

Bursting Forth: An Epiphany Reflection

Because of when Easter falls in 2025, we get all eight Sundays of Epiphany this year: Eight opportunities to read and learn how the spirit of the law, the new life that Jesus came to proclaim, spreads throughout the world. This Epiphany is all about the Truth being revealed. It is a Truth that not everyone welcomes the same way - when Jesus reveals the wisdom of the scrolls, or when he tells us we must love those who wish us harm - these are hard truths to accept. It's not all wedding wine and divine blessings in the Temple - Truth settles on each of us.

The thing about the Truth that Jesus brings is that it is so wonderful, so different, so transformative, that it needs to be shared. It can barely be contained. Our hearts, our mouths, our souls cannot hold back. "Tell out my soul," Mary sang to the Angel. It is as if to say, I have learned something so beautiful that I simply must share it, it is impossible to keep to myself.

The Epiphany asks much of us. It asks us to reflect on an internal moment of awareness, of spiritual awakening, and find the words and ways to share it with the world. As Christ is made manifest to the whole world, unbound by social convention, religious authority, or political geography, we too are called to seek the neighbor beyond our immediate vicinity to accompany, to teach, to love.

The theological mystery of the Epiphany calls us to have one foot in the spiritual, deeply personal realm of revelation and the other foot in the world, learning how to seek and serve those who most need our help. We learn about the movement of the Spirit through Jesus and are motivated into ministering with him to the outcast, the stranger, and to those who most need to feel the warmth and light of His love. tens.org

The Annual Meeting is an important moment in the life of an Episcopal Church. As a denomination, we are governed by our members. Members are those 16 and older who have been baptized or confirmed in the Episcopal Church. If baptism or confirmation did not happen at Annunciation then, a Letter of Transfer from another Episcopal Church is needed. At the Annual Meeting we make important decisions together. We elect members of our vestry who are representatives of the parish with specific responsibilities by the canons of The Episcopal Church. They share leadership responsibilities with the rector. Also, during the annual meeting, the parish receives reports from ministries, the treasurer, and a “State of the Church” report from the rector.

Nominees for Vestry:

Connie Deane

I started my formative years in Nashua, NH at the Main Street Methodist Church. At the age of 2 I was baptized. I then grew up in the church with lots of love and understanding with Love and Patience. At the age of 13, I went through classes for confirmation, into the same church and became part of the youth choir at St. Patrick’s Cathedral in Nashua until 1976 and moved to Georgia. I joined the First United Methodist in Vidalia joining the choir withal other activities with my family until 2005. At this time David and I visited the Church of the Annunciation and wanted this church to be our final home. Shortly thereafter Nick Nichols nominated me for the Vestry. At this time I served on the Vestry for 4 years with Chair of fellowship. Along with the plans of the Columbarium and a replacement for Father Ron Sutherland for his time of retirement. Before his retirement he assisted and taught classes for Daughter’s of the King. We took our vows to become part of the order of DOK in 2007. They were married in April of 1975 and Beverly became acquainted with the Episcopal Church through attendance with Chuck’s family in Anderson, SC at Grace Episcopal Church. When Beverly and Chuck moved back to the country of Toombs County in 1978, they began attending the Episcopal Church of the Annunciation, where Charles McCall, Beverly’s piano teacher, was a founding member and organist. Beverly was confirmed on Palm Sunday, 1981, by Father Richard Cantrell. She has served on the Diocesan Council and was honored with the Deans’ Award in November of 2021 at Diocesan Convention. 
