 5 pm Sunday service for young families has been suggested; a poll will be taken to determine interest in such a service. The planning meeting for youth and parents was held in April with the following plans: a Parents Night Out will be held; Sunday School for youth will begin in the Fall; Youth Sunday will continue on Fifth Sunday's; special youth activities, such as visiting nursing home and rental of a water slide, will be planned.

<u>Junior Warden's Report</u>: (Frank) Frank has pressure washed the rest of the walk area outside the parish hall. The light fixture outside parish hall has been replaced.

Rector's Report: (Rev. Denise) Due to a malicious email that was received, password for church bank account at Ameris has been changed; Christina Storkamp will now be listed as treasurer with Ameris Bank and Karen Hidalgo will be allowed to use password in order to access account information; the malicious email did not result in any loss of funds. Many thanks to Rebecca Miller and Paul Bridges who planted the Easter Lilies at the Columbarium. Victoria Bausch is having health issues and is unable to attend vestry meetings; she will participate by phone when needed. Rev. Denise has looked up the numbers of views of our Sunday services on Facebook: 103 views of May 1st service; 73 views of May 8th service. The need for changes of Annunciation's Bylaws has been an ongoing concern. At upcoming vestry meetings, Vestry will look at Bylaws and determine what changes may be needed; Vestry will begin by looking at Article 2 and discussing needed changes at June Vestry Meeting. Youth Sunday will be held on May 29. Covered Dish Luncheon will be held on June 5, Pentecost Sunday. Next Vestry Meeting will be held on June 26 at 11:45 am.

Business:

- 1. Upcoming roof repair on office building and how to pay for it was discussed; \$7500 from Money Market Account will be used; a withdrawal in the amount of \$16,500 from BOA Church Corp Investment Fund will be requested. Rev.
- 2. Denise will get form from Canon Katie Easterlin that is needed to make request to withdraw funds and will also call the roofing company to inquire about their plan to complete roof work in the near future.
- 3. Due to the high number of views of Sunday morning services on our Facebook page, recording of services will be continued.

Meeting was adjourned with Lord's Prayer at 1:35 pm.
