Dear People of Annunciation,

For several Sunday's in September the theme of the scripture lessons focused on forgiveness. In my opinion, no person understood forgiveness and reconciliation better than the late Archbishop Desmond M. Tutu, South African Anglican bishop and theologian who was known for his work as an anti-apartheid and human rights activist. He was the first black African to hold the positions of Bishop of Johannesburg and then Archbishop of Cape Town. In 2009, he received the Presidential Medal of Freedom.

He was often asked as chairman of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission, how the people of South Africa were able to forgive the atrocities and injustices they suffered under apartheid. South Africa, until 1994, was a country that institutionalized racism, inequality, and oppression. After living in that time of apartheid, Archbishop Tutu was asked what he had learned about forgiveness from his experience and from the many places he had visited during his life where there was conflict and suffering. His book *The Book of Forgiving* is his response to these questions and to the unspoken question that lies behind: How *do* we forgive? The following quotes from his book are just a few to peak your curiosity.

He says, "There is nothing that cannot be forgiven, and there is no one undeserving of forgiveness. In our own ways, we are all broken. Out of that brokenness, we hurt others. Forgiveness is the journey we take toward healing the broken parts. It is how we become whole again. There are countless studies that enumerate the social, spiritual, psychological, and even physiological benefits of forgiveness. To walk the path of forgiveness is to recognize that your crimes harm you as they harm me. To walk the path of forgiveness is to recognize that my dignity is bound up in your dignity, and every wrongdoing hurts us all. Without willingness, this journey will be impossible. Before forgiveness there must be the willingness to consider forgiving. The path of forgiveness is not an easy one but it is the way we return what has been taken from us and restore the love and kindness and trust that has been lost."

The Book of Forgiving, which I highly recommend, is an invitation to walk with Archbishop Tutu and his daughter on the path of forgiveness and reconciliation not because it will be easy but because, in the end the path of forgiveness is the only path worth taking. Archbishop Tutu offers this prayer to start the path...

Prayer Before the Prayer

I want to be willing to forgive but I dare not ask for the will to forgive In case you give it to me and I am not yet ready I am not yet ready for my heart to soften I am not vet ready to be vulnerable again Not yet ready to see that there is humanity in my tormentor's eyes Or that the one who hurt me may also have cried I am not yet ready for the journey I am not yet interested in the path I am at the prayer before the prayer of forgiveness Grant me the will to want to forgive Grant it to me not yet but soon Can I even form the words forgive me? Dare I even look? Do I dare to see the hurt I have caused? I can glimpse all the shattered pieces of that fragile thing That soul trying to rise on the broken wings of hope But only out of the corner of my eye I am afraid of it And if I am afraid to see how can I not be afraid to say forgive me? Is there a place where we can meet? You and me The place in the middle the no man's land where we straddle the line Where you are right and I am right too and both are wrong and wronged Can we meet there? And look for the place where the path begins The path that ends when we forgive

May the path of forgiveness be your path, Denise+

United Thank Offering



Kate Bowler is a professor at Duke Divinity
School who specializes in the study of the
prosperity gospel, a creed that sees fortune as a
blessing from God and misfortune as a mark of
God's disapproval. At thirty-five, everything in
her life seemed to point toward "blessing" when
she was diagnosed with stage IV colon cancer.

Her book Everything Happens for a Reason (and other lies I have loved) will be the 1Book1Diocese read for Advent 2023. We will journey with Kate as she is stripped of the certainty she held only to discover that without it, life is hard but beautiful in a way it never had been before.

