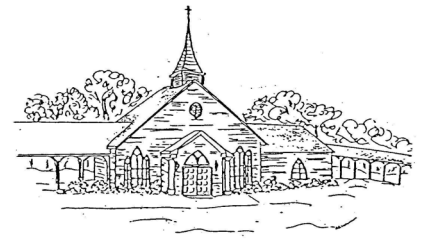

Every Perfect Gift

The Gift of Sacrifice

What would you give up to make someone happy? What money or possession would you trade in to provide something meaningful or necessary to someone else? How much would you risk your own security or plans or happiness for the sake of serving your community? Your neighbor? A stranger?

One of the Christmas stories that my mother read to me as a boy was O. Henry's *The Gift of the Magi*. She never got through the story without shedding a tear, and now I find it the same. My annual reading of the story, now a part of my personal prayer for the feast of The Epiphany, reminds me of the sacrificial nature of giving. For Della and Jim, the gift they wanted to make was to please each other for Christmas, to give each other the one thing they imagined would make them happy. Della and Jim wanted to indulge the child-like joy of gift-giving so much, that they sold the possession most dear to them to buy it. We readers come to understand that the gifts they gave each other with the proceeds of their pawn were meant to adorn the very things with which they parted.

The author finishes his story with a lesson. The Magi gave great gifts from their wealth and status – their privilege. By contrast, our storied couple give each other gifts out of their poverty, making sacrifices to do so. And that, says O. Henry, “makes them the wisest of all, they are the Magi.”

Before we get caught up in the gift-giving of this story, let's explore the underlying point; what makes the gifts special to begin with. Our modern use of the word *sacrifice* has unpleasant connotations of loss. Even if the result of the sacrifice is a greater good, the cost to the one who sacrifices is real, and it is hard. But the root of this word is something far more profound – it comes from the same place as the word *sacred*. To make something sacred, we set it apart, we give it meaning beyond its purpose or craftsmanship or place. To make something sacred, we view it and treat it with Love.

In the end, the size of the gift, or its shininess, or its desirability may make an impact on mission or capacity but are of no less importance than the act of giving itself. Sacrificial giving, giving made through love, this makes the giver the wisest of all. When we give through love, we are the Magi. | TENs.org

The Season of Epiphany

Epiphany is a Greek word meaning “manifestation, showing forth, revelation. The season of Epiphany is a season of four to nine weeks, from the Feast of the Epiphany (January 6) through the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday. The number of weeks in the season varies according to the date of Easter. This year there are six Sunday’s in the Epiphany season. Epiphany proclaims that in Jesus, God is revealed to all people—not just a select few, but to all people, in all places, and throughout all time.

On Epiphany and the weeks that follow, the gospels will present a series of occasions at which Jesus was revealed to be God’s son. The coming of the Magi is celebrated on the Epiphany. The Baptism of our Lord is observed on the Sunday after Epiphany. The gospels for the other Sundays of the Epiphany season describe the calling of the disciples, and various miracles and teachings of Jesus. The Last Sunday after the Epiphany is always devoted to the Transfiguration. Jesus' identity as the Son of God is dramatically revealed in the Transfiguration gospel, as well as the gospel of the baptism of Christ.

One of the primary themes of Epiphany is the celebration of Christ as the light that has come into the world. “Arise, shine; for your light has come,

and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you...

Nations shall come to your light,

and kings to the brightness of your dawn...

They shall bring gold and frankincense,

and shall proclaim the praise of the Lord. (Isaiah 60:1,3,6)

“May Almighty God, who led the Wise Men by the shining of a star to find the Christ, the Light from Light, lead you also, in your pilgrimage, to find the Lord” (*The Book of Occasional Services*).

May this be our prayer and desire, as we travel the Season of Epiphany.

Members are those 16 and older who have been baptized or confirmed in the Episcopal Church. If baptism or confirmation did not happen at Annunciation then, a Letter of Transfer from another Episcopal Church is needed. At the Annual Meeting we make important decisions together. We elect members of our vestry. Vestry members are representatives of the parish with specific responsibilities by the canons of The Episcopal Church. They share leadership responsibilities with the rector. Also, during the annual meeting, the parish receives reports from ministries, the treasurer, and a "State of the Church" report from the rector.









