Dear People of Annunciation,

The 81st General Convention of the Episcopal Church will meet June 23-28 in Louisville, Kentucky. The General Convention is the primary governing body and the ultimate authority in the Episcopal Church, with the exception of the Bible, the Book of Common Prayer, and the Constitution and Canons. It meets every three years as a bicameral legislature that includes the House of Deputies and the House of Bishops, composed of lay & clergy deputies and bishops from each diocese.

This General Convention is especially important because it marks the near-end of Presiding Bishop Michael Curry's nine year primacy and the election on June 26th of his successor, the 28th Presiding Bishop of the Episcopal Church. The presiding bishop is the Chief Pastor and serves as President and Chief Executive Officer, and as Chair of the Executive Council of the Episcopal Church. The House of Bishop's will meet in a closed session at General Convention to elect the next presiding bishop from among the nominees. The result of the election is reported to the House of Deputies, which then votes to confirm or not to confirm the election.

I attended the 75th General Convention in 2006 as a visitor. It was during this convention that the Rt. Rev. Katharine Jefferts Schori was elected as the 26th Presiding Bishop. Delegates and visitors gathered together in the House of Deputies to hear the result of the election. When the result was announced, there was a holy moment of pause before a thunderous applause broke out (this is not allowed-by-the-way). The bishop's had elected the first woman presiding bishop of the Episcopal Church. The hair on my arms stood up as I realized I had just witnessed an historic Holy Spirit moment in the Church. The House of Deputies then overwhelmingly voted yes and history was made.

This June, the next presiding bishop will be chosen from a slate of five nominees: Nebraska Bishop J. Scott Barker, Pennsylvania Bishop Daniel G.P. Gutiérrez, Atlanta Bishop Robert Wright, Northwestern Pennsylvania Bishop Sean Rowe, who also serves as bishop provisional of the Diocese of Western New York, and Central New York Bishop DeDe Duncan-Probe, and any additional candidates nominated by petition.

Those attending Convention from the Diocese of Georgia are the Rt. Rev. Frank Logue, and delegates: Liz Williams, Molly Stevenson, Madison Cook, Cissy Bowden, the Reverends Kelly Steele, Leeann Culbreath, the Very Reverend Tom Purdy, and the Venerable Yvette Owens. Please keep them, and all the bishop's and delegates attending, in your prayers as they prepare to tackle some important issues. These issues include: how to define what the Book of Common Prayer is, the clergy disciplinary process, possible changes to health insurance for church employees, and who the Holy Spirit is calling to lead the Episcopal Church for the next 9 years.

The 28th presiding bishop is scheduled to take office on November 1, and an installation is scheduled for Nov. 2 at Washington National Cathedral, the traditional seat of the presiding bishop. When the nominating committee released its presiding bishop profile in March 2023, it identified via survey several qualities needed in "a presiding bishop for our time." Among the most important characteristics are strong leadership, a love of communicating and faithfulness. Come Holy Spirit!!



New Outreach Opportunity- Promise686



Did you know there is a foster care crisis in our area, and that we now have a way to support local foster families? It's called Promise686, or Family Advocacy Ministry, a church-owned, non-profit organization dedicated to equipping church communities to care and serve vulnerable children and local foster families in their area.

How this works...families who are in need are visited by a child-serving agency such as DFCS. The agency enters any needs into CarePortal. CarePortal then shares the needs via email with the participating local churches and their teams. The local churches provide support, like providing beds or one-time needs, and then, if possible, deliver these needs and items to the families to ensure they are helped.

Do you have a heart for vulnerable children? Annunciation is now participating in this ministry to our community and several of our parishioners have already agreed to be part of a team of volunteers: Beverly Thompson, Jane Hall-Williams, Carol Rice, Ann Smith, Martha Dekle, Karen Hidalgo and Rev. Denise. If you are interested in becoming part of the team or would like more information, please speak to one of these team members. Pork <u>Tenderloin Recipe</u> (from Betty Jo Sadler)

1 or 2 Pkg Pork Tenderloin 1/2 Cup Water or Wine 1 tsp. course ground pepper

1 or 2 Pkg Onion Soup Mix (1 package per tenderloin) 1 tsp. garlic powder or minced Add extra seasonings according to taste

Preheat oven to 375. Line a baking pan with foil. Place tenderloins in the pan. Combine remaining ingredients & pour over the meat. Cover the pan with foil & seal all the edges. Bake for 1 hour. To make the Gravy, pour the pan juices into a saucepan and thicken with cornstarch or flour. Serve over noodles or potatoes.

Meeting was opened with prayer at 12:20 pm following lunch. Vestry Meditation was completed.

Vestry Meeting minutes for March 2024 were reviewed; Twalla moved to approve minutes with three corrections, 2nd by Carol, motion passed.

<u>Financial Report</u>: (Rev. Denise for Rebecca) Financial Report for March 2024 was reviewed. Total Income for March was \$24,605.08 and includes the \$9739.08 withdrawal from Bank of America Church Corp Investment Account. Total Expenses for March were \$13,284.52. Net Income for March was \$11,320.56. Balance in Bank of America Church Corp Investment Account as of March 31st is \$244,560.86. Balance in Max and Christy Manry Memorial State Street Investment Account as of March 31st is \$173,742.42. Twalla moved to approve the March Financial Report, 2nd by Kristen, motion passed.

<u>Senior Warden's Report</u>: (Twalla) – Jack Dell has communicated with Twalla and suggested honoring Rev. Denise on her 70th birthday in June. Since our kids are leaving for camp at Honey Creek on June 9, it was decided to celebrate Rev. Denise's birthday and to celebrate our kids leaving for camp with a Low Country Boil after church on June 9.

<u>Junior Warden's Report</u>: (Rev. Denise for Len) Jack Dell is in process of getting sprinkler heads that are needed to repair sprinklers; hopefully Hiram Herrin will help with installation. Hiram has removed the old bed of Boxwood in the church yard. It will be replaced with a Community Garden. Kristen has tomato plants and will purchase soaker hoses using Flower Guild funds for the garden. Harry Moses continues to work on evaluation and repair of leakage around stained glass window.

Margaret Fullam will attend Cursillo #128 on April 25-28. Rev. Denise will be on vacation with family from April 29 to May 4. National Day of Prayer is May 2; Rev. A Bake Sale will also be held during the Coffee Hour to benefit our campers. A Covered Dish luncheon will be held on Pentecost Sunday, May 19.
