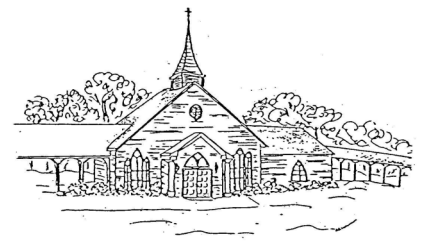

Dear People of Annunciation,

Mary Magdalene's Story by Heather Johnston

I wake very early. With waking, comes instant awful memory. The realization that it isn't all a bad dream. It's true. He's dead. Dead. The only man who had been able to give me back my self-esteem, who, from our very first meeting looked at me with respect. The first man to show me compassion and understanding and love. He taught me a completely new meaning to the word love. Now he's gone.

Killed by Roman soldiers, but Pilate was right to wash his hands. His blood is not on their hands, but on those who were so busy looking down their long noses at sinners like me. They failed to recognize that the Messiah, the one they had been preaching about and waiting for, was here—living and working among us. They simply saw him as a threat to their power—so they had him crucified. That long agonizing death. I shall never forget it. As long as I live whenever I close my eyes, I will see that picture of him, hanging on the cross and hear him saying those incredible words:

'Father forgive them, they do not know what they are doing.'

I get up and carefully carrying a jar of spikenard, I go outside. The dawn will soon break; there are red streaks in the sky bringing the promise of a beautiful day. But, no day will ever be beautiful again—without him.

Joanna, Salome and Mary are coming down the road carrying their jars of oils and spices. We arranged to meet this morning and go to the tomb, as there is just one thing left that we can do for him. We do not speak. Words would be irrelevant. Just a quick hug, then we go on our way. It's not far and soon we arrive at the garden. Joanna suddenly remembers the heavy stone that the soldiers had put over the entrance and they would be guarding the tomb. We realize that we have not really thought this thing through, maybe we can persuade the soldiers to move the stone for us. Some of them were quite sympathetic to Jesus at the crucifixion.

The sun is just coming up over the hill as we approach the tomb. We stop and stare, unable to believe what our eyes are seeing. The stone, the big, heavy stone has been rolled away and there is no sign of any soldiers. He's gone! Now even his body is gone and I am denied this one last thing that I was going to do for him. The others run back to tell Peter and the rest of them what has happened, but I can only stand there with the tears running down my face. I stoop down and look inside. The grave clothes are neatly folded and there seems to be some kind of a bright light shining. I hear a voice behind me:

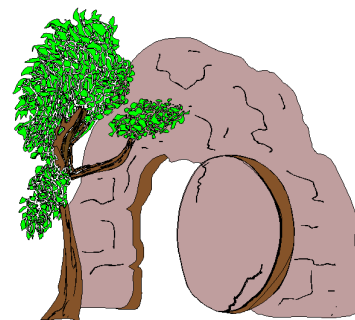
"Why are you crying? Who are you looking for?"

I reply 'Are you the gardener? Have you taken him away? Please tell me where he is. I must do this one last thing for him.' Then I hear a voice that I thought I would never hear again say:

'Mary.' I turn around. 'Rabboni,' I answer, hardly daring yet to believe what I am hearing. I reach out my hands to him, but he says:

'Do not touch me yet. First, I have to go back to my Father. Go and tell Peter and the other disciples that you have seen me.' I wipe my tears away. He is gone. But, of all the people in the world, at this moment, I am the only one who knows that Jesus is alive. I have seen him. He came first to me. Now I must do as he says, go, and tell the others.

Alleluia! Christ has risen! The Lord is risen indeed. Alleluia!

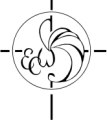

Ever since the celebration of Pentecost in the Acts of the Apostles, the Holy Spirit has been at work in the world through the Church. This is good news because we do not have to figure out the future of our churches on our own. Instead, we can ask, "What is the Holy Spirit already doing in this situation and how can we work to support what God is doing in and among us?" This Leading With Grace workshop will help parish teams enter into a practice of looking and listening to see where God is active in your church and then engaging in discernment in how you are called to support God's work in your midst. This is done through a process of asking three questions: "Who are we?" "How are we doing?" and "Who are our neighbors?" In the place where those answers intersect, we can begin to see where God is inviting us to join our energy with the ongoing work of the Holy Spirit in our midst. For the best possible experience, teams of 2-4 from churches are strongly recommended.

Cursillo #128: 'Be the Light'

Cursillo (pronounced 'kur-see-yo') is a Spanish word meaning 'little' or 'short course'. This is the name given to the Short Course in Christianity which first developed after World War II with Roman Catholic men. The short course has now been given to men and women around the world and in the process has assisted generations of Christians to more faithfully follow Jesus in their daily lives. There is no real secret here, just the basics of the faith with an emphasis on how would you like to live it out in your life.