Vestry Meeting Minutes – Annunciation – November 12, 2023 at 11:45 am

Members Present: The Very Reverend Denise Vaughn, Twalla Haley, Martha Dekle, Len Edge, Carol Rice, Beverly Thompson;

Member Absent: Frank Champion; Clerk present: Beverly Thompson; Treasurer Not in Attendance: Rebecca Miller

Meeting was opened with prayer by Rev. Denise at 12:20 pm after lunch was enjoyed by all.

Vestry Meditation was completed and included discussion of the Water of Life painting that Lisa Kimball spoke about at Diocesan Convention in early November. Rev. Denise shared Rowan Williams' quote: "The purpose of the church is to form kinds of people who can receive gifts that God wants to give."

Vestry Meeting minutes for October 2023 were reviewed; Carol moved to approve minutes with two corrections, 2nd by Twalla, motion passed.

Financial Report: (Rev. Denise for Rebecca) Financial Report for October 2023 was presented for review. October income was \$19,964 and includes \$10,000 withdrawn from the Max and Christy Manry Memorial State Street Global Investment Fund. October expenses were \$13,062.81. Net income for October was \$6901.19. Amount in our Bank of America Church Corp Investment Fund as of 9/30/2023 was \$217,123.30. Amount in the Manry Memorial State Street Global Investment Fund as of 9/30/2023 was \$150,665.10. Twalla moved to approve the October Financial Report, 2nd by Len, motion passed.

Senior Warden's Report: (Twalla) – No report.

Junior Warden's Report: (Frank) Frank was absent; his mother is in hospital in Augusta.

Rector's Report: (Rev. Denise) Operation Christmas Shoeboxes are due on Monday, 11/13 with \$10 per box for shipping. Celebration Sunday will be held on November 19, with Blessing of the Pledge Cards and Thanksgiving Dinner provided by church. Advent Wreath supplies will be available on Sunday, 11/26. Angel Tree will be up by the first Sunday in Advent, 12/3; parishioners may take "angels" to purchase Christmas gifts for; Angel Tree gifts should be delivered to church by 12/17. Advent Book Study – 1Book1Diocese will be "Everything Happens for a Reason: and Other Lies I've Loved". ECW Christmas Cookie Exchange Coffee Hour will be held after 10:30 am service on 12/10, with donations going to Youth Fund for summer camp and other activities. Vestry Meeting will be held on 12/17 at 11:45 am. Youth Christmas Gift Exchange and Pizza Party will be held on 12/17 in Old Sanctuary with a visit by Santa. Christmas Eve Services are being planned and may include an Advent Lessons and Carols service at 10:30 am as well as Christmas Eve Candlelight Service(s) in the evening. Morning Prayer will be held on 12/31, the first Sunday after Christmas Day.

Business:

- 1.Rev. Denise shared information regarding cost of Church Property Insurance with different deductibles; Twalla moved to change our deductible from \$1000 to \$10,000, which will save \$1495 annually, 2nd by Carol, motion passed.
- 2.Rev. Denise shared that Ameris Bank may be charging a monthly fee for our Money Market Account, which has possibly fallen below the minimum amount required for no monthly fee; all agreed that if this is the case, the account should be closed out and put into the General Fund Account at Ameris. Rev. Denise will inquire and have the account closed if that is the case.
- 3.Our next dinner to raise funds for the Building and Maintenance Restricted Fund will be held on December 13 with chili, bread, and cookies. Carol will prepare a vegetarian chili and Frank will prepare chili with meat. The number of those wanting the different chili's will be ascertained.
- 4.The final version of proposed changes to our Church Bylaws were reviewed and discussed. Twalla moved to approve the changes, 2nd by Martha, motion passed. The proposed changes will be reviewed by our Diocesan Chancellor before being presented at our next Annual Meeting in 2024 for approval.
- 5.At October meeting, it was decided to charge \$1000 for the use of Annunciation for a wedding by someone who is not a member. Today it was discussed and all agreed that the charge for a wedding in the church without the use of the Parish Hall for a reception would be \$500.

Ministry Area Reports: Already covered.

Meeting was adjourned with Lord's Prayer at 2:15 pm.
