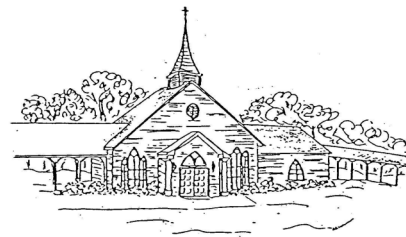

Dear People of Annunciation,

Did you know that the first election of a Presiding Bishop by General Convention took place in 1925? The office originally evolved from a rule of the House of Bishop's in 1789 making its most senior consecrated member the presiding officer. For many years, the presiding officer was simply the bishop with seniority, who presided over the meetings of the House of Bishops. In the early twentieth century, as the presiding officer's duties increased and the Church gained a more corporate structure, the office was incorporated into the Constitution of the Church and the presiding officer became the Presiding Bishop of the Church. From then on, the House of Bishop's would elect one of their own, the election then confirmed by the House of Deputies at General Convention. The new presiding bishop would give up their connection to and authority over their diocese to focus all their energies on the larger Church.

The responsibilities of the presiding bishop are laid out in the Constitution and Canons of the Episcopal Church. This bishop is to lead in the development of policy and strategy in the Church, speak God's Word as the representative of the Church and its bishops, provide for an interim bishop in a diocese without a bishop, take order for the consecration of new bishops, convene the House of Bishops, preside over meetings of the House and the General Convention when assembled, and visit every diocese of the Church. The official seat of the presiding bishop is at the Cathedral of Saint Peter and Saint Paul in Washington, D.C. The office of the presiding bishop is located at the Episcopal Church Center in New York City. The term of office is nine years. The title "Primate" was added in 1982.

The presiding bishop is considered one of the Anglican primates in the Anglican Communion. The Episcopal Church is a member of a global fellowship called the Anglican Communion. The Anglican Communion is made up of thirty-eight provinces around the world in communion with the Archbishop of Canterbury. Each province is led by a primate, its chief shepherd. Since 1978, the Anglican primates have met usually annually at the invitation of the Archbishop of Canterbury. The primates engage in fellowship, prayer, Bible study, and discussion about various issues that concern them and the Communion at large. Often at the conclusion of their gatherings, the primates will issue a pastoral letter to the entire Communion and although it is not binding in its authority, it carries the weight of their shared influence.

Our beloved first African American presiding bishop, the Rt. Rev. Michael Curry's term as our presiding bishop is almost over. Soon he will be replaced by a new presiding bishop, but I'm not sure anyone could replace the legacy he leaves the Episcopal Church. Best known for his rousing sermons, which includes his 2018 sermon at the royal wedding in England, his efforts to confront racial and social injustices in the church and society, and his efforts to press the Episcopal Church to spread Jesus' message of love as it engages with the world, will continue to influence our church in the years ahead.

The next presiding bishop will need to build upon the foundation created by those who came before them and lead the Episcopal Church in the next stretch of our journey to become the church that Jesus entrusted to us. A church that will seek to follow the greatest commandment: to love God with our whole heart, with our whole soul, and with our entire mind. And the second like it: to love our neighbor as ourselves. When we strive to follow these commandments, we will actively show that we love and serve the Lord.

Vestry Meeting Minutes – Annunciation – May 19, 2024 at 12:30 pm

Meeting was opened with prayer at 12:30 pm following Pentecost luncheon. Vestry Meditation was completed.

Vestry Meeting minutes for April 2024 were reviewed; Carol moved to approve minutes, 2nd by Kristen, motion passed.

Financial Report: (Rev. Denise for Rebecca) Financial Report for April 2024 was reviewed. Total Income for April was \$31,425.38. Total Expenses for April were \$13,231.15. Net Income for April was \$18,194.23. Balance in Bank of America Church Corp Investment Account as of March 31 was \$244,560.86. Balance in Max and Christy Manry Memorial State Street Investment Account as of April 30 is \$168,826.98. Len moved to approve the April Financial Report, 2nd by Carol, motion passed.

Senior Warden's Report: None – Twalla is out of town.

Junior Warden's Report: (Rev. Denise/Len) Jack Dell and Hiram Herrin have finished replacement of 12 sprinkler heads. Hiram has repaired wood and caulked windows in narthex but needs a tall ladder to reach the top of the narthex windows; Len will work on getting a tall ladder or lift for Hiram to use. Shade tolerant plants are needed to prevent erosion next to sidewalk in front of office/Sunday School building; mondo grass or catmint (nepeta) may work. Harry Moses has had a contractor come look at the wall where leakage is occurring around our stained-glass window and Jack Dell is checking on the situation; however, there is no resolution yet.

Rector's Report: (Rev. Denise) Progressive Insurance has called regarding one of our church signs that was hit by a car on Adams and Third Street. Progressive has sent the church a check for \$748.15 as coverage for the damage. Reverend Denise has priced a new sign at \$375; a post would be needed. Rev. Denise asks that Vestry consider what action to take. Low Country Boil Dinner is planned for June 9 after church. Sarah, Gabriel, and Lilly will attend camp at Honey Creek Camp on June 9-15. Funds are being raised to cover the cost of camp. ECW Coffee Hour will be held on Sunday, June 16, Father's Day. Rev. Denise will be away on Wednesday, June 19 through Friday, June 28; Larry Threlkeld may lead Morning Prayer Service on June 23. There will be a July 4th Hamburger and Hotdog Covered Dish Luncheon on Sunday, July 7. Next Vestry Meeting will be held on June 16.

Business:

1. Carol moved to purchase a new Church sign using funds sent by Progressive Insurance to cover sign damage, 2nd by Len, motion passed.
2. Our church is now participating in the Promise 686 Ministry with the help of Caroline Johnson, FAM Specialist of Coastal Georgia. Response Team includes Rev. Denise, Martha Dekle, Ann Smith, Karen Hidalgo, Jane Hall-Williams, Carol Rice, and Beverly Thompson.

Meeting was adjourned with Lord's Prayer at 1:45 pm.
