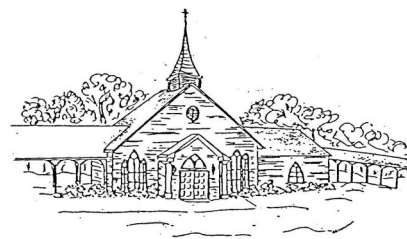

Pentecost



The Day of Pentecost, the coming of the Holy Spirit among the apostles and followers of Jesus. Celebrated 50 days after Easter (including the day of Easter itself), the name of the holiday comes from the Greek *Pentēkostē*, which literally means “the 50th day.”

The events of the day are foretold by Jesus in the first chapter of the Acts of the Apostles, just before his Ascension. While his followers were with the risen Christ, he tells them, “John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now” (Acts 1:5, NRSV). He goes on to say to them, “You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth” (Acts 1:8).

The followers would not wait long for the promised Spirit. The author of Acts, traditionally believed to be Luke, recounts:

“When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each” (Acts 2:1-6).

We celebrate Pentecost as the inauguration of the Church’s mission in the world. Empowered by the gift of the Holy Spirit, we are to go out into our neighborhoods and the wider world—to Jerusalem, to Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth—witnessing to the risen Christ.

The Day of Pentecost is identified by the Book of Common Prayer as one of the feast days “especially appropriate” for baptism (Book of Common Prayer, p. 312). Because of this, Pentecost is also known as “Whitsun” or “Whitsunday” (“White Sunday”), a term used to describe the white baptismal garments worn by those who were baptized at the Vigil of Pentecost and then worn to church on the Day of Pentecost.

Pentecost in the Episcopal tradition is more than a commemoration—it’s a living invitation. It recalls the moment when the Holy Spirit filled the followers of Jesus, empowering them to speak across barriers of language, culture, and fear.

Today, we are called to that same Spirit-led courage. Pentecost reminds us that the Church is not confined to walls or traditions alone—it is a movement of love, reconciliation, and hope that flows into every corner of the world.

In the rush of wind and the tongues of fire, we hear God’s promise: You are not alone. You are equipped. You are sent. Whether your voice trembles or roars, the Spirit can use it to bring healing, justice, and joy.

So, let us go forth as people of Pentecost—hearts open, hands ready, and voices willing to proclaim God’s boundless grace in every language of love.

Meeting was opened with prayer at 9:45 am.

Vestry Meeting Minutes for March were reviewed; Connie moved to approve minutes, 2nd by Carol, motion passed.

Financial Report: (Rev. Denise and Rebecca) Financial report for March 2026 was reviewed. Income for March was \$ 15,062.00. Expenses for March were \$12,235.08. Net Income for March was \$ 2,826.92. Current balances in Bank of America Church Corporation Investment Account and Max & Christy Manry Memorial State Street Investment Account are not yet available. Balance in Church Restricted Funds as of 3/31/2026 is \$38,158.37. Beverly moved to approve the March financial report, 2nd by Connie, motion passed.

Senior Warden's Report: (Carol) None

Junior Warden's Report: (Rev. Denise for Len) Portico posts painting still needed. Sealing of two windows in Narthex still needed. A door is needed for Karen's office; Rebecca will measure. The dome on playground is bent and needs checking. Rebecca will ask Jack Dell for map of sprinkler system, how it works, and what repair is needed on it. Vestry, with input and help from parishioners, will make sure that grounds and buildings needs are met.

Rector's Report: (Rev. Denise) Rev. Denise is preparing a list of useful information for Karen and Vestry to refer to after she retires on May 1. A large calendar in the church office will have information regarding church activities and will be updated regularly. When there is a need for hospital visits, church office should be contacted first, then Jane Hall. For deaths, contact the church office or the Rev. Todd Hoover if no one is in office. Canon Loren Lasch will celebrate Eucharist on April 19 and will meet with parishioners to discuss next steps in transition process. Larry Threlkeld will be officiant at Morning Prayer Service on April 26. Canon Joshua Varner will celebrate Eucharist on May 3. Rebecca Miller will be officiant at Morning Prayer Service on May 10. ECW will provide Coffee Hour on Mother's Day, May 10. Reverend Eric Cooter will celebrate Eucharist on May 17. May Vestry Meeting will be held at 11:45 am on Sunday, May 17. Rev. Todd Hoover will celebrate Eucharist on May 24 with a Pentecost Covered Dish Luncheon following the service; everyone will be asked to wear red. Beverly Thompson will be officiant at Morning Prayer Service on May 31

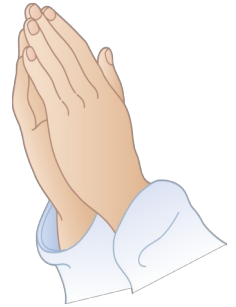
