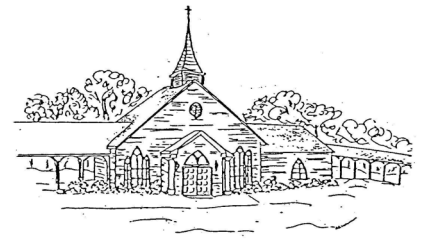

## Presiding Bishop Michael Curry Easter message for 2024

Curry, who turned 71 on March 13, is in the final year of his nine-year term as presiding bishop. He has spent much of the past year facing a series of health crises and receiving medical treatment. Curry most recently underwent surgery on March 1. He has been working from his home in Raleigh, North Carolina, at a reduced capacity.

Hello to my beloved family in Christ. I want to take this opportunity, first of all, on behalf of my wife, Sharon, and our family, to thank you. To thank you for your prayers, to thank you for your well wishes, your expressions of support and kindness. We are equally thankful for the blessing of remarkable medical care and pastoral support. As you may know, I've been working a bit from home—at a reduced level, to be sure, but I'm gradually increasing that.

Just two weeks ago, my medical team approved me to drive locally and to resume short domestic flights. I can't tell you how much your prayers have sustained me and my family through this medical journey. Prayer matters. We don't always know how. We don't always know or understand the outcome.

But prayer matters, and it makes a difference. Over the last several months, I have not known how this would all work out. But I've been very aware, and in some particular moments, consciously aware of being upheld in prayer by you. Without consciously deciding to do it, I actually found myself praying some words from Psalm 31, which says, "Into your hands, I commend my spirit."

Before surgeries and treatments, through some long nights, difficult days, "Into your hands, I commend my spirit." These words are part of a prayer that is Psalm 31 in the Hebrew scriptures. The late night service of Compline uses that psalm as a prayer before going to sleep at night.

Luke's Gospel records Jesus praying these very words, that psalm, on the cross, when he had a sense of what lay before him, but could not know the outcome. He didn't know with any certainty if and how God would act. He didn't know, as the old preachers used to say, Good Friday's always happened, but Sunday's always coming. He didn't know with any certainty that resurrection would become real and not a mere metaphor.

But as he died into the unknown, he did one thing: He threw himself completely into the hands of God. "Father, into thy hands, I commend my spirit."

And in that moment, after saying that, Luke's Gospel says, he breathed his last. And though he died, death did not have the last word, though he did die. He died into the hands of God and slipped out of the grip of death.

And as we now know, on the third day he rose again, and he lives. As William Cowper said in a poem that later became a hymn, "God moves in mysterious ways, his wonders to perform, he plants his footstep in the sea and rides upon the storm."

So God love you. God bless you. May the God who rides upon our storms and raised Jesus of Nazareth from the dead hold us all, the entire human family and all of God's grand and glorious creation in those almighty hands of love. Have a blessed Holy Week and Easter.

## **Vestry Meeting Minutes – Annunciation – March 24, 2024 at 11:45 am**

Members Present: The Very Reverend Denise Vaughn, Twalla Haley, Carol Rice, Kristen Champion, Martha Dekle.  
Members Absent: Len Edge, Beverly Thompson; Clerk Absent: Beverly Thompson;  
Treasurer Absent: Rebecca Miller

Meeting was opened with prayer at 12:20 pm following lunch. Vestry Meditation was completed.

Vestry Meeting minutes for February 2024 were reviewed; Twalla moved to approve minutes, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Carol, motion passed.

Financial Report: (Rev. Denise for Rebecca) Financial Report for February 2024 was reviewed. Total Income for January was \$6646.50. Total Expenses for February were \$13,909.34. Net Income for February was \$-7,262.84. A check was received in the amount of \$9,739.08, which is the 4% payout we requested from the Bank of America Church Corp Investment Fund; it will be reflected in the March Financial Report. Manry Memorial Investment Fund State Street Account value at end of February is \$169,629.94. Twalla moved to approve the February Financial Report, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Carol, motion passed.

Senior Warden's Report: (Twalla) – Twalla confirmed that the Lenten Bible Study was great. Jack Dell advises that he believes that the tree between the church and office should be cut down.

Junior Warden's Report: (Rev. Denise for Len) Piscina sink leak has been fixed by Jack Dell. Hiram Herrin replaced rotted wood near stained glass window, painted, and changed the sprinkler that had caused the issue. Lattice fence is done. French drain at end of walkway from east exit of Sanctuary is in process of being installed by Jack Dell. The hot water heater in office building has a foul smell; Rev. Denise called a plumber who communicated with Jack Dell on how to fix the smell. After consulting, Jack cleaned it with Clorox. It is fixed for at least several months; however, process will have to be repeated. Window in Children's Nursery is being replaced with new wood around sill and plexiglass. Old Sanctuary stained glass/plexiglass is fixed. After torrential rain two weeks ago, wall around stained glass in new Sanctuary leaked again and wall is now compromised. Harry Moses called a contractor, Philip Edge, to get it fixed; this is an ongoing project. Breanna, Teresa and Len Edge's daughter, has pressure cleaned the patio area between the parish hall and the old sanctuary.

Rector's Report: (Rev. Denise) Holy Week services and Seder Dinner will be this week. Since Palm Sunday Service ran late today, there wasn't time to commission new vestry members, so that will be done at 10:30 am service on April 21. Rev. Denise will be visiting family in Des Moines, IA on April 5-9. Rebecca Miller will lead Morning Prayer service on April 7 with no 8 AM service. ECW Coffee Hour will be April 14. Next Vestry Meeting will be on April 21.

### Business:

1. Youth Camp at Honey Creek is June 9-15, 2024. We are sending three and the \$200 deposit per child is covered; however, the complete cost is \$635 per child and more funds are needed.
2. April dinner towards Restricted Building and Maintenance Fund will be April 17. Frank Champion will be cooking the chicken.

Ministry Area Reports: Already covered.

Meeting was adjourned with Lord's Prayer at 1:25 pm.

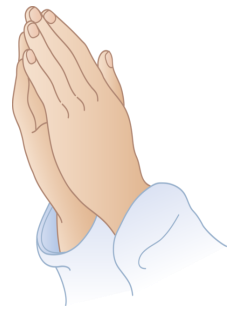
