#### **Presiding Bishop Michael Curry's Easter Message**

"We are here in a world struggling to find its soul, but the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not, cannot, and will not overcome it," Episcopal Church Presiding Bishop and Primate Michael B. Curry said in his Easter 2023 message. "Jesus lives. He has been raised from the dead. That is the message of Easter, and that is the good news of great tidings."

The festive day of Easter is Sunday, April 9.

#### The following is the full text of the presiding bishop's Easter 2023 message, lightly edited for clarity:

This is a different Easter message. I've shared Easter messages from Jerusalem some years ago, and I have shared Easter and Christmas messages from a variety of locations. Last year for Christmas, we were in San Diego. Today I'm in Paris, part of the Convocation of Episcopal Churches in Europe. We just finished a revival—over 50 young people and some 300-400 people from all over Europe who came for this revival service. It was a remarkable thing to behold and be part of.

The Convocation here in Europe is engaged in incredible ministries, with some joining together with Episcopal Relief & Development to make it possible for resettlement of those who are refugees from war and famine, particularly those who are refugees from Ukraine.

Thinking about it—I realize not only with this view—but with the reality of Easter looming on our horizon, John's Gospel opens: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." Then there is a point in which it says, of Christ coming into the world, "The light shines in the darkness and the darkness cannot overcome it."

On that early Easter morning, John says in his 20th chapter, that early in the morning while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene and some of the other women went to the tomb. They went to the tomb after the crucifixion and burial of Jesus. They went to the tomb of their world having fallen apart. They went to the tomb of all their hopes and dreams having collapsed.

But they got up and they went anyway. They went to perform the rites of burial, to do for a loved one what you would want to do for them. They went, following the liturgies of their religion and their tradition, and, lo and behold, when they went, they discovered that, even in the darkness, the light of God's love, the light of Jesus Christ—the light of Christ, as we say in the Great Vigil—in fact, was shining in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

Jesus had been raised from the dead. He was alive, and darkness and evil and selfishness could not stop him. Love—as the old song says—love lifted him up.

We are here in Paris, this wonderful city. While there are protests going on in the city—garbage has not been collected, and it's all over the city—we are here in Paris, in Europe, with refugees streaming into this continent from all over the world, impacted by changes in weather pattern, impacted by war and famine. We are here in a world struggling to find its soul, but the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not, cannot, and will not overcome it. Jesus lives. He has been raised from the dead. That is the message of Easter, and that is the good news of great tidings. From Paris, I'm Michael Curry. God love you. God bless you, and the light shines in the darkness, wherever there is darkness. This little light of mine, I'm going to let it shine. Let it shine, let it shine. Amen.

#### **Empowered For Mission**

Ascension Day doesn't really have any particular traditions associated with it like Christmas or Easter therefore, for most Christians it is really not a day of any great importance. However, this day theologically and spiritually speaking is of utmost importance, for without it all the other events of Jesus' life kind of dangle out there like an unresolved plot in a novel. The ascension of Jesus is central to our faith because it brings 'closure' both to his prophetic teaching ministry and to the mystical meaning of his death and resurrection by incorporating it into where it came...the life of God. It also focuses the church on its place in God's plan, and the empowerment of the community to this larger task.

Former Archbishop of Canterbury Rowan Williams tries to explain it in this way: "imagine what it is like when you first wake up in the morning. When you put on the light, all you are conscious of is the brightness of the light itself. Only gradually when your eyes adjust to the light sufficiently are you able to make out other objects. After a few minutes, however, you cease to be conscious of the light itself, and start to see what else is in the room as it is illumined by the light. The Gospel accounts of Jesus' resurrection, says Williams show him to have been like that initial morning light: at first Jesus' resurrected self was so blinding that the disciples could be conscious only of him. The ascension, however, is that moment when the light itself recedes into the background, so that Jesus becomes the one through whom we see the rest of the world. "He is the light we see by; we then see the world in a new way because we see it through him, we see it with new eyes. We see it as a place where Jesus promises to be and as a place we are committed to be. The church exists to continue God's work in a fallen world and we are empowered for this mission."

For those disciples who witnessed Jesus' ascension it was a moment of loss and transition, but it was also a moment of glory in that it propelled the apostles to look forward with hope, to see what else was in the room. As it should do with us, propel us forward to do the work God has prepared for us. Jesus said, "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth". The ascension brings about a new era. Jesus is no longer present in the flesh, but the Holy Spirit comes from God to lead the church and the community to look outward and begin adding to its numbers.

