

As we head into August, the slow pace of July gives way to a slightly faster pace as school begins, summer winds down and the fall giving campaign quickly approaches. The theme for our fall giving campaign is *Tell Out My Soul* based upon Luke 1:46-47, *And Mary said, "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior..."* Our souls magnify the Lord when we focus on the ways we are called to share our words, our actions, our love, and our joy with the world. Created in the Image of God

"So God created humankind in his image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them." Genesis 1:27

My early journey of discovery about what stewardship might mean in my life began when a mentor encouraged me to be mindful of this verse from the Book of Genesis that tell us we are created in the image of God. If I am created in the image of God, who is God? What are the characteristics of God in whose image I have been created?

The first thing I realized is that God is a God of love. God loves humankind, loves us so much that God gave humankind the gift of God's own son, Jesus. God loves me so much that God has given me all that I am and all that I call mine. So, if God is a God of love, and I am created in that image, I am called to love as God loves. Now I can never love as God loves, but, if I am to be true to who God created me to be, I must strive to be a better lover each and every day. I must strive to love as God loves.

The next thing I realized is that God is also a God of forgiveness. God loves us so much that God forgives us again and again and again. God loves us so much that God forgives us even when we fall short of the mark. This has been a tremendous discovery or realization for me. Prior to stewardship becoming an important part of my life, I did not understand or Helping People Live Generously realize the forgiving nature of God. I used to be in fear of the judgment day, because I knew I was a sinner and continually fell short of the mark of what God wanted me to do and to be. But, as a result of my discovery about God, I realized that God indeed forgives me. What a liberating discovery that was! And, as one created in the image of God, I am called to forgive as God forgives. Again, I can never be as forgiving as God is, but I can strive to be better each and every day of my life.

Finally, I quickly realized that God is generous. Again, God loves us so much that God gave us the gift of God's own son, Jesus, who gives us a window into who God is. God is indeed generous. God gives and gives and gives again. God has given me all that I call mine. And I am called to be generous as God is generous. Again, I will never, can never be as generous as God. But I can strive to be more generous each day. Indeed my journey as a steward of creation compels me to strive to be more generous each and every day of my life.

So, my journey of discovery about God had led me to the realization that as a steward of all of God's good gifts, I am called to love as God loves; I am called to forgive as God forgives; and I am called to be generous as God is generous.

United Thank Offering: Over \$1M awarded for projects focused on water access, sanitation, education

The Episcopal Church Executive Council recently approved more than \$1 million in United Thank Offering grants supporting 27 innovative mission and ministry projects focused on water-related issues around the world.

Projects range from a reverse osmosis filtration system to combat lead-contaminated drinking water in Western Louisiana to indoor plumbing at a South Dakota congregation to water-saving agricultural projects in Tanzania and California's Central Valley.

The funds come from the United Thank Offering's yearly Ingathering, which includes monies collected in "blue boxes" at Episcopal churches, designated as thank offerings.

This is the final round of a three-year United Thank Offering grant focus on areas of ministry based on Matthew 25:31-46. This year's grants fund projects that address sanitation; access to water; and water education or climate change mitigation. The 2023 and 2024 United Thank Offering grants supported 42 projects related to the worldwide incarceration crisis and welcoming "the stranger."

"The grant awards emphasize both the physical and spiritual importance of water in our lives," said Karin Elsen, president of the United Thank Offering board. "These funds will be used for the construction of many practical things, such as showers and wells, while also fostering service, hospitality, and renewal through the projects. Many lives will be positively impacted."

The UTO Board received about \$2 million in requests from 43 applications. It was able to fund 27 projects within The Episcopal Church and Anglican Communion, including three historical grants.

Since its founding in 1889, United Thank Offering has awarded 5,475 grants worth more than \$148 million. Learn more about this ministry of The Episcopal Church.

Meeting was opened with prayer at 12:15 pm.

Vestry Meeting Minutes for May 2025 will be sent by email for review and approval.

Financial Report: (Rebecca) Financial report for May 2025 was reviewed. Income for May was \$7,496.00. Expenses were \$13,335.89. Net Income for May was \$-5,839.89. Income and expenses were typical for May. Report of balance in Church Corporation Bank of America Investment Account will be received at the end of July; balance as of March 31 was \$245,859.83. Balance in Max and Christy Manry Memorial State Street Investment Account at end of May is \$174,560.89. Withdrawal of \$15,000.00 from the Manry Memorial State Street Investment Account (that was approved at May meeting) has been requested; the withdrawal will show up in the reported account balance in June. Rebecca reviewed the Restricted Funds Reconciliation Report, which is presented in a new format; this format will be used going forward and will improve accuracy. Len moved to approve the May financial report, 2nd by Kristen, motion passed.

Senior Warden's Report: (Carol) No report.

Junior Warden's Report: (Rev. Denise and Len) Hiram has been working on the shrubbery. A second pair of trimmers was purchased during the Father's Day sale at Lowe's. Hiram is going to clean the gutters. Two new blinds are needed in Rev. Denise's office. Curtains in Karen Hidalgo's office have been washed and ironed. Elite Comfort Systems has completed the cosmetic work on the vent in the Narthex.

Rector's Report: (Rev. Denise) On Sunday July 6, a Fourth of July Covered Dish will be held in Parish Hall; hamburgers and hotdogs will be provided. ECW Coffee Hour will be held on Sunday, July 20th. Back to School Bash will be held on Saturday, August 2 from 8:30 to 10:30 am; 8-oz bottles of water are being collected for the School Bash event.
