

Dear People of Annunciation,

Here we are again at the beginning of a new church year with the start of the Advent Season on Sunday, November 30. “Advent,” means “coming” referring to both the “first coming of Jesus Christ in his birth at Christmas” and to his “second coming” on the Day of the Lord. The readings during Advent from the gospel of Matthew will focus on two important Advent themes: Christ’s return at the Second Coming and John the Baptist’s preparation for Jesus. Matthew will help us get ready for Jesus to be born and ready for Jesus to come back.

Other ways to prepare and get ready during Advent might include: reading a Daily Devotional like *Forward Day by Day* or the Devotional “*A Grand Miracle*” by C.S. Lewis provided by the church. The *Reverse Advent Calendar* found in this Newsletter begins December 1st. Each day you add a grocery item to a box and on Christmas Eve or before, donate the contents to our food pantry.

The Diocese is offering *OneBook1Diocese for Advent*, a group study of the book “The Stories We Live: Finding God’s Calling All Around Us,” by Kathleen Cahalan, professor of practical theology at Saint John’s University School of Theology and Seminary and director of the Collegetown Seminars. This book offers a chance to reflect on how our everyday lives invite us into our many and diverse callings. You can find additional information if you are interested in participating in *From the Field*.

AdventWord provides a daily meditation, visual image, and invites your personal reflections via social media to share your own Advent journey with a worldwide community. *Join the Diocese as we participate in Advent Word 2025, a global meditation practice shared on social media during the Advent season. Meeting was opened with prayer at 12:05 pm. Vestry Meditation was completed.

Vestry Meeting Minutes for September 2025 were reviewed; Carol moved to approve minutes, 2nd by Kristen, motion passed.

Financial Report: (Rev. Denise for Rebecca) Financial report for September 2025 was reviewed. Income for September was \$39,047.25 and includes the \$10,000 withdrawal that was made from Manry State Street Investment Account. Expenses for September were \$12,510.55. Net Income for September was \$26,536.70. Balance in Church Corporation Bank of America Investment Account as of September 30 was \$265,977.54. Balance in Max and Christy Manry Memorial State Street Investment Account as of September 30 is \$162,523.94. Balance in Church Restricted Funds as of 8/31/2025 is \$37,635.98. Len moved to approve the September financial report, 2nd by Kristen, motion passed.

Senior Warden's Report: No Report – Carol Absent

Junior Warden's Report: (Len) Two windows in Narthex continue to need sealing. Weeding and trimming of shrubbery have been done. Outside light on Parish Hall is not working.

Rector's Report: (Rev. Denise) No information regarding computer system yet. Still working on allowing Zelle app to be used for donations; with Zelle, there is no cost to giver. It's time for our youth to consider attending camp at Honey Creek this summer. Martha Dekle and Twalla Haley will attend Diocesan Convention in Statesboro on November 7-8 with Rev. Denise.
