Dear People of Annunciation, (Rector's Annual Meeting Report)

In the Forward of Bishop Frank and Victoria Logue's Book of Meditations for Advent, Christmas & Epiphany, 'Feast of Feasts,' based upon the life and teachings of Francis of Assisi, they write, "Francis of Assisi did not simply believe in Jesus as God's son as in agreeing to statements of faith. Francis believed so wholeheartedly, his faith transformed his life, embodying the Gospel in actions and not just words. By the time of his death, Francis could see many thousands of lives transformed by his call for repentance and simplicity of life."Theologian G. K. Chesterton said of Francis, "He was a poet whose whole life was a poem." Isn't this exactly what each one of us should be doing as followers of Christ? Aren't we to be about seeking to embody the Gospel not just with our words but with our actions? Shouldn't our whole lives be a poem as we seek to love and serve our Lord? We read in the Catechism on page 855 in the BCP, 'The mission of the Church is to restore all people to unity with God and each other in Christ'. How does the Church pursue its mission? 'The Church pursues its mission as it prays and worships, proclaims the Gospel, and promotes justice, peace, and love'. Through whom dies the Church carry out its mission? 'The Church carries out its mission? the ministry of all its members'.

This is our calling as Jesus, Paul and so many before us have reminded us, and when you read the ministry reports by each of our ministry chairs, I am sure you will see that we take our call seriously. Yet, there is always more work to do. Before I arrived here over 7 years ago, the parishioners at that time completed a parish profile called Holy Cow that spoke of what their hopes, needs and dreams were concerning what they wanted in a new priest and what was most needed to improve our church life. The following five areas were identified:

- Make necessary changes to attract families with children and youth to our church.
- Develop a program to attract, welcome and incorporate new members.
- Provide more opportunities for Christian education and spiritual formation.
- Create more opportunities for people to form meaningful relationship...small groups, shared meals etc.
- Expand outreach ministries that provide service to those living on the margins of society...establish a signature outreach program.

I believe we have worked hard to improve our church life in all of these areas and it would take me all day to talk about all our successes and failures over the past seven years, but one area I would like to highlight right now is the establishment of a signature outreach program. Friends it's not been easy but we have a signature outreach program, one that was started here at least four years ago. We have a food pantry that this past year had around 70 visits by homeless individuals and those who needed a helping hand. One problem, our pantry has been supplied by a handful of parishioners and by my discretionary fund. I want to hold this outreach up to you. We are doing what many of you said was needed and it needs your support. You can find an updated list of needs each month in our parish newsletter.

Another outreach that I would like to call your attention to is our video –streaming ministry. You can see from the numbers that we are reaching a lot of people out there by streaming our services. We really need people to volunteer to learn how to work the computer if we want to continue this outreach. All of our ministries need your support. Jane and Karen need help with the children's Sunday school and I could go on and on. If you would like to help with any one of our ministries please, please be sure and let me know. Working together we can show God's love to others and find joy in serving.

Bishop Frank and Victoria write in their book 'Feasts of Feasts' we should be finding "joy" in our service to the community and in our worship. They write "If attending church didn't bring us some comfort, happiness, connection, joy we probably wouldn't go at all. Or, at least, we might find some excuse not to be there as often as we might if we had friends or family that would question our absence." Covid put a real dent in the number of people attending worship across the board. People got out of the habit and it's not easy to get back into the habit.

Bishop Frank & Victoria write, "I think it is possible to become so accustomed to the order of service that you might miss things that once brought you joy. So, I am going to suggest an experiment. The next time you attend church, pay attention to every aspect of the service. Before the service, look at your surroundings. Is there some aspect of your church's architecture that brings you joy? What about the windows, whether stained glass or clear? Just take a look around and reflect on why you return to this space. Listen to the hymns. Is there one that you particularly enjoy singing? Focus on the readings. Is there a line or word that has particular meaning for you? When you partake of the Eucharist, participate completely. Try to make a habit of finding joy in worship every week so that if you have a difficult day in the week that follows, you can reflect back on how you felt on Sunday."

Finding "joy" in serving and worshiping our Lord God does help us to strengthen our trust in God and enable us to follow Jesus even more boldly. As G K Chesterton said "Let your religion be less of a theory and more of a love affair." This is how we find help to get through this life that is not always very easy on us, yet it is up to each one of us to seek God's 'joy.' I pray this for us as we seek to go into another year. I'm not sure if we will ever get back to the numbers of those attending worship before Covid but many of us have not given up and I thank each of you for your support and help.



The Season of Lent

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday February 22. Seeking to keep a holy Lent has always been a challenge for many of us. We tend to think of this season as rather serious with no fun allowed. I guess that is somewhat true. It is a time we step back and consider the ways we fall short in living out our faith. It is a season of self-denial, with an emphasis on repenting from sin and receiving God's forgiveness. Lent can be hard work and not always pain free, but if we do the hard work, it can be the start of profound healing and a time of strengthening our spiritual lives. It can be a time that we discover anew our love and need of God in our lives.

The word "Lent" comes from the Anglo-Saxon word *lencton*, referring to the springtime of the year when the days grow longer and warmer and brighter. Lent first came about in our Christian history, as a season of final preparation for those who would be baptized at the Great Vigil of Easter. In time, the season took on added meaning. It became a time of repentance and of taking on additional practices to help us consider our spiritual health. Some of the classic Lenten practices include prayer, study of scripture, fasting, and self-denial.



1Book1Diocese for Lent

The Diocesan Study Guide Begins The First Sunday of Lent, February 26, 2023 Bible Study Group will meet in the Old Sanctuary, Wednesday, March 8, 15, 22 & 29.



"Clear and compelling teaching on encountering God in prayer is all too rare in the Church," Bishop Logue said. "I find the stories used to illustrate the points in this book open up so much wisdom. The brief chapters are worthy of reflection. *Beginning to Pray had a positive impact on my own prayer life and I am looking forward to the Diocese of Georgia studying it together."*

The 1Book1Diocese read for Lent is a classic work, *Beginning to Pray by Anthony Bloom. This simple and powerful book, gets at the vital importance of encountering God in prayer.*

The 1970 book is readily available both in a new edition and in used copies. You can find the reading guide for the Diocese of Georgia www. GAEpiscopal.org. The guide offers questions for groups to use for the weeks following the Sundays in Lent with an optional meeting in Holy Week. Copies of Study Guides can be found in the Narthex.

Completed:

- Dublin Construction Co. reroofed the old Sanctuary Bldg. at cost of \$23,921
- 2-30 gal Willow Oak Memorial trees were planted in front of the church in memory of Latrelle Stockton.
- The church building and the concrete in front of the Parish Hall were pressure washed.
- The light fixture outside the parish hall has been replaced.
- 7 or 8 broken sprinkler heads have been repaired.
- There has been continued upkeep and cutting of shrubbery around the buildings.
- The church grounds were fertilized and weed killer was put down.
- Two toilets in the office building were replaced.

<u>To Do:</u>

- The playground equipment needs some repairs and a new swing set is needed for the younger children.
- A rotting window sill in the Parish Hall needs to be repaired.
- Water stains on the ceilings in the Old Sanctuary building need to be painted.
- There is rotted fascia board on the covered area of the church by the side door.
- Replace sod in the area where the live oak was removed.
- The cherry trees are dying due to banding when our lawn service does weed eating around the trees. They have been asked to stop but a buffer area around the trees is needed.
