Dear People of Annunciation,

It is a fact of history and revelation that Jesus was born. The Gospels, however, do not give us a precise date of his birth. It wasn't until the fourth century, with the development of liturgical observances of the events of biblical history, that Christians became more interested in setting a date to observe Christ's birth. It was in Rome, in 336, that Christmas was first celebrated on December 25. The observance of Christmas commemorating the Incarnation of the Word of God in the birth of Jesus Christ spread quickly throughout the world; with Christmas Day becoming one of the seven principal feast days in the church year. The Christmas season lasts twelve days, from Christmas Day until January 5, the day before the Epiphany. (The following Litany is reprinted from *The Wideness of God's Mercy* by Jeffery Rowthorn)

For all who give you a face, Lord Jesus,

by spreading your love in the world: We praise you.

For all who give you hands, Lord Jesus,

by doing their best toward their brothers and sisters: We praise you.

For all who give you a mouth, Lord Jesus,

by defending the weak and the oppressed: We praise you.

For all who give you eyes, Lord Jesus,

by seeing every bit of love in the heart of man and woman: We praise you.

For all who give you a heart, Lord Jesus,

by preferring the poor to the rich, the weak to the strong: We praise you.

For all who give to your poverty, Lord Jesus,

the look of hope for the Kingdom: We praise you.

For all who reveal you simply by what they are, Lord Jesus,

because they reflect your beauty in their lives: We praise you.

God our Father, you are God of a thousand faces,

yet nothing can reveal you completely except the face of the child of Bethlehem"

Continue in our lives the mystery of Christmas. Let your Son become flesh in us so that we may be for all our brothers and sisters the revelation of your ever-present love. Amen.

Advent Bible Study

Feast of Feasts written by Bishop Frank & Victoria Logue

Take a journey from Advent to Epiphany that follows Jesus in the way of St. Francis of Assisi. The Diocese of Georgia will offer daily devotions written by Bishop Frank and Victoria Logue for a 7-week study. The short daily readings use the lens of Franciscan ideals including humility, simplicity, and peace as a focal point of each week. The study will be posted on the diocesan website and offered to churches for free use.

Each week will have a companion video that expands on the theme of the week posted on the Diocesan YouTube Channel. If you would like the study in book form, there will be the option to purchase a hard copy book at cost or the Kindle version on Amazon for \$5. For those who have a Kindle Unlimited subscription, the book is free. The devotions will be posted online daily at www.GAEpiscopal.org that began on the First Sunday of Advent, November 27.

Called to order at 12:15, after lunch enjoyed from 11:45 to 12:15. Quorum was not present.

Vestry meditation completed.

August minutes read. Frank moved to approve, 2nd by Dorsey, motion passed if additional approval given by Matt via email.

Treasurers report was reviewed. Frank moved to approve, 2nd by Dorsey, motion passed if additional approval is given by Matt via email.

Frank moved that we will no longer record Restricted Funds in Quickbooks Program. We will enter Restricted Funds in the Excel Spreadsheet. We will continue to use QuickBooks to create our monthly Profit and Loss Budget Report. 2nd by Dorsey. Motion passed if additional approval is given by Matt via email.

Sr Warden - no report

Jr Warden - water bill has gone back down. Broken sprinkler heads will be replaced.

Delegates to convention: We need two voting delegates to go. Dorsey may go. Rebecca Miller may go. Beverly will go if needed.

Rector's Report: Sunday school going well. Pledge Drive in full swing. Bylaws tabled until October meeting. Kids may go to Poppell Farms on 10/29/2022. Next Vestry meeting will be on Sunday, 10/30/2022. Adjourned at 1:35 with Lord's Prayer.

Vestry Meeting October 30, 2022

Attendees: Dorsey, Ken, Matthew, Frank, Denise, and Twalla

Absent: Christina, and Beverly

After lunch was enjoyed from 11:45 AM to 12:15PM, the meeting was called to order.

Vestry meditation was completed.

Everyone had read the September minutes, so Frank moved to approve, Matthew seconded, and all approved.

<u>Financials:</u> Denise advised that Total income \$12,386.00 for Sept., total expenses \$18,213.95 (Higher due to property taxes) itemized on Profit and Loss Budget Performance. Regarding restricted funds, Karen can't put 00 in because of the bank and QuickBooks; but found a way to make it appear as separate on reports. Sept.30 figures for BOA end market value\$198,891.07. Max Manry fund \$149,327.50. Matt made motion to approve and Frank seconded then all approved.

<u>Jr. Warden</u> reports that 7 or 8 sprinkler heads have been replaced. He discovered that there are two control boxes for sprinklers. A large one which controls water going to grass and that's the system that the sprinkler heads were replaced for. There's also a smaller box that controls water going to bushes around the sanctuary, and unfortunately one of the sprinkler heads for that system has been damaged and when water is on for that system it sprays directly onto the stained glass window at a 45 degree angle which has caused the water damage around that stained glass window. He has recommended that we not use the system controlled by the small box controller until he has time to fix. He will also be cleaning and lubing all doors of buildings on the property. Cherry trees are dying because of lack of mulch and weed eating too close to the roots.

Sr. Warden: Nothing to report.

Rector's report: Letter from Vicky Bausch resigning from the vestry due to health reasons. Need to find a person to fill this vacancy and get nominations for 2 new vestry members for next year. Need names for Nov. meeting.

Will hold off on by-laws review until after the new year and have new members of vestry on board.

Delegates to convention Nov.11-12, Denise and Beverly in person, Rebecca Miller via zoom.

Vestry meeting in Nov. will be the 13th and in Dec. will be the 18th.

Advent study Wednesdays 6PM on Nov. 30, Dec. 7, 14, and 21st.