Cursillo begins on a Thursday evening and ends the following Sunday evening. During those three days the participants engage in listening to talks given by priests and lay people, and small table discussions, while worshiping and playing together. 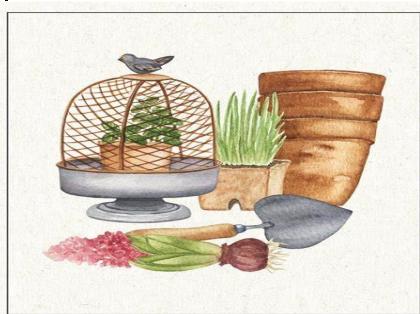

Meeting was opened with prayer at 12:15 pm, after lunch was provided by Rev. Denise and Kristen. Vestry Meditation, The Job, was completed.

Vestry Meeting minutes for January 2024 were reviewed; Twalla moved to approve minutes with one correction, 2nd by Carol, motion passed.

Minutes of short called meeting held after Annual Parish Meeting on 1/28/2024 were reviewed; Beverly moved to approve minutes, 2nd by Carol, motion passed.

Financial Report: (Rev. Denise for Rebecca) Financial Report for January 2024 was presented for review. Total Income for January was \$8544.00. Total Expenses for January were \$12,965.87. Net Income for January was \$-4421.87. Current investment fund balances are not yet available. Carol moved to approve the January Financial Report, 2nd by Len, motion passed.

Senior Warden's Report: (Twalla) – No report.

Junior Warden's Report: (Len) More light bulbs in nave will be replaced soon. Bucket truck will be used to repair leaks in narthex in the near future.

Rector's Report: (Rev. Denise) New check signers will be added at Ameris soon. 1Book1Diocese study of *The Good Life* by Waldinger and Schultz is our Lenten Study. ECW Coffee will be offered on March 10. St Patrick's Covered Dish Parish Lunch will be held on March 17 after 10:30 service. Dinner for Restricted Building Repair and Maintenance Fund will be postponed from March to April. Palm Sunday will be celebrated on March 24; new vestry members will be commissioned during the service. On Monday of Holy Week, March 25 at 6 pm, Annunciation will host the TAMA Service. Maundy Thursday Service will be held at 6 pm on March 28, followed by a Seder Dinner; Anita Estroff and Marlene Tomlin will assist with the dinner activities. Good Friday Service will be celebrated on March 29 at 12 and 6 pm. Easter Day Service will be held on March 31 at 10:30 am with reception and egg hunt following the service. Next Vestry meeting will be held on 3/24/2024.

Business:

1. Twalla moved to take 4% withdrawal from our Church Corp Bank of America Investment Fund, 2nd by Carol, motion passed.
2. Len will check on cost of Altamaha EMC internet services.
3. Drainage and retaining wall are needed to prevent flooding on sidewalk between office building and church building. Rev. Denise will communicate with Hiram (yardman/handyman) about building a retaining wall. Len will pursue a drainage system to prevent flooding on sidewalk after retaining wall is built.
4. Tree next to sidewalk between office building and church building will not be removed at this time. Its roots are not doing damage and are helping keep soil from eroding.
5. "Declaration and Promise" were voiced by Len and Beverly.
6. Twalla moved that monetary donations from Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper go into Restricted Fund for Youth, 2nd by Carol, motion passed.
7. Parochial Report was reviewed and discussed; Carol moved to approve the report, 2nd by Twalla, motion passed.
8. Carol moved that we, as Vestry members of Annunciation, endorse Ken Shradar for Ordination into the Order of Diaconate, 2nd by Twalla, motion passed.

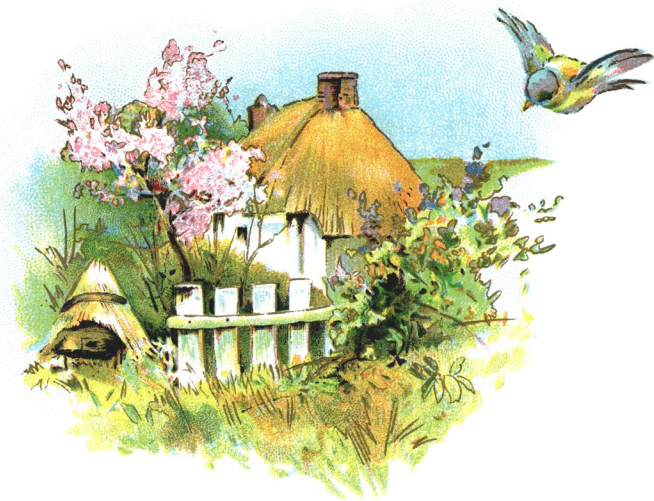
