



Dear People of Annunciation,

As Christians we are story tellers. We have an ancient narrative, one that describes the beginning of time and the relationship between God and God's Creation. We see this story grow through the prophetic tradition until our story recounts the life and gifts of the Son of God. But the story doesn't end with the Resurrection just as it did not end with the Cross, it continues on in each of us today as we encounter and are transformed by the Good News.

Luke's Gospel is bookended by the animated story-telling of two women named Mary. Early in the Gospel, Mary the mother of Jesus, tells us of her encounter with the Divine who informs her that she will bear a child who will change the world. She proclaims her joy: "Tell out my soul! The Greatness of the Lord!" At the end of the Gospel, another Mary, Mary Magdalene, visits the tomb to discover it empty and receives instructions from the Risen Christ to go tell the others. She carries this Good News with jubilation to the Disciples.

What is your Good News; the idea, dream, challenge placed in your heart by God, that needs to be shared? What is the ministry to which you are called which will change the world, sharing your talents, gifts, and love with your neighbors?

Our Stewardship Campaign this year focuses on these stories – the ones inside you, the ones you are still writing, the ones we tell about those who have gone before us. We are all a part of this ongoing narrative – the ongoing Creation. As you pray about how you will share your gifts with us this year, think about how God is calling you to tell out your soul, to spread the Good News far and wide.

Read the stories that are shared weekly throughout the campaign. These reflections tell of the ways people have used their creativity, their art, their writing, and their passions to inspire us; stories of good news that inspire the creative spark within us. They tell of the transformative power of our faith through the many gifts we share, and the ways in which we are called to serve God and love our neighbor.

Tell out my soul! The Greatness of the Lord!

Meeting was opened with prayer at 12:10 pm.

Vestry Meeting Minutes for June 2025 were reviewed; Len moved to approve minutes with three corrections, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Kristen, motion passed.

Financial Report: (Rebecca) Financial report for June 2025 was reviewed. Income for June was \$19,368.00 and includes \$15,000 withdrawal from the Manry Memorial State Street Investment Account. Expenses for June were \$10,998.59. Net Income for June was \$8,369.41. Income and expenses were typical for June. Balance in Church Corporation Bank of America Investment Account as of June 30 is \$252,972.27. Balance in Max and Christy Manry Memorial State Street Investment Account as of June 30 is \$164,267.74. Rebecca reviewed the Restricted Funds Reconciliation Report for June. Carol moved to approve the June financial report, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Len, motion passed.

Senior Warden's Report: (Carol) No report.

Junior Warden's Report: (Rev. Denise and Len) Leak has occurred in left middle window in Narthex; bucket truck will be needed to seal it. Hiram Herren has sealed windows in the Nave and cleaned out all the gutters. He has also worked on shrubbery trimming. Blinds are ordered for Rev. Denise's office. Fernando Hidalgo will put them up. Hiram now has a job and has moved; he may be available to help some on weekends.

Rector's Report: (Rev. Denise) New Beginnings will be held on Sept. 19 – 21. A couple of our young people are interested in going. Cost is \$145 each; Youth Fund donations are welcome. Rev. Denise presented a letter from David Cheney with questions about transition that will be addressed at a later date with Diocesan assistance. Back to School Bash will be August 2 from 8:30-10:30 am; 8-oz bottles of water are being collected. Supplies are being collected for J.D. Dickerson Primary School. Blessing of School Supplies and Backpacks will be August 3 during 10:30 am service. ECW Coffee Hour will be held on Sunday, August 10. Next Vestry Meeting will be held on August 24 at 11:45 am.
