

## All Saints Sunday November 2

All Saints Day is always on November 1, but we celebrate it on the nearest Sunday to the first. This is the day in which we remember and honor the saints, those faithful disciples whose lives and examples are still with us, who inspire and challenge us to be the saints of God. But the saints were not super Christians with halos. They were ordinary people just like you and me. What made them saints was that they heard and lived the heart of the Law. They loved God above all else, and their neighbor as themselves. They lived out the greatest commandment to love. This most intimate and warm, creative and committed of human acts is what God wants from us. God desires Holy Men and Holy Women.

In 2010, after several years of extensive study and consultation *Holy Women, Holy Men: Celebrating the Saints* was released by the Episcopal Church. This publication commemorates saints and holy figures, enhancing the church's appreciation of its spiritual heritage. The names and biographical notes of over 600 "saints" of the church are listed. The men and women commemorated in the calendar are not simply examples of faithfulness to inspire us: they are our companions in the Spirit to encourage us as we seek to be faithful in our own day. In one of the prayers in the Book of Common Prayer we pray: "Almighty God, by your Holy Spirit you have made us one with your saints in heaven and on earth: Grant that in our earthly pilgrimage we may always be supported by this fellowship of love and prayer."

### What is Operation Christmas Child?

The Samaritan's Purse project Operation Christmas Child collects shoebox gifts—filled with fun toys, school supplies and hygiene items—and delivers them to children in need around the world to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way. For many of these children, the gift-filled shoebox is the first gift they have ever received. Since 1993, Operation Christmas Child, the world's largest Christmas project of its kind, has collected and delivered more than 146 million shoebox gifts to children in more than 160 countries and territories. Anyone can pack a shoebox. **Do not include:** candy; toothpaste, used or damaged items; war related items such as toy guns, knives or military figures; seeds; chocolate or food; liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items, such as snow globes or glass containers; or aerosol cans.

## **Vestry Meeting Minutes – Annunciation – August 24, 2025**

Treasurer Present: Rebecca Miller; Clerk Present: Beverly Thompson

Meeting was opened with prayer at 12:05 pm. Vestry Meditation was completed.

Vestry Meeting Minutes for July 2025 were reviewed; Carol moved to approve minutes, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Len, motion passed.

Financial Report: (Rebecca) Financial report for July 2025 was reviewed. Income for July was \$8,399.00.00; expenses for July were \$15,008.02. Net Income for July was \$-6,609.02. Income for January - July is less than expected. Rebecca suggested that a withdrawal from our Manry State Street Investment Account be considered. Balance in Church Corporation Bank of America Investment Account as of June 30 is \$252,972.27. Balance in Max and Christy Manry Memorial State Street Investment Account as of July 31 is \$165,315.97. Rebecca reviewed the Restricted Funds Reconciliation Report for July. Carol moved to approve the July financial report, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Len, motion passed.

Senior Warden's Report: (Carol) Carol shared letter from Bishop Frank Logue in the Diocesan Office regarding the Rev. Hunt Priest, who is deprived of the right to exercise the gifts and spiritual authority of ministry conferred upon him by ordination. He will no longer serve or practice as a priest in the Diocese of Georgia or elsewhere.

Junior Warden's Report: (Len) Two windows in Narthex need sealing; a bucket truck is needed for this. Hiram Herren is back in town and available for shrubbery work. Fernando Hidalgo put up the blinds in Rev. Denise's office; big thank you to Fernando.

Rector's Report: (Rev. Denise) Rev. Denise shared information about the Tell Out My Soul Giving Campaign for 2025. It will begin in September and will end on Christ the King Sunday in November with an Appreciation Dinner. Hugh Jordan is serving as Stewardship Campaign Chair. Parish covered dish luncheon will be held on Sunday, September 7. The Lord's Prayer Study continues September 15, 22, and 29 in Connie Deane's home. Sarah Solis will attend New Beginnings on September 19-21 at Honey Creek. Rev. Denise will be out of town on September 16-24; she will attend a Clergy Conference for Diocese of Atlanta and Diocese of Georgia on September 22-24 in Eatonton. Morning Prayer will be celebrated on Sunday, September 21. ECW Coffee Hour will be held after 10:30 am service on September 28. Next Vestry Meeting will be on Sunday, September 14 at 11:45 am. Zoom Convocational Meeting for Convention Delegates will be held on October 2, 6-8 pm; Diocesan Convention will be in Statesboro on November 7-8.

1. Rebecca moved to withdraw \$10,000 from our Manry State Street Investment Account, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Carol, motion passed.
2. Rebecca presented Church Audit Report for approval, Carol moved to approve the report, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Kristen, motion passed.
3. The Audit Report indicated that an Assistant Treasurer is needed; Kristen Champion volunteered to serve as Assistant Treasurer and was elected with General Consent.
4. The Audit Report indicated that an updated physical inventory is needed; Rev. Denise will look up procedures/guidelines for inventory completion on Diocesan Website; Martha will assist.
5. Two delegates from Annunciation are needed to attend Diocesan Convention in Statesboro on November 7-8. Twalla Haley and Martha Dekle will serve as delegates with General Consent.

Ministry Area Reports: Already covered.

Meeting was adjourned at 1:35 pm with Lord's Prayer.