If the community had not taken the work they were called to do seriously, the church would have died out. At first, the disciples were fixed on their own preconceived notions of the kingdom. In order to embrace their role as witnesses, they needed to relinquish some of their expectations. When they did, the Spirit moves the apostles to visit unusual places and takes them in some unexpected directions. Sitting in our pews tonight or on Sunday's, our focus is often fixed on our preconceived notions of the kingdom. But, we are a fairly small congregation that desperately needs young families to join so that we will survive.

When we ask when God will restore the kingdom to the good old days...to the way we think church ought to be, or to the way that best fits us...Jesus points to the future, but just as importantly Jesus points to the power of the Holy Spirit in the present, today to help us move into God's future. We have an opportunity to reexamine where the Holy Spirit is moving us. If we sit staring into heaven looking for Jesus, then we cannot be God's witnesses "to the ends of the earth". The ascension is calling us to move from passively waiting for Jesus to come and fix things, to actively participating in the work of the Holy Spirit now.

This reality has not changed in over two millennia. It still takes a community of faith, Spirit-filled, to spread the good news and bring in the reign of God. That is our challenge and our commission as the Body of Christ. The ascension is simply that event that inaugurates our mission. May we accept the challenge to see with new eyes the work God has called us to do.

#### Vestry Meeting Minutes - Annunciation - March 19, 2023 at 11:45 am

Members Present: The Very Reverend Denise Vaughn, Twalla Haley, Beverly Thompson, Carol Rice, Martha Dekle, Len Edge. Absent: Frank Champion; Clerk Present: Beverly Thompson; Postulant Intern Present: Ken Shradar

Meeting was opened with prayer by Rev. Denise at 12:30 pm, following lunch provided by Beverly. Vestry Meditation, "The Call", was read and discussed.

Vestry Meeting minutes for February 2023 were reviewed; Carol moved to approve minutes with one correction, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Twalla, motion passed.

<u>Financial Report</u>: (Rev. Denise) Financial Report for February 2023 was presented. February Income was \$6811.00. February Expenses were \$12,847.47. Net Income for February was -\$6036.47. Balance in Ameris checking account at end of February was \$18,415.59. Current amount in Max and Christy Manry Memorial State Street Global Advisors Account is \$162,332.27. Amount in Bank of America Church Corp Investment Account as of 12/31/2022 was \$214,016.87; report on this account is updated quarterly. Income and expenses are typical for this time of year. Carol moved to approve the February Financial Report, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Len, motion passed.

<u>Senior Warden's Report</u>: (Twalla) – When Rev. Denise was out of town and Ken was ill on February 26<sup>th</sup>, Twalla arranged for Rebecca Miller to lead Morning Prayer at 10:30; all went smoothly.

<u>Junior Warden's Report</u>: (Rev. Denise for Frank) Jesus Hernandez has started trimming shrubbery and is cleaning the floor in Parish Hall. There is dead mold on ceiling in old nave; it needs to be wiped clean with vinegar and water solution. Len has long poles that can be used to accomplish this; possibly Jesus could do this job. No more leaking has occurred on the stained glass window in church building.

Rector's Report: (Rev. Denise) Our church will provide food for the Feeding the Homeless program on March 23<sup>rd</sup> from 5 pm – 7:15 pm; volunteers will meet at Annunciation around 3 pm to prepare the food and transport it to the Feeding Toombs County Meal Center at Becoming One Outreach Ministries (BOOM) Church. Our Lenten Study - 1 Book, 1 Diocese - will continue on March 22 and 29 at 6 pm with soup and bread. Holy Week will begin on Monday, April 3<sup>rd</sup> with Clergy Renewal of Vows at 10:30 am with Bishop Frank Logue at Annunciation. April 3-5, church will be open from 9 am – 6 pm for Stations of the Cross. Maundy Thursday service will be at 5:30 pm on April 6<sup>th</sup>, with a portrayal of the Last Supper and an Agape Meal. Good Friday Liturgy will be at 12 noon and 6 pm. On April 9<sup>th</sup>, Easter Sunday services will be held at 10:30 am with Flowering of the Cross; following the service, a reception will be held, and children will enjoy an egg hunt. Diocesan Ultreya-Cursillo will be held at Annunciation on April 15<sup>th</sup> from 10 am - 2 pm. Bishop Frank Logue will visit Annunciation on April 16<sup>th</sup>. He will confirm Shannon Martin and Len Edge at the 10:30 am service. A covered dish luncheon will be enjoyed with the Bishop after the service. Memorial Service for Tom Sadler will be held at 11 am on Saturday April 22<sup>nd</sup>.
