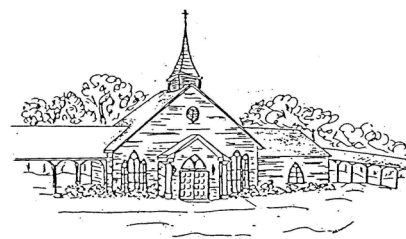

The First Easter – I Was There

Peter – I'm Peter, one of Jesus' best friends. I was there that first Easter, which started so horribly and ended so wonderfully. One thing that I remember is that after Jesus was arrested I was very frightened and when people asked me if I was one of Jesus' friends, I lied three times and said that I didn't know and had never met him. Even worse, was the fact that Jesus had told me I would do this and I said 'No way, Lord, I'd even die for you.' I am very ashamed about this but Jesus forgave me and asked me to start his church, which I did.

Centurion – I'm a Roman Centurion, I was there on duty when Jesus was crucified. I've been at many crucifixions but none has ever touched me the way this one did. Jesus was so different. He even asked his God to forgive us for what we had done to him and then I knew that he was really the Son of God and I wanted to believe in him too.

Mary – I'm Mary, Jesus' mother, so of course I was there. It was terrible for me to see him suffering on that cross. I would willingly have suffered the pain for him if I could, because that's how we mothers feel about our sons and daughters. From the moment they are born, we just want them to be happy and healthy. I knew that Jesus was special because he was God's son and I had a feeling that he would have to go through great pain before he returned to God.

John – I'm John and I was one of Jesus' best friends too. I was there with Mary when Jesus was on the cross and Jesus told me to look after his Mother and of course, I said I would. That was just like Jesus, always thinking of others, even when he was dying. I was also there with Peter on the first Easter Sunday. We went to the tomb in the garden where Jesus' body was put and we found it empty and we remembered that Jesus had said he would come back from the dead on the third day, so we rushed off to tell the others.

Mary Magdalene – I'm Mary Magdalene, I was one of a group of women who followed Jesus. He was the most wonderful person you could ever meet; he made me feel I was someone special at a time when I was not feeling good about myself. After he died on the cross, I felt as though my life had finished too. I went to the garden and Jesus himself appeared to me. So, I was the first person to see him alive and to tell all his friends that he was alive.

We were there, we were there,
We saw Jesus crucified

So we can be joyful, we can all say
Happy Easter-
Jesus is alive today!

Maundy Thursday Service & Agape' Love Feast April 6

The Maundy Thursday Liturgy recalls the Last Supper of Jesus on the night of his betrayal. Following this service, which begins at 5:30 pm, we will gather in the Narthex for a Love Feast or Agape' Meal. Agape' is from the Greek language meaning "love". The Love Feast, or Agape' Meal, is a meal recalling the meals Jesus shared with his disciples during his ministry.

The Agape' Meal, a symbol of mutual love and fellowship, continued among the early Christians after the death of the apostles. Acts 2:46 tells us: "Continuing daily with one accord in the temple and breaking bread from house to house, they ate their food with gladness and simplicity of heart."

The Love Feast is a simple, variety of sliced meats, bread, cheese, hummus, olives, fruit, wine and other beverages. Sign-up sheet is available in the Narthex if you can help provide one of the food items for the feast.


Episcopal Women Annual Yard Sale

Meeting was opened with prayer by Rev. Denise at 12:30 pm, following lunch provided by Twalla.

Bible Study covering Vestry Member duties and responsibilities was read and discussed.

Vestry Meeting minutes for January 2023 were reviewed; Frank moved to approve minutes, 2nd by Carol, motion passed.

Minutes of Short Called Vestry Meeting held following Annual Parish Meeting on 1/29/23 were reviewed; Frank moved to approve minutes, 2nd by Twalla, motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: (Rev. Denise for Christina) Financial Report for January 2023 was presented. January Income was \$24,553.81. January Expenses were \$13,164.83. Net Income for January was \$11,388.98. Balance in checking account at end of January was \$26,225. Current amount in Max and Christy Manry Memorial State Street Global Advisors Account is \$167,923.65. Amount in Bank of America Church Corp Investment Account as of 12/31/2022 was \$214,016.87. Income and expenses are typical for this time of year. Frank moved to approve the January Financial Report, 2nd by Carol, motion passed.

Senior Warden's Report: (Twalla) – No report.

Junior Warden's Report: (Frank) Rotted wood on portico has been repaired. Jack Dell painted front door to church. Many thanks to Jack. Repair is needed on the stained-glass window to stop leakage; this repair is needed around 30 feet up on the outside. Jesus Hernandez did a good job of spraying ceilings in office building with Clorox to kill mold. He is available to help with trimming of shrubbery on church grounds. Frank has tools that can be used for trimming.

Rector's Report: (Rev. Denise) Rev. Denise will be out of town February 21 – March 2. Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper will be on February 21, 5:30-7 pm. Ash Wednesday Services will be at 12 and 5:30 on February 22; Ken Shradar will lead the services.