As the days shorten and the lectionary considers the Second Coming even as we prepare to celebrate Jesus' first advent in Bethlehem, Bowler brings home the depth of our incarnational faith. Look for a Discussion Guide in *From the Field* as

CREATED IN 2014 IN RESPONSE TO THE GROWING NUMBER OF STUDENTS CHALLENGED WITH FOOD INSTABILITY, THE BACKPACK BUDDIES PROGRAM SERVED 131 CHILDREN EACH WEEK DURING THE 2022-2023 SCHOOL YEAR. IT IS OPERATED BY TOOMBS COUNTY FAMILY CONNECTION IN PARTNERSHIP WITH MANY LOCAL CHURCHES AND SERVICE ORGANIZATIONS. THE NEED FOR FUNDING CONTINUES TO GROW AS THE COST OF FOOD RISES. IN THE 2023-2024 SCHOOL YEAR, WE PROJECT THE NEED TO SERVE 160 STUDENTS. THE AVERAGE COST OF EACH BAG IS \$2.40 AND OUR BUDGET FOR 2023-2024 IS \$11,500. <u>Financial Report</u>: (Rev. Denise for Rebecca) Financial Report for July 2023 was presented. July Income was \$7154.00. July Expenses were \$11,726.90. Net Income for July was -\$4572.90. Current amount in Max and Christy Manry Memorial State Street Global Advisors Account is \$173,670.58. Amount in Bank of America Church Corp Investment Account as of 6/30/2023 was \$223,412.81; report on this account is updated quarterly. Income and expenses are typical for this time of year. Rev. Denise reported on the discrepancy in the Restricted Fund balance that was noted at July Vestry meeting. We are working through Dennis Ingley's Office to reconcile the figures in the Restricted Funds. Frank moved to approve the July Financial Report, 2nd by Carol, motion passed.

Senior Warden's Report: (Twalla) – No report.

<u>Junior Warden's Report</u>: (Frank) Retaining wall and other needs discussed at July Vestry meeting are still in the works.

Rector's Report: (Rev. Denise) Savor the Flavor of Labor Day Covered Dish luncheon will be shared on August 27th; BBQ will be provided by church. ECW Coffee Hour will be September 10th. Next Vestry Meeting will be held on September 17th. Rev. Denise will attend Clergy Conference on October 2nd through 4th. If anyone from Annunciation is interested in serving on Diocesan Council, a new member will be elected from our Central Convocation at end of September or beginning of October. Our Stewardship Campaign, "Rooted in Abundance", begins in September and will end around November 19th with an Appreciation Luncheon. Hugh Jordan will serve as Stewardship Chair.

Business:

- 1. Diocesan Assessment for 2024 is \$15,860.00. Frank moved to approve, 2nd by Martha, motion passed.
- 2. Convention delegates are needed for Diocesan Convention in Augusta on November 10-11, 2023. Tentatively, Martha Dekle and Len Edge will serve as voting delegates and Beverly Thompson will serve as an alternate delegate.
- 3. Safe Church, Safe Community Training is recommended for all Clergy, Vestry Members, Staff, Altar Guild, Eucharistic Ministers, Sexton, Treasurer, and those who work with Children's Ministry/Youth. There are 9 online courses, each lasting around 15 minutes. Different courses are recommended for persons with differing roles in the church. Rev. Denise has information on how to register and which courses to take. Courses should be completed by 1/1/2024 or before.
- 4. Frank Champion shared information on our campaign to raise funds for our Repair and Maintenance Restricted Fund. It will begin with a BBQ Pork Dinner on 9/20/2023. Tickets will be sold for \$15 per plate. Meals may be picked up between 4:30 pm to 7:00 pm at the Parish Hall, or may be eaten in the Parish Hall. Volunteers are needed to help cook and serve.
- 5. Playground Upgrading Project has been initiated. Jane Hall Williams has made an appeal to the congregation for donations. A sail is needed to shade the slide area. New swing seats are needed for the younger children's swing set. A climbing dome will be added to the playground. Harry Moses will help put up the new equipment.
- 6. Sunday School Program will begin on 9/10/2023. Adults and youth will meet at 9:30 am to 10:15 am. Children will have Sunday School twice a month beginning at 10:30 am with two age levels one class for younger children and one class for older children. Nursery will be provided every Sunday at 10:15 AM.
- 7. Work on revising Annunciation Bylaws is tabled until September meeting.
